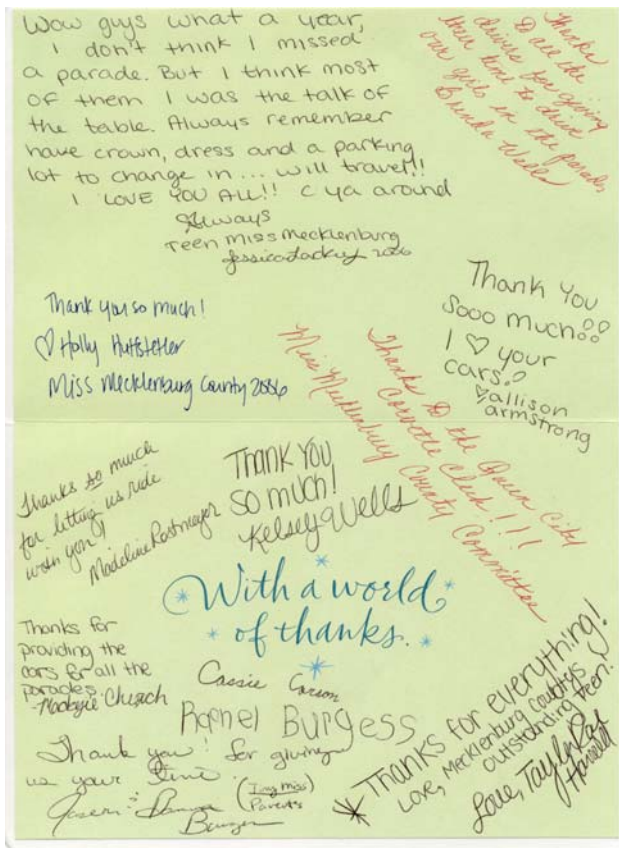
Linda Meadows is also looking to put the wraps on dues for the year. She will be sending e-mails to everyone who is not current so please bring your account up to date.

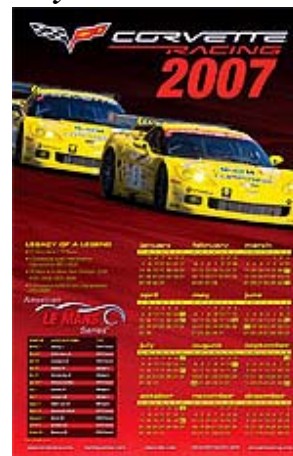

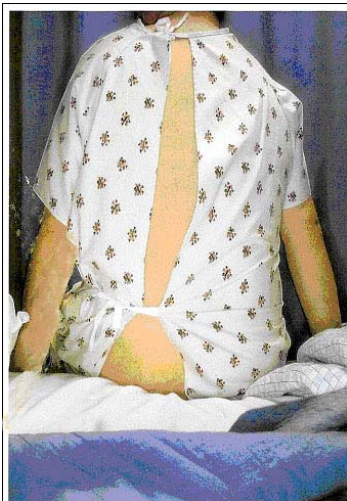

Corvette Convertible Chosen as '07 Indy 500 Pace Car

Check out the 2007 Indianapolis 500 Pace Car on the "Yard of Bricks" at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. This year's pace car is an Atomic Orange Corvette convertible. This event will be the 91st Indy 500, and it's the ninth time a Corvette was chosen and the 18th time a Chevrolet will lead the field - an event record. And for the first time since 1998, GM will offer limited-edition production replicas based on the pace car that will go on sale in the spring. Production will be limited to 500 - so place your orders soon!



The car will feature Indy 500 fender badges, a rear spoiler styled from the Z06 and new aluminum split-spoke wheels in a Sterling Silver finish. The seats are embroidered with Indy 500 logos, the interior trim pieces are painted Atomic Orange to match the exterior and it sports matching Atomic Orange engine covers.



The 400-hp LS2 is standard and the cars come with the Z51 performance package with a six-speed trans. Standard issue is the navigation system with Bose audio, as well as OnStar. Base price is expected to be \$66,995, with the only option



being a paddle-shift six-speed automatic, the price will be \$68,245.

Looking for a unique ride?? Try out the new limited edition Z06 called the "*Ron Fellows ALMS GT1 Champion Edition Z06*". Ron Fellows, driver for Corvette racing has been instrumental in the remarkable success of the Corvette Racing team and is being honored by this special car.



This special Corvette Z06 is the first signed special edition in Corvette's 54-year history. Only 399 vehicles will be built for worldwide distribution and all will be produced within a separate three week production run. Approximately 300 will be available in the United States. The exclusive nature of this Special Edition (option code Z33) will dictate access to a limited number of Corvette dealerships.

All will be Arctic White paint (including the door handles) accented with a racing-style fender stripe and Ron Fellows' autograph. The front fender graphics feature double Monterey Red Metallic stripes with Machine Silver borders and Fellows' autograph in a contrasting Victory Red shade, along with the callouts of the championship years when he was at the wheel. There is also a maple leaf logo motif incorporated with the graphics, a nod to Fellows' Canadian heritage. The red-over-white color scheme of the car's paint and graphics represents Canada's colors.



Exterior will sport a full-width racing spoiler and a unique windshield banner. Additional standard equipment includes the well-equipped 2LZ package and chrome wheels. Special interior appointments include:

- Red seats, center console, door panels and instrument panel
- Red, leather-covered armrest with a Corvette-signature "cross flags" logo that is hand-signed and numbered by Ron Fellows
- Tech pattern interior trim (carbon fiber appearance) center trim plate
- Chrome Wheels

MSRP of the Z33 package is \$2,020 with a total vehicle MSRP at \$77,500

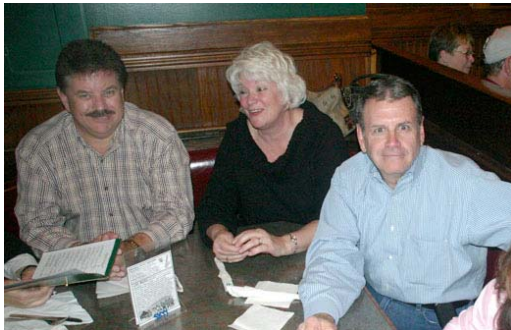

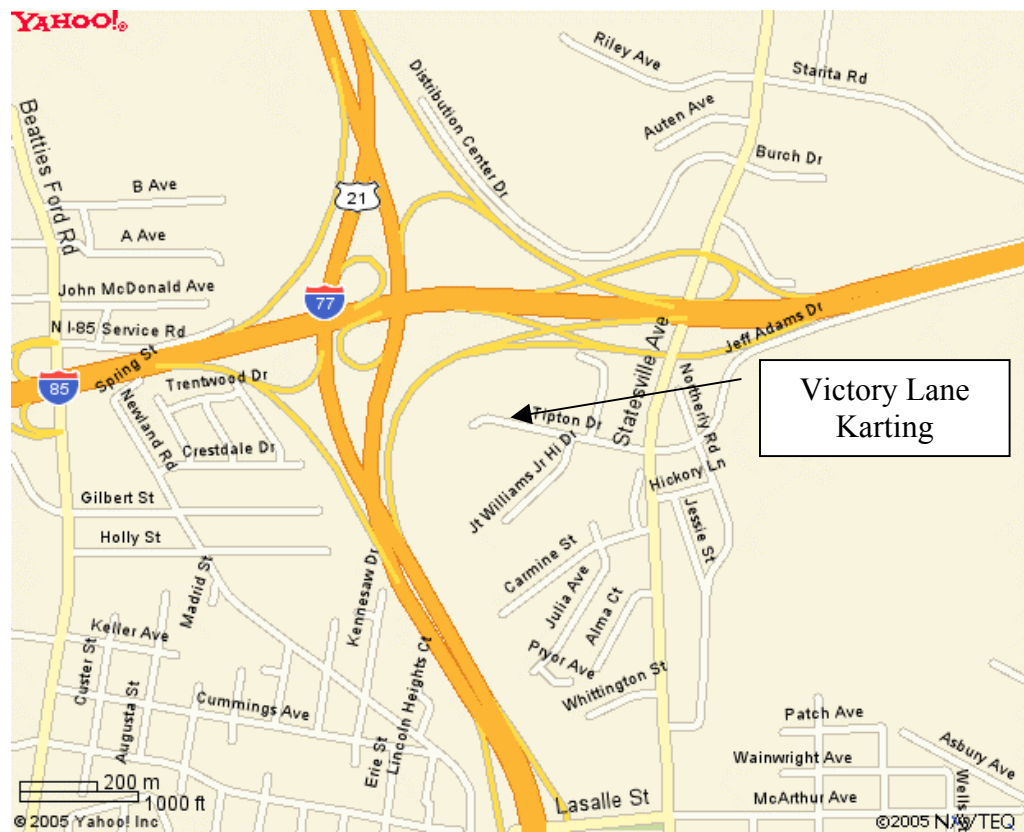
