QCCC is sanctioned by the National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC), which has over 14,000 members in the USA. We are a non-profit club (501-C7) which raises money for and participates with various local children's charities. Dues and donations are not tax deductible. We strive to promote exciting, safe & fun ways to enjoy our Corvettes. We hold business meetings on the second Saturday of each month. Our monthly business meeting usually incorporates a social time afterwards. Our socials are always fun and are focused around food & drink. We've had swimming parties, bar-b-ques, cookouts, day trips and weekend trips. We participate in mountain tours, holiday parades and several homecoming parades at local area high schools. We also participate with several sister Corvette clubs in car shows, drag racing, and autocrossing. After an initiation fee of \$7.00, club dues are only \$8.00 a month, per family, and are to be paid quarterly. These dues go to cover the costs of running the club, mailing newsletters, and subsidizing the costs of our meetings. Club officers serve as volunteers. NCCC dues are \$30.00 a year.

To become a member of the QUEEN CITY CORVETTE CLUB, you must own a Corvette and attend at least two (2) monthly business meetings within a six-month time period. Express your wishes for membership during a monthly business meeting, be voted in and begin paying dues.

## Minutes from November 18, 2000 QCCC Officers Meeting

The November officers' meeting was held at the home of Nancy and Bob Runnion and all board members were in attendance. In addition Greg & Kim Beavers and Paul & Priscilla Pelkey were in attendance as guests and newly elected 2001 board members.

The meeting was called to order by President Fred Fischer @ 7:00 pm.

Open club objectives were discussed. **Electronic Newsletter** is very near completion and in the implementation stage. Member list will be up-dated as to who will receive the electronic version vs hard copies to save club funds. **Sponsorship Program**, headed by Bob Bowen will most likely extend into 2001. Jon Elliott is in contact with the Chevrolet Zone. A **Standing Social Committee** to be established to assist in advance planning for the 2001 activities. **Club Growth** has been extremely exciting during the 2000 year. The limitation on club membership was discussed and it was decided that growth can be very healthy for the club and will bring new and fresh ideas. No membership limits will be applied at this time. **NCCC Membership Alliance** requires 50% of the club membership in order for QCCC to maintain an affiliation. Currently only 33 members have enrolled.

**Charitable Programs** – QCCC is currently limited to \$2,000/yr established by the Bylaws. Some members have voiced a question as to the charitable funds available. Eddie Burt will breakout dues and fund raising money on the P&L statement showing the difference in charitable funds and regular funds.

**Independent Insurance** – Eddie Burt received proposal for \$275/yr, which covers all club members. This will provide more insurance at a lower price than the current NCCC insurance. Eddie will request a contract with an effective date of 12/1/00.

**Christmas Party** will be 12/9 at 6:30 p.m. at the Country Inn in Matthews. Dinner will be buffet. Ken Watts and group will perform. Everyone should bring a \$5 gift to be exchanged at the dinner. A number will be drawn during dinner for the gifts. Everyone who adopted a family member should bring his or her gifts that night. Gifts will be delivered to the families on Saturday, 12/16 from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Corvettes will not be used for deliveries this year due to circumstances involving some locations. Kim, Priscilla and Nancy to purchase food for each of the three families.

Jeff stated that there are 5 more parades this year. They are Concord 11/18 (Larry & Lois will drive), Monroe 11/19 (Debbie and Chuck Grulich will drive), Mooresville 11/21 (Fred and Carolyn Lentz will drive), Lake Wylie 12/2, 12:00 p.m. (need cars), and Belmont 12/12, Honeybees (need cars).

Banquet and Prom will be 1/20/01 at the Wyndham Garden Hotel. Cost has increased 10-15% each year with this year's cost per person at \$45.50. The club will pay \$25.50 and members will pay \$20.00 per person. The hotel has given QCCC 3 rooms, which the individual board member will compensate, the cost back to the club treasury.

Fred will take care of ordering the plaques. Awards will be given to Male/Female Rookie of the Year, Member of the Year, Past President, President's Choice, and 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place Points Winners. Fred will also present a slide show after dinner.

Nancy has taken care of the getting Silent Auction items and other awards, which will be awarded by raffle ticket purchases.

Software compatibility among Board members was also discussed. Since everyone does not have Windows 2000 it is best to send information in MS Word 97 format to be consistent with other members.

Meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m.

They want to provide an opportunity for children to be children rather than caretakers. They depend on donations.

Diane presented Libby with a basket of supplies and Fred presented her with a check from QCCC for \$1,500.

Fred presented a beautiful poster from CORSA to Jody Austin for increasing their sales of CORSA exhaust systems within the Club.

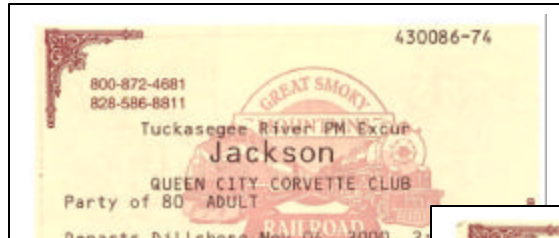

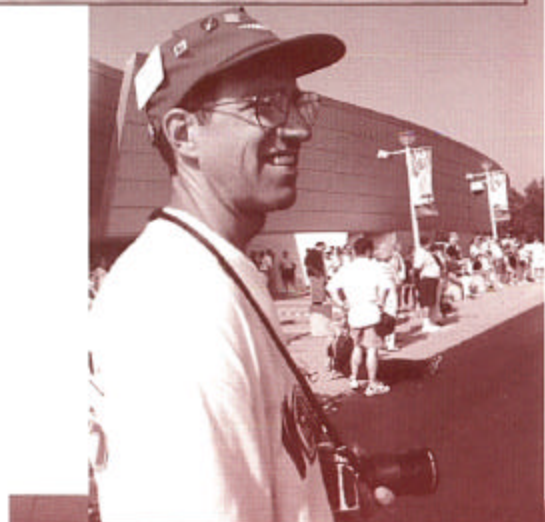
