Our monthly business meeting usually incorporates a social time afterwards. Our socials are always fun and are focused around food & drink. We've had swimming parties, barbques, cookouts, day trips and weekend trips. We participate in mountain tours, holiday parades and several homecoming parades at local area high schools. We also participate with several sister Corvette clubs in car shows, drag racing, and autocrossing. After an initiation fee of \$7.00, club dues are only \$8.00 a month, per family, and are to be paid quarterly. These dues go to cover the costs of running the club, mailing newsletters, and subsidizing the costs of our meetings. Club officers serve as volunteers.

To become a member of the QUEEN CITY CORVETTE CLUB, you must own a Corvette and attend at least three (3) monthly business meetings and two (2) events within a six-month time period. Express your wishes for membership during a monthly business meeting, be voted in and begin paying dues.

The President's Message

SPECIAL REPORT

I need to do something here that I haven't done very often in our newsletter...talk about

something seriously. God knows that we all love our Corvettes. Our Club provides us with the opportunity to do fun events with our cars and with great friends who share our

passion for the Corvettes.

This year, the Board and particularly our Treasure have spent an inordinate amount of time attempting to collect club dues. It's mid May as I write and there are still nearly 20 members/couples who have not paid. My concern is not that those members will not pay but rather the amount of effort our Treasurer must exert to collect the dues and that we as your Board and I as your President are not

governing the Club in accordance with our By-Laws. To spare you from reading the entire text of our by-laws, I'm going to quote various paragraphs to demonstrate our dilemma. Our by-laws contain several references regarding the subject of dues.

First, <u>Active Members Shall be dues paying members in good standing.</u> To hold an office, officers must be current with the payment of their dues: <u>Officers must be dues paying Active members or the spouse of a dues paying active member.</u> The Club Treasurer is responsible in accordance with the by-laws to ensure that members pay their dues; <u>The Treasurer shall</u> enforce the rules of non-payment of dues.

Our by-laws are quite specific as to when Club dues are to be paid:

Dues are determined by the Finance Committee and the Board of Directors.

Three month's dues must be paid in advance of each calendar quarter by cash or check. The Treasurer or President must receive payment of dues within the first 5 days of each calendar quarter for a member's dues status to be considered as current. The Secretary must notify members of any change in the amount of dues at least 30 days prior to the effective date of the change. Certainly, members who can...are encouraged .. to pay the entire year's dues in January. Many members do, which means that there is one less thing they have to remember throughout the year.

The following is the excerpt from our by-laws that we never want to get to: Suspension for Nonpayment of Dues. Any member who is delinquent in Club dues for three (3) months shall be suspended from the Club. In the event of unusual circumstances, the Board has the authority to review the situation and take appropriate action. Reinstatement shall be automatic upon payment of a \$5.00 penalty, all past dues and current quarterly dues. The member shall be notified by the Treasurer when he is past due two months. The member may then either:

- 1. Bring the dues current, no later than the next meeting.
- 2. Be suspended. If suspended, the member may request a hearing before the Board of Directors and explain the reason for delinquent dues.
- n. Anyone suspended for nonpayment of dues will have a period of six (6) months to settle their account including bringing all dues up to date with the Club. At the end of this period, if dues are not brought current they would be completely expelled. To be allowed back in the Club, the expelled member must apply as a new member.

Only members in good standing are eligible for trophies at our car shows. We have so many great cars in this Club; we want everyone to have an equal chance to win recognition.

Your Board has the responsibility to keep you, the membership, informed of all matters concerning the Club. They asked me to address this issue with you. Most of what we do as a Board and as a Club involves fun stuff. But we would be remiss in our responsibilities to the Club if we did not also govern.

I want to end this on a positive note. I can't think of a single person now or before that hasn't been a friend and an asset to our Club. Gloria and I have had more fun since joining QCCC than in anything else we have ever participated in. Thanks to everyone who has paid, and to those who have not paid yet, please do so quickly so we can get on with the fun stuff...

Problem With C6 Roofs on Coupes

GM has issused a recall to fix a problem with roof panels on C6 coupes that have become delaminated and have been known to fly off the car when traveling at high speeds. Below is a copy of the recall notice taken from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administrations web site. The date of this notice is May 24, 2006!

ON CERTAIN 2005-2006 CHEVROLET CORVETTES EQUIPPED WITH PAINTED ROOFS, THE ADHESIVE BETWEEN THE ROOF PANEL AND THE FRAME MAY SEPARATE.

Consequence:

IF THERE IS A COMPLETE SEPARATION, THE ROOF PANEL MAY DETACH FROM THE VEHICLE AND IT COULD STRIKE ANOTHER VEHICLE AND CAUSE INJURY AND PROPERTY DAMAGE. Remedy:

DEALERS WILL INSPECT VEHICLES FREE OF CHARGE FOR POTENTIAL ROOF PANEL-TO- FRAME SEPARATION AND ADD THE SPECIFIED ADHESIVE FOAM OR REPLACE THE ROOF WITH ONE HAVING ADHESIVE FOAM. THE MANUFACTURER HAS NOT YET PROVIDED AN OWNER NOTIFICATION SCHEDULE. OWNERS MAY CONTACT CHEVROLET AT 1-800-630-2438.


