## C-4 1988-1991

Big changes are ahead for the C-4 platform, but the '88 model year was much like the '87. Changes in '88 were optional 17" wheels, which came on



85% of the 88s. Also a revised cam shaft and freer flowing exhaust boosted horsepower in the L98 to 245. A 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary edition was a \$4795.00 option with 2050 being built. All had white exteriors, white interior including steering wheel, and white 17" wheels. The Callaway twin turbo option increased in price to \$25,895, compared to the '87 price of \$19,995, with only 125 Corvettes so equipped. This was also the last year for the Doug Nash "4 + 3" manual transmission. By 1988 they had worked out the problems with this transmission, but with only 18% of Corvette owners ordering this option, it was time for a change, total production 1988 was 22,789 units.

Finally in 1989 the Corvette received a proper manual transmission, the new ZF-6 speed, another new option was FX3 Selective ride control, and a fiberglass hardtop for convertibles. Total production for '89 was 26,412 units built.

"King of the Hill" was the nickname given to the new 1990 ZR-1. The backbone of this \$27,014 option was the LT5 engine, a dual overhead cam 32 valve V-8 producing 375 horsepower. All ZR-1s came with 6-speed transmission, widened rear fenders to accommodate the P315 / 35ZR17 rear tires, and squared off taillights. Motor Trend magazine tested the new ZR-1, top speed was 175mph, 0 – 60 time in 4.7 seconds, quarter mile times of 13.13 seconds at 110 mph. This car was designed to compete with all the hot cars in the world: Ferrari, Porsche, Lamborghini, and it did not disappoint. It was a real world beater. The 1990 Corvette also got a new dashboard with vastly improved mixture of analog and digital gauges, better ventilation, better sound system and a driver's side airbag. Total production in 1990 was 23,646 units – of which 3049 were ZR-1s.

Restyling of the Corvette body occurred in 1991 with a slicker front end incorporating wraparound fog lights and a new rear fascia to look like the ZR1. The base Corvette still used the L98 engine that has been used since 1985, but the six-speed transmission now was ordered on 30% of new Corvettes. The ZR-1 option now cost \$31,683, the Calloway twin turbo option that was still available in '91 was now \$33,000. Chevrolet produced 2044 ZR-1s and 71 Callaways in 1991. Total production for '91 was 20,639 units.

## **Corvette Milestones for September**

**September 29, 1953**: The automotive press gets their hands on a Corvette for test and review, as the Corvette is officially released. Eight Corvettes are made available to the press at the Milford Proving Grounds.


**September 9, 1955:** Zora Arkus-Duntov races a <u>disguised 1956 model</u> <u>Corvette with a V-8 engine</u> at the **Pike's Peak Hill climb**, setting the stock car record with a time of 17:24.05

**September 13, 1973:** General Motors show a 266 ci two-rotor Wankel engine test Corvette at the 45<sup>th</sup> German Motor Show in Frankfurt, Germany. The car is called Corvette 2-Rotor, (code name XP-897GT) with a steel body.

**September 24, 1974:** General Motors president Ed Cole announces that the company is postponing the introduction of a Wankel-based rotary engine, due to difficulties in meeting proposed emissions standards.

September 1, 1992: Corvette chief engineer Dave McLellan formally retires, staying on as a consultant until his replacement is named.

**September 2, 1994:** The National Corvette Museum opens in Bowling Green, Kentucky. 4000 Corvettes attend. Over the three day weekend, *118,000* people visit the museum. The gift shop does *\$1,000,000* in business.

**September, 1997**: 9,000 Corvette owners attend a special weekend gathering at the **National Corvette Museum** in Bowling Green, Kentucky. Chevrolet introduces the 1998 convertible Corvette.





# Big George McLeod - The Spring of '76

Sometime in the spring of '76 on a Wednesday night at the club house, big George blew into Charlotte, migrating up from Florida. Not a lot was ever

known about his personal side although Richard reminds me he opened an army navy store on Central Avenue, which is true; as I remember renting 8 army cots for Central Illinois Corvette members who came down to race the speedway one fall.

George was not tall in stature but he was very stout, and presented as if an extra on a Hollywood set of a motorcycle movie, complete with the blue jean vest, patches, bandana and a lot of facial hair. While his appearance might put you off at first he proved to be a regular Joe and blended into QCCC well. We never knew why but he always dealt with cash only, as evidenced by Bill buying a complete 63 fuel unit for \$300 at the I-hop on Central Avenue around 1:00 AM after a rousing night at the clubhouse. Seems George needed some cash right away, to the point of panic, and Bill needed the fuel unit for his split window coupe (more about that story at another time). George drove an early 70 C3 T-Top with aftermarket side exhaust and a big block motor that was really built. The car was either faded silver or gray and could pass for primer. Inside appeared as if he was living in it. He spent a lot of money trying to beat another QCCC member, Melvin Pace's 1968 Corvette at the drag races.



That spring QCCC was heavily into auto-crossing and always looking for an empty lot to use. UNC-Charlotte at the time was a commuter college built into the woods on Hwy 49. They had some classroom buildings, no dorms, and a lot of parking lots. We made a connection and got permission to use a lot surrounded by woods for a Sunday race event. We arrived around 9:00 AM and set up our cones and timing equipment and were excited at the prospect of a good all day race event. After a few cars had run the course we were surprised to hear gunfire

coming from the wooded area at the back of the lot. It was apparent that someone was target practicing with what sounded like a 22 gauge pop gun. We started to gather and call off the event when we saw George go to his Corvette. He produced a 357 Magnum and started off across the lot firing in the air. We heard pop-pop of the 22 then boom boom-boom of the 357. George was reloading as he entered the woods. After a few moments he reappeared, crossed the lot, put his gun up and said "lets race", they won't be a problem again. Nothing was ever reported so we assume they saw the light and left on their own after their meeting with big George. If you saw that image coming thru the woods firing that cannon, valor would dictate flight not fight.

It was a different time in our country then, not so politically correct. We were young and did not always make the best decisions but we sure had a good time. Big George left town as suddenly and quietly as he came and we never knew if his past caught up with him or if he was just always on the move, but he sure added a different flavor to QCCC while he was here.

The severity of the financial penalty also may depend upon the number of miles above the speed limit when clocked and the number of points on a driver's license, or if the offense occurred near a school or road works. A driver's license may also be suspended, their car impounded, or they may face jail time. Some states including Michigan, Texas and New Jersey, operate under so-called "driver responsibility" laws, which, in some cases, can result in a further fine of up to \$1000 leveled a year after the conviction. Virginia, which until 2008 had some of the strictest penalties for speeders, repealed its driver-responsibility laws last year after a public outcry. Georgia, meanwhile, has just voted to add \$200 to the fine of what it terms "superspeeders," who travel more than 10 mph over the speed limit. Other states with fines of up to \$500 --- which in many cases is then compounded with additional court fees --- include Maryland, Missouri and Oregon. - **GPS device maker** <u>Garmin Ltd.</u> is recalling about 1.25 million of its nüvi personal navigation devices because of a potential problem with batteries overheating, possibly creating a fire hazard. Garmin, a Swiss company building a 40-employee operation in

Cary, said Wednesday that the recall applies to about 796,000 units sold in the United States. The batteries, which were made by a third-party supplier and fall inside a defined date code range, can become problematic when used in Garmin devices with a specific printed circuit board design. The interaction can make the device more likely to overheat. The snag has occurred in less than 10 cases, never causing injuries or significant property damage. "Nevertheless, given Garmin's long-standing commitment to safety and customer satisfaction, Garmin is proactively recalling nüvi units with the specific (printed circuit board) design and with batteries from the specific date code range out of an abundance of caution," the company said. Customers should determine whether their nüvi is affected by going online, where they can enter their nüvi serial number and get further instructions if necessary, Garmin said. The recall applies to model numbers 200W, 250W and 260W and to model numbers in the 700s. Garmin will provide a new battery and a spacer between the battery and circuit board at no cost to customers. For the third time in four years, the **Bowling Green Corvette** Assembly Plant saw a change in leadership on August 1st. Less than a year after Bob Parcell took over the reins of the GM plant,

he's now headed for a new job and the plant is getting a new boss. Production seems to be back on track... morale is up again at the General Motors plant... so it's almost a fitting time for a change in leadership. **Dave Tatman** says it's a "dream come true". "Among the plant managers in the company, the Bowling Green plant is regarded as the "crown jewel" of our assembly plant to manage a job. I'm absolutely delighted and humbled to be asked to be the plant manager of Bowling Green," he says. Tatman comes in after the Corvette plant spent a year in "dire straits". "We've gone through a period of incredible uncertain anxiety in 2009, but our company could not be positioned better as we look into 2010 and beyond." With several years of plant managing under his belt for GM, he wants the

community to know his presence doesn't mean the plant will be closing or moving. "There's absolutely no intention to move any business out of the Bowling Green Assembly Plant on the part of GM," Tatman re-iterates. "We want a smooth transition because our buyers expect a lot out of a car when they're paying the type of money they do for an exclusive sports car like the Corvette." 

- GM has no plans for mid-engine Corvette. That's the word from a General Motors top Global Engineer. A Corvette with a hybrid powertrain? That's a possibility. Karl-Friedrich Stracke, GM's vice president of global vehicle engineering, also said GM is not testing a V-6 Corvette. "The

customer always wants power. That will not go away." That means automakers must continue to offer better performance while improving fuel economy, he said. Stracke said GM and other automakers could decide on a strategy that limits the number of conventional powertrains in their sports cars. Said Stracke: "You could keep a normal powertain configuration for a small amount of very excited car enthusiasts and turn 80 to 90 percent of your sports car portfolio to hybridization." # Labor Day: How it came about; what it means -



Labor Day, the first Monday in September, is a creation of the labor movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and wellbeing of our country. Labor Day is a day set aside to pay tribute to working men and women. It has been celebrated as a national holiday in the United States and Canada since 1894.

The *first Labor Day parade* occurred Sept. 5, 1882, in New York City. The workers' unions chose the first Monday in September because it was

halfway between Independence Day and Thanksgiving. The idea spread across the country, and some states designated Labor Day as a holiday before the federal holiday was created.

The vital force of labor added materially to the highest standard of living and the greatest production the world has ever known and has brought us closer to the realization of our traditional ideals of economic and political democracy. It is appropriate, therefore, that the nation pays tribute on Labor Day to the creator of so much of the nation's strength, freedom, and leadership — the American worker.
