





Want To Weigh That Car, but you can't get it into the bathroom to get it on the scales?

Thanks to **Jane Burt** for sending this information into the technical division of the QCCC international newsletter offices.

How do you weigh a car without a scale? Here's an easy way. You can use the thing that's already holding up the car, the compressed air in the tires.

You'll need the following items: Tire pressure gauge, measuring tape, 2 pieces of cardboard with straight edges and simple math skills.

How to weigh it: The car must be parked on a smooth surface like a garage floor. Slide the pieces of cardboard snuggly under the front and back of the tire. Push the cardboard as snug against the front and back of the tire as possible. Make sure they are not crooked but nice and parallel. Measure the distance between the two pieces of cardboard. Then turn the pieces and push them snuggly against the sides of the tires. Multiply the numbers from both measurements. That will be the area of the "footprint" of the tire.

Next, use the tire gauge to measure the air pressure of the tire. Then multiply the area times the pressure. That will be the weight that one tire is holding up. Repeat this for all 4 tires and add the separate weights together. That's the car's total weight.

The 1997 C5 Corvette had 34% (that's 1,500) fewer parts than its predecessor, the C4.
