




President's Message


Dear Fellow QCCC members:

Final Thoughts:



The owner, Steve Perrault, tells me he can do any kind of painted wheel, and, depending on the amount of damage, do polished aluminum as well. Spun aluminum and chrome wheels are a problem. Total cost of my repair was \$75.00 which sure beats replacing a wheel. 
