Additional thoughts




Back Stage Tour of Blumenthal Theaters

Again we are thankful for ALL of our club sponsors especially City Chevrolet and Hendrick Cadillac Chevrolet. Be sure to support them!!


As I close for this month, remember this is your club. It will only be as good as YOU want to make it. Give us your idea's on events and trips you would like to see.







