These dues go to cover the costs of running the club, mailing newsletters, and subsidizing the costs of our meetings. Club officers serve as volunteers.

Gary Artis is the featured member for the month of April. He is originally from Kankakee, Illinois and graduated in 1983 from George Mason



University in Virginia with an accounting degree. Gary moved to Charlotte in 1989 and has a small business that sells financial software and services. He met his wife Linda at a Great Plains software convention in Fargo, North Dakota. They were married three years later at the same convention. Gary and Linda have two children Heather and Christopher.

Gary joined the Queen City Corvette Club in 1991 and served as treasurer for three years. He has loved Corvettes since he was very young boy and took his first ride in a Corvette in the early 1970s. He owns ten Indy Corvette Pace cars, including models from 1978 to 2008. He is only missing one pace car, a 2006 Z06 which he would love to add to complete his Corvette Pace Car collection (and possibly make him the only private collector in the world to have such a collection). Gary owns a Ron Fellows Z06, a 1990 ZR-1 and a 2000 Nassau Blue Coupe that Linda drives. He still has the very first Corvette he ever drove, a 1977 Coupe. He also dreams about purchasing a yellow C6 ZR-1 while they are still being made.



Gary considers himself one of the luckiest guys around in that he has been able to pursue his dream. In 1997 QCCC had a trip to see Tom Smith's garage. It was at this time that Gary decided he wanted a similar operation. He started a new business "Always Out Front - Corvettes and Classics." The other cars in his current collection include both a 1967 and a 1969 Camaro pace car, a 1971 Dodge Challenger pace car, a 1971 Plymouth Barracuda, a 1972 340 CUDA, a 1970 Dodge Challenger R/T and a 1970 Dodge Challenger TA. There were only 2,355 1970 Challenger TA's produced, and he has one of 900 of them with a four speed pistol grip shifter. It is now powered by a 440 six pack motor. I had the pleasure of riding in this car which brought back memories of the

1970's for me. What an experience!

He credits his success to his wife, his family and employees. When Gary first joined the club, he remembers we were geared more toward racing. Over the years, the club's focus has become more social with charity events and helping others. All of his cars are driven and he enjoys sharing them with the members of the club.

Behind him on the wall is a picture of all the cars from the September 2008 Motorama II 100th year anniversary of GM. His car is one of 55 cars featured. 
