

VP Report

Thanks to all who wished me well at my new post as VP. As many of you know, Laura & I have a C-1, so my monthly articles will be on Corvette history.

The original Corvette logo was designed in 1953 by Robert



Bartholomew, an interior designer at Chevrolet. It was displayed on the prototype Corvette, had the familiar crossed flags with the checkered flag on the right side and an American flag on the left. Several days before the start of the Motorama show at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City, Chevrolet management had to redesign the logo. It was illegal at the time to use the American flag on a commercial product. The new logo featured the familiar checkered flag and a white racing flag, with a red Chevrolet bowtie symbol and the fleur-de-lis. The fleur-de-lis (flower of the lily) is a French symbol representing peace and purity. After unsuccessfully searching for a family crest for Louis Chevrolet, the fleur-de-lis was chosen because Chevrolet is a French name. The logo has had many design changes over the years, but retains its basic elements.

January 17, 1953 – The prototype Chevrolet Corvette "Dream Car" is displayed at the Motorama show at New York's Waldorf-Astoria Hotel.

January 1, 1958 – The 1956 Corvette makes its debut at the Waldorf Astoria in New York for the Motorama show. First body redesign.

January 1956 – Zora Arkus Duntov, sets a two-way record braking average of 150.583 mph at the Daytona Beach Raceway in a modified 240 HP V8 powered Corvette.

January 21, 1962 – General Motors' Chairman, Frederic Donner issues a policy memo, re-iterating the company's compliance with 1957 AMA company-Sponsored racing ban. This officially cancels production plans for the Corvette Grand Sport, with only 5 of the intended 125 cars built.

January 1, 1975 – Zora Arkus Duntov officially resigns from Chevrolet. David McLellan takes over as Chief Engineer.

January 1986 – Chevrolet announces that the Corvette has been chosen to be the Official Pace Car for the Indianapolis 500 race.

January 8, 1997 – The 1997 Corvette is introduced to Canada in Montreal.

January 1999 – At the 24 Hours of Daytona race, Chevrolet debuts the GT2 class C5R Corvette race car. Ron Fellows and Chris Kneifel drive one to third in GTS class.

Hope to see everyone at the next meeting. It will be Saturday, January 9, 2010 at the NASCAR Technical Institute in Mooresville. 5:30 Social, 6:30 Meeting, check the website for directions.

Remember, real Corvettes have solid axles.


We closed our 2009 parade season with the Indian Trail, Kannapolis, Gastonia and Lake Wylie


















NCM Corner



A Day of Remembrance: December 25 1909

This December 25th marks the 100th birthday of Zora Arkus-Dutov, the father of the Corvette. It is fitting that God chose that day to bring Zora to us, the day we celebrate the birth of His Son. I am in no way comparing Zora with Jesus, just the coincidence of the day.

CORVETTE. Harley Earl designed it, Bill Mitchell re-fined it, Myron Scott named it and the government and EPA of the late 70's and early 80's tried to tame it.



Corvette would have died in 1954 as so many bean counters at GM wanted. It would have been a foot note in the legend of GM as something they tried. It would have been remembered as a car they thought the public wanted, but really didn't. Its underpowered 6 cylinder engine and power glide transmission would have been too much for the brand to overcome. Just a cute little car that only about 3600 people would have as a novelty. Ford would have taken the market over completely with the Thunderbird and GM would have been left in the dust in the sports car market. But then came Zora!!!!



Without Zora we would not have the Z06 option of 1963 or the Z06 of the 5th or 6th generation. We wouldn't have to explain what the big gold "V" on the side of the '55 stood for. We wouldn't have "one horsepower per cubic inch" Fuel Injection. We wouldn't have the ZR-1 or the ZR1. We wouldn't have the LT-1, L-98 or the LS series engines. We wouldn't have the SS, the Indy or the Aerovette. The five '63 Grand Sports would never have hit the track to challenge the Cobras and the rest of the world. The '96 Grand Sports would not have been made to honor those great racers. We wouldn't have the Corvette Museum in Kentucky or all the friends and associates and clubs we have because of the Corvette.

How many people would come up to you and start a conversation if it weren't for your Corvette that Zora built?

100 years ago, the savior of the Corvette was born and all was saved. So as we celebrate the birth of Christ this December 25th, remember to give thanks for Zora and all he did.

Zora saved the Corvette and made it what it is today.


