
Final Thoughts:

FROM THE DRIVER'S SEAT

Happy New Year Everybody!

The new board of directors is already hard at work to plan a fun and active year for 05. Check out the tentative schedule elsewhere in this issue of our illustrious newsletter. Jane and Eddie and Anita and I spent a fun evening planning some of the trips and events for the coming year, and what a full schedule it is! Road trips to fun



destinations, including three overnighters, parades, and car shows. We found lots of excuses to get all of our friends together.

This year we are also incorporating the local SCCA schedule for AutoX and the HPDE schools on the schedule. We have a growing number of QCCC members who are participating in these events. If you decide you do not want to participate, come on out and watch and support your fellow members. You will be impressed with the engineering marvel the we are blessed to own. We are also showing events we are aware of that are not QCCC events but may be of interest to some of our members.

The calendar, as always, is dynamic and constantly being updated. Be sure to check for revisions with every addition of the newsletter.

There are two subjects that I would ask you to keep in mind for the coming year. When we caravan to anywhere, we sometimes have a procession of cars that stretches for a mile or more. Please keep adequate distance between you and the club member in front of you. In addition to giving him a comfort level, this allows other traffic to merge with our cars for access to the ramps on the freeways and aids in the flow of other traffic. When on the interstate, I use my cruise control and will always set somewhere from speed limit to 5MPH above the limit. Any caravan is subject to "*rubberbanding*" and the farther you are toward the rear, the more affected you are. There is no need to drive crazy speeds to try to tighten up. If, for example, the speed limit is 65 MPH and I have set on 70, then 72-73 will allow you to catch up and stay out of trouble with the law. This year, every road trip will start with the distribution of directions, destinations, and my cell phone number so that, in worst case scenario, if you get separated from the group, you can meet up with us.

The second issue I need to touch on is one concerning reservations and commitment. Some of our activities will require that we obligate the club to a certain level of participation. We do this based on your response. This may apply to motels, restaurants, points of interest, or all of the above. We will try to be very clear about the commitment requirement. If you commit, and then change your mind beyond the cut off point for any reason, you will loose your deposit or be asked to honor your commitment and pay the fee even though you may not have attended. Please understand that we are not trying to be hard nosed, but feel it is not fair to the membership at large to take this deficit out of the general membership fund.

We will have a fun year. There is enough diversity on this schedule that all members will be able to find activities that appeal to them. Come and join in the fun, but as always...
















































Old Salem Road Trip


