December's member spotlight shines on Bill Cruthis. He is originally from Clinton, Illinois. He attended the St. Louis College of Pharmacy and was graduated in 1969. He has been a pharmacist for forty years. Bill worked for Wal-Mart for twenty three years as a district and regional manager. He met Judy Armstrong in high school. They lost touch with each other and were reunited five years ago through a mutual friend. She moved here and opened Albertine's Florist in Denver. She has one son.



Bill moved to Charlotte in 1974 and met Shad Alberty, an early QCCC club member. At that time, the QCCC membership only totaled twenty seven couples. They met every Wednesday night in the attic of a house located on the corner of Morningside and Independence. They usually had fifteen to twenty Corvettes and listened to the Juke Box and had drinks. Bill was the Chairman of the Decorating Committee and helped maintain the Club House. The interior walls had red, white and blue stripes around the room. Bill still has this same design in his garage today.

Back in the 1970's, the Charlotte Motor Speedway allowed the Queen City Corvette Club to hold car events at the Speedway. The only stipulation was that the Club members had to clean the infield. In 1977 the Queen City Corvette Club had a challenge between the Corvettes and Porches. He won the A Class for Big Blocks. In 1978 CMS hosted the National Corvette Club Convention South Sectional which Bill attended.



Bill has owned many Corvettes over the years, including a 1963 blue split window; a 1965 red convertible; a 1968 green convertible; a 1970 silver coupe; a 1974 brown T-top; a 1985 red Corvette; a 1987 yellow Corvette and his present car a 2006 blue Corvette.

He was a member of QCCC until 1980 and rejoined in March of this year. Bill would like to establish a historical committee and gather information about the old club. He would like to get a scrapbook together with old photographs. Anyone interested, please contact Bill. He has been a member of the NCRS since 1976 and a Museum member. Bill enjoys the camaraderie and being around people who love Corvettes.

Corvette Plant Buyers Tour-The Ultimate Corvette Goal

Corvette people have various goals in mind when they think about a Corvette. Some may want to own an older version that they used to own or saw during their early years. Or maybe restore one, run one at a driving event, or just purchase one in order to enjoy the driving fun and belonging to a club with all of the camaraderie that is inherent with a club membership.

Following along and watching your Corvette be assembled at the Corvette Assembly plant in Bowling Green, Kentucky has got to be the Corvette owners' ultimate ownership experience.

The Corvette museum has a program that allows people who have ordered a specific car with their specific options to follow along the assembly line while their car is being assembled.

You will be accompanied by a guide who represents the Museum and was once an assembly line technician who worked at the plant. They are knowledgeable, personable, and have a wealth of information about the process that you are seeing.



When the car is ordered through the dealer, an order code is subsequently generated for your particular vehicle. At that time, the Buyers Tour can be requested through the Corvette Museum. As time progresses, the build date, marriage time, and tour guide from the museum are provided. This usually occurs approximately two weeks before the actual build day to allow for travel plans.



If the Buyers tour (through the Museum) and the Museum delivery (ordered through the dealer) are requested, two separate trips will be required. There is no flexibility with the buyer's tour. Once the Target Production Week (TPW) is scheduled by the plant, the car will be built during that week.

Typically, arrival in Bowling Green is the day before production. Assembly of the car starts with the frame and instrument panel already installed as the car enters the "trim" line and where the buyer's tour starts. It is

amazing to see the car move down the assembly line as correct parts for a particular car are waiting for installation. Another line running separately but in coincidence with the "trim" line is the "chassis" line. The appropriate engine, drive line and suspension move down the assembly line until it meets with the appropriate car dolly on the "trim" line and the "marriage" occurs.

What is equally interesting to see along with the car assembly is the logistics of the parts delivery system. Either overhead conveyers or forklifts delivering bins or pallets ensuring that the correct parts are in the correct place on the line at the correct time for the appropriate car.

The assembly process is very precise. When the exhaust manifold is attached to the engine as it is suspended from a moving overhead track, the line worker places both manifolds onto a tool that also moves. The line worker presses a button on the installation tool and both left and right manifolds move up to the engine correctly aligned and the attachment nuts are correctly torqued to the proper specification. This is generally the way all large or heavy parts such as the doors, wheels, seats or front and rear glass is installed on the moving car.

The assembly line technicians are extremely cordial and very grateful of tour participants. While the tour is a long two day adventure, the experience is unforgettable. If you are lucky, they may allow you to install a part or two and be the very first to start your car! The experience cannot fully be explained. There is just too much to see. It is a must do experience for the Corvette owner that will never be forgotten. Just be prepared to have a smile etched on your face for a very long time!

The Charlotte International Auto Show and the Queen City Corvette Club

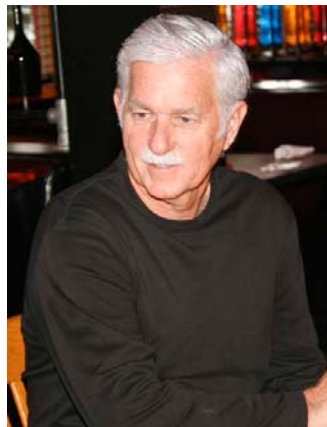
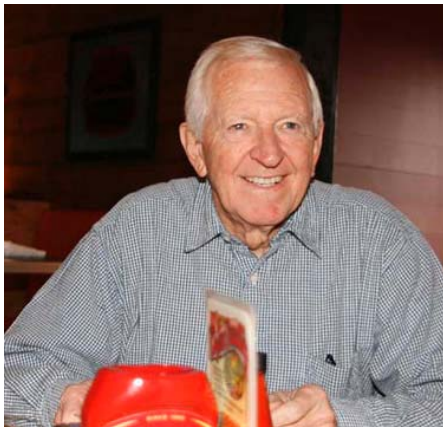
