

Eddie Burt, Membership Director:





Automotive Report




Dear Fellow QCCC Members,






The local USO has been open for 22 months and has served over 150,000 service men and families.

past Crown Pointe area. Take the first left after the Crown Pointe Shopping Center. You will turn into the Shopping Area with Hooters, International House of Pancakes(IHOP), Midas, Infiniti, Krispy-Kreme and the Suburban Lodge.
