

The New 206 is Announced



Let's start with the powerful new 7L (427 ci) displacement engine that generates 500 net HP. It's called the LS7 and is a new casting with thinner pressed in cylinder liners that will contain titanium connecting rods with a dry

sump oil system that holds eight quarts of synthetic oil allowing redlines at 7K RPM. This power is transmitted through a high capacity clutch to a beefed up 6 speed transaxle.

To stop the new ZO6, the front rotor's are now 14 inches with rears at 13.4 - that's an increase of 1.2 and 1.4 inches respectively. The front calipers have 6 pistons with 6 individual brake pads, the rears: 4 pistons wth 4 pads. These stop the 19 inch 325/30ZR Eagle F1 Supercar runflats in the rear and 18 inch 275/35s in the front.



To lighten the weight, engineers replaced the steel frame with aluminum and use a magnesium front cradle. The front fenders are carbon fiber and the roof panel will not be removable.



Exterior changes are subtle: an air scoop in front of the hood, side air scoops ahead of the rear wheels, wider front and rear fenders, a large front fender vent and a taller rear spoiler.






