


















Automotive Report








NCM Corner

Bad Driving - It Is In Your Genes!

That bad driver weaving in and out of the lane in front of you -- he cannot help it, U.S. researchers reported on Wednesday. They found that people with a particular gene variant performed more than 20 percent worse on a driving test than people with a different DNA sequence.

The study may explain why there are so many bad drivers out there -- about 30 percent of Americans have the variant, the team at the University of California Irvine found and they seem to hang out on I77!

This team tested a group of people asking them to drive 15 laps on a simulator and then repeat the task a week later. To their surprise, they found that those with the mutant gene did worse, consistently. The team was not really looking for insights into driving but chose the driving test because it uses common skills.




