In 1989 he worked at the BWI airport tower as a supervisor responsible for installing the electronic system utilized by the Air Traffic Control system. In 1994, they took the '69 out of storage and drove the car to participate in the silver salute and received the Bloomington Gold Survivor's Award. The car has received numerous NCRS awards which include the Top Flight Award at the Local and Regional levels and the NCRS 2 Star Award for originality in the exterior and interior area.

In 1996 they purchased a White LT4 from City Chevrolet. They sold this car in 2001 and now have a 2001 dark metallic Bowling Green. Wendy's dream car is a new Cyber Gray convertible option with the plant photo tour and museum delivery.



Walt and Wendy's best friends are members of the Queen City Corvette Club. They enjoy the Car Caravans, road trips, cruises and meeting all the "Corvette People". Walt and Wendy have dedicated a great deal of time and effort to the success of our club. 

- 3. Approx $\frac{1}{4}$ mile on right
