After the war he moved to Research and Development and retired in 1974 from the Warren Michigan plant.

Walter is an avid sportsman. He was a senior club champion snow skier for six years and never lost a tournament. He could shoot a prairie dog from 600 yards. He enjoys golf, archery, guns and of course cars.

His first new car was 1946 Buick Roadmaster and he purchased his first corvette in 2002. He has been a member of the Queen City Corvette Club since 2004. Walter has two corvettes, a 2004 red coupe and a 1982 T top with 38,000 miles. He enjoys the many trips the club offers and especially the people. 












Vettes in the Valley - May 23 – 24th, 2009

There are two parts to participating in this event.






