Dues and donations are not tax deductible. In addition to various social activities for members, QCCC raises money for and participates with various local charities. We strive to promote exciting, safe and fun ways to enjoy our Corvettes. We hold business meetings on the second Saturday of each month. Our monthly business meeting usually incorporates social time. Our socials are always fun and are focused around fellowship, food & drink. We've had swimming parties, barbques, cookouts, day cruises and weekend trips. We participate in local auto shows and hold charity Corvette shows each year. After an initiation fee of \$7.00, club dues are only \$8.00 a month, per family, and are to be paid quarterly or annually. These dues go to cover the costs of running the club, mailing newsletters, and subsidizing the costs of our meetings. Club officers and supporting staff serve as volunteers.

To become a member of the QUEEN CITY CORVETTE CLUB, you must own a Corvette and attend at least three (3) monthly business meetings and two (2) events within a six-month time period. Express your wishes for membership during a monthly business meeting, be voted in and begin paying dues.

After getting the current area code, I called and was able to talk to the quy I bought my car from, 40 years ago. His name wasn't Robert Smith, but it wasn't very unusual. Thomas Day was 73 years old and had lived in the same house for 45 years. Thank goodness, or I might not have been able to track him down. I found out I was only the third owner, which surprised me. Thomas remembered he bought the 'Vette from a guy that owned a gas station. He didn't remember his name, but thought that he now has a trucking company in the area. We chatted for awhile about cars; Thomas currently has a 1981 Corvette in the garage. I should have asked him if he'd take \$500 for that one.

The story still isn't over, now that we have a lead regarding the first owner, we plan to try to find him. Next year we're taking the car to the 50th anniversary meet of the VCCA and 100 year anniversary celebration of Chevrolet in Flint, Michigan. I asked Thomas if I could come by his house to show him the car and get a picture of him in it, and he agreed. I'm crossing my fingers that I'll be able to find the first owner, maybe get a picture of all three of us with the car.



National Corvette Museum Corner



R8C Museum Delivery Experience

For QCCC members, or new and prospective members who are not aware of this option, let me share my experience with you. Some background...National Corvette Museum (NCM) delivery is referred to as

Regular Production Option (RPO) R8C, and is available through any Chevrolet Dealer at the time of ordering your car. R8C customers are welcomed to the NCM in Bowling Green, KY with signs commemorating the event, a tour of the Corvette Assembly Plant follows with your own NCM delivery Team guided VIP tour. A personal, special VIP guided tour of the NCM is conducted where you can take all the time you need to soak up the realm of all things Corvette. In conclusion you will see your Corvette on display. Next, a member of the NCM delivery team provides a quality orientation followed by a very thorough delivery presentation of your vehicle. A unique gold decal is either placed on the inside of the drivers' door jamb to signify the importance of this memorable occasion, or you can choose to save it to put with your other documentation. R8C includes an individual one year NCM membership and a plaque that has your name, date of delivery and Vehicle Identification Number (VIN). The experience is shown live, world-wide, on the Museum's webcams, which several of our club members, in fact, watched while I went through the process. I talked with many club members who had been through this experience before finally making up my mind to do so, and everyone said it was such a wonderful ordeal, go for it! And they were oh so right. If you have the time, or can arrange your schedule to do so, I enthusiastically recommend this outstanding option. So much, in fact, that I can't believe I had to be talked into it! Thank-you to Wendy and Walt Krupowicz for pushing me over the edge to go this route, it truly was an experience that will last a lifetime in my mind. The 457 miles from the Museum to home was a smile every mile to say the very least, and all of you who "still play with cars" know exactly what I'm talking about. I was not a museum member prior to this, after having made the pilgrimage however, I am now a "convert" as our Club Ambassador, Paul Mariano refers to it. I now "get it" Paul...seeing is believing, and rest assured I will be a member from here on out!

Eight of those 27 QCCC members have left us way too early in their lives. Shad was one of them. The "Turtle" still lives in Charlotte. They were quite a couple and a big part of QCCC. Brenda and Shad had a real zest for excitement with a special sense of humor. We can only hope QCCC did as much for them as they did for our club. Two salt of the earth Corvette Americans who helped make QCCC what it is today. A salute to the dancing Alberty's and a special thank for all you did.

"A Turtle in Name Only"

The mid 70's saw the ladies of QCCC getting very involved in racing and being instrumental in our National Championships. Especially fast were Jenny Stevens, Linda Pace, and Brenda Alberty. Brenda and husband Shad were the favored "older influence" (40) vs. our average age of 27. If you are a shag dancer you have heard of them. Shad is in the Shag Dancer's Hall of Fame and they won many Myrtle Beach dance contests as well as taught multitudes. They owned a '71 base engine yellow with black top and hides nicknamed the "Banana". Brenda's CB handle and nickname was "Turtle", which relates to the tortoise and the hare. She has great autocross skills and just like the turtle was just smooth, no wasted motion, no tire smoke, but very fast. She would usually win her class and often FTD (Fastest-Time-of-Day) for the ladies, always beating Shad and many of the tire-burning gear-head guys. There is a reference in the May '76 newsletter under things we would like to see, i.e., "Brenda's side of the trophy case compared to Shad's." Just like the turtle, slow and steady but always with top results.

Driving Spring Mountain

A First-Hand Account of Experiencing the Ron Fellows Performance Driving School



For the past two months we've described our arrival, day one and day two of our trip to Spring Mountain and spending three days driving Corvettes around the 2.2 mile 11 turn road course at the <u>Ron Fellows Performance Driving School</u> in Pahrump, Nevada. Day Three, Graduation & Barrett-Jackson:

Day three (our last) brought mixed emotions for Bill Davidson and me. We'd looked forward to getting through the class, being able to use the skills we'd learned in "open track" and graduating. But, we also had to face the realization that the fun would soon be over. All the anticipation of the trip, getting there and experiencing Spring Mountain would soon end. So now our thoughts of doing this because it's a "once in a lifetime experience" began to turn into "when can we do this again?" Bet you can't eat just one "

Kind of reminds you of a Lay's Potato Chip commercial - "Bet you can't eat just one."

So far, Bill and I had driven Grand Sports, Z06s and ZR1s on the track. Bill was already familiar, but this had given me an opportunity to understand the distinct differences in each of the Corvettes...and there certainly are some besides the power and braking differences. A very small example of this is foot pedal placement. They are not in the exact same place in each Corvette. Being able to "heel and toe" in one does not mean you can 'heel and toe" in them all. The slightest variation in pedal placement for someone with a narrow foot may mean not being able to "heel and toe" at all. But between us, I didn't "heel and toe" very much and I don't think Bill did either. More about day three:




We again jumped quickly into class with a review of what we'd learned in the first two days. Our class size had reduced by five students – those who had purchased the two day class instead of the three graduated the afternoon of our second day. The thirteen of us remaining practiced more heel and toe, threshold braking and shifting, car control and visual skills. The coffee and Gatorade was flowing again to get us focused on our last day of class. Rick Malone, our Lead Instructor, then explained what we would be doing next – open track. Open track meant all students in Corvettes and on the track at one time using our skills to run as hard as safely as we could. If you wished to pass a slower student, you must first notify that



student, who would then radio you when it was OK for you to pass. Passing could only occur at certain points on the track. All students were in radio contact with each other and the instructors at all times. Safety was of primary concern. We didn't want to lose any Corvettes, instructors or fellow students (no mishaps in the 3 days)! The instructors roamed the entire course on motorbikes and golf carts watching our laps and providing pointers about how we could better our lap times. Rick covered what we were to do if someone ran off the track (no one did) until cleanup could be completed. Open track was a blast! It was an opportunity to practice what we had learned and fine tune the way we approached each corner as fast as we dared to go.

This, truly, was the highlight and climax of the three days at Spring Mountain.

After another fantastic lunch in the clubhouse, we assembled for our group graduation photo with one of the Corvettes. Then more open track. The ladies were again a part of it all and able to move to strategic points to take photos of us as we ticked off our laps. Lap after lap, we concentrated on perfecting each corner and picking up our pace. Each open track session lasted about 45 minutes. We then we would return to the classroom for more Gatorade or water and time to ask questions and get input from the instructors. Each time you could try a different Corvette or grab the last one you drove if it was still available. This allowed us to stick with what we knew or take our skills from Corvette to Corvette and modify those skills to suite the little nuances of the next Corvette. Track session after track session, lap after lap, the Corvettes ran



just as great on the last lap as they did on the first. I hate to admit it, but this surprised me a little. Spring Mountain employs its own experts who maintain the Corvettes on their premises. I asked and was told the ZR1s get through about four classes on a set of brakes and approximately 4,000 miles on a set of tires. That's a lot of laps around the track! These cars are built for driving!

Finally it came time for graduation. Rick Malone conducted a little "debriefing" as we wound down and caught our breath from the track. He asked each of the students to provide any comments about the facility and instruction that we wished to make. He then asked the ladies the same question. I believe each person in the room felt the same way – this was an exceptional experience at an exceptional facility, one we would never forget. As Rick called our names, each student walked up and received their diploma and a firm handshake from each instructor. With graduation behind us, it was time to say our goodbyes to the instructors, the front office ladies and the friends we had made during the last three days. This was another opportunity to think about how each of us had come together from such different backgrounds and areas of the



USA, but with a common bond in our love for Corvettes and our desire to maximize our driving experience and pleasure. This common bond may be hard to understand and explain, but you know it's there each time you see an oncoming Corvette owner wave or you can't wait to tell your Corvette friends about what the "Corvette fairy" left at your door. What other brand has female followers who know as much about options and specs as many of the guys do? You know what I mean.

It was then time to load up and drive to Las Vegas. Once in the car, Julia and Peggy had a little graduation surprise for us. They were leaving the condos and ran into Ron Fellows who was also leaving to drive to Las Vegas to be at the GM tent at the Barrett-Jackson Auction. They had Ron Fellows autographed hats for us.

We spent all day Thursday at Barrett-Jackson at Mandalay Bay. GM had a large exhibit tent full of new cars (Volt, CTS-V, etc.) and a large parking lot adjacent to the main Barrett-Jackson building where some of our instructors from Spring Mountain were riding fans around a course in ZR1s from the Ron Fellows Driving School. And they weren't just riding around – they were driving the ZR1s hard. The National Corvette Museum had a large display area inside the GM tent with souvenirs and Corvette related material. It was great to see familiar NCM faces and talk with them. We spent hours looking at the vehicles to be auctioned and the vendors. Barrett-Jackson was all we expected it to be and more – the icing on the cake after our three days at Spring Mountain. If you plan to do the Ron Fellows Driving School at Spring Mountain, try to do so when Barrett-Jackson is in Las Vegas. You will not regret this fun-filled exciting week!

Other Queen City Corvette Club members have experienced Spring Mountain. E. O. Oakley and Richard Fisher provided us with input on their experiences while there. If you are interested in more information, contact info, or have any questions, Bill, E. O., Richard or I will be happy to talk with you. And if the ladies have questions, Julia and Peggy will gladly share more about their experience with you. But don't be surprised if you have to call time-out and resume the discussion at another

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
