




Our New Board





SAFETY TECH TIP

Thanks to **Tom Idema** for this safety **TECH TIP**:

Mirror, Mirror on the Car

To reduce the blind spots in your side-view mirrors and lessen your chances of an automobile crash, make sure your mirrors are properly adjusted. Here's how:

- For the driver-side mirror, place the left side of your face against the driver-side window and adjust the mirror so that you can barely see the left side of your car.
- For the passenger-side mirror, sit in the center of the front seat (or lean as close to the center as possible) and adjust the mirror so you can barely see the right side of your car.

Approaching vehicles should be in your side-view mirrors before they leave your rear-view mirror and in your peripheral vision before they leave your side-view mirrors.
