# The President's Vault

With the warmer, sunny weather teasing us, we know cruising time is right around the corner. Long time Corvette owners have expressed a concern about newer owners not being familiar with "Saving the Wave". I've done a little research on it, and have some history, some instruction, and some local stories.



The wave probably started after WWII, when returning GIs brought back strange little automobiles from Europe. They would acknowledge each other with a little wave, when passing another two-seater. By the late forties and early fifties, sports car magazines established a pecking order of who had to wave first, based on the car you were driving. The pecking order was roughly Ferrari, Porsche, Jaguar, Alfa, Morgan, Triumph, MG, etc. With Ferrari at the top, everyone had to wave at them first and they had the choice of returning the wave or not. Along comes the '53 Corvette. Not being considered a real sports car, because of its automatic transmission, it was put on the bottom of the list. Not to be slighted, Corvette owners started waving to each other. The years have been good to the Corvette, as we have multiplied, the others have dwindled. The newest models cost 1/3 the price of a Ferrari, but will equal or best it in most time trials. So, if a Ferrari driver waves at you first, be kind to them and other lesser cars on the road, give them a little wave.

Bob Denney remembers the first time someone waved at him. He was in his new 1957, and a '56 waved as he passed him. When they were stopped at a light, Bob asked him why he waved and he said he was saluting Bob's good taste in cars.

My first time I remember was 1970. I'm driving my '60, and I passed a '56 T-bird and he waves. I asked my friend if he knew who it was, but neither of us did. A few days later I passed a midyear Vette, and he waved, I didn't know him either. I finally caught on.

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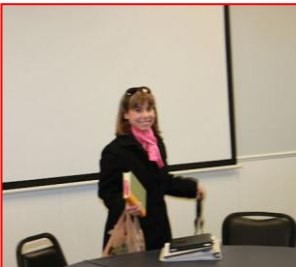

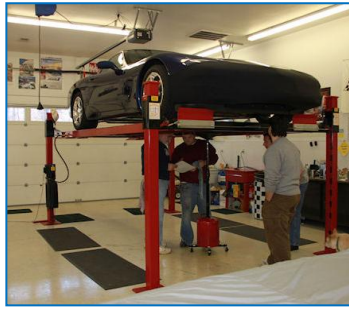

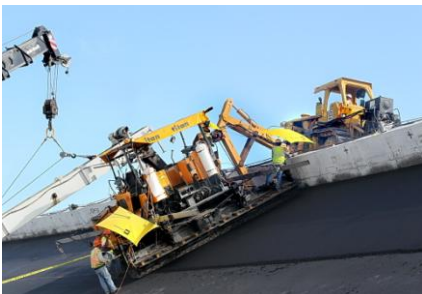

~ October 21st – Helen GA.


~ Planning for the 2012 banquet has already begun. We will have a Corvette theme.

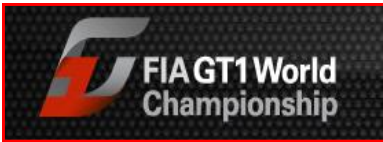
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Most Corvette Fans are aware of and closely follow our factory-backed **Corvette Racing Team** in the **American Le Mans Series**. We are passionate about following the Team's success and eager to show our support at every opportunity. Fewer Corvette Fans may be familiar with other racing series in which the Corvette competes on the world's stage against other world-class sports cars. To help familiarize us with **America's Sports Car** in other racing series, we will periodically provide information and updates about other racing championships. This month, the **Gazette** will focus on the **FIA GT1 World Championship**.



**Introduction:** The FIA GT1 World Championship is a world championship sportscar racing series, regulated by the Federation Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) and brings together six iconic brands – Corvette, Ford, Aston Martin, Lamborghini, Maserati and Nissan – in spectacular competition in an exciting sprint format. The FIA GT1 Series features 12 teams, 24 cars and 48 of the world's top drivers competing on 10 of the leading circuits on four continents. The FIA GT1 Series will visit some of the world's most legendary circuits. Entrants compete in one-hour races driving "Grand Touring" race cars

that are based on standard production road cars, and conform to strict GT1 regulations. Championships are awarded to teams and drivers each season.

**History:** GT (Grand Touring) races first began in the 1950s with Ferrari, McLaren and Lotus providing compelling competition for media and fans. In 1997, the FIA – motorsports world governing body – created an officially sanctioned GT series. The first year saw competition between five manufacturers in GT1 and four in GT2, with an average grid of 45 cars.

**From Manufacturers to Privateers:** With the departure of the last manufacturer after the 1999 season, the FIA GT1 evolved into a championship led by privateer team with manufacturer's support. The series rebuilt itself around the GT and N-GT categories including brands such as Chrysler, Lamborghini, Lister, Porsche and Ferrari. In 2005, the series implemented the FIA's "Balance of Performance System." This guaranteed a level playing field across the different architecture of brands such as Corvette, Aston Martin, Ferrari, Lamborghini, Maserati and Saleen.



**2010 Season:** 2010 was the first season of the new FIA GT1 World Championship, an evolution of the GT1 and GT2 competition. Currently it's strictly GT1, promising an even faster, more exciting racing series. Races were held in 10 countries, with each consisting of 2 one-hour races. The first race serves as a qualifying race to determine starting grid for the main race where Championship points are awarded. Maserati took the 2010 GT1 World Championship by winning 4 of the 10 races.

## "Fool Infected"

Bill Cruthis ("Brillo Pad") blew into Charlotte in December of '74 complete with afro and bell bottoms. He brought a '70 coupe, 350/350 and on the trailer was a '63 split 327/340 with fuel injection bars on the fenders from the previous owner. He came from a small farm town in Illinois with only one police car and virtually no crime, except his speeding ticket and warning for drag racing. So except for 5 years at the St. Louis College of Pharmacy, the big city was a foreign place.

On a cold Wednesday night in March of '75 at the QCCC Clubhouse, around 9 PM Big George McLeod stopped in anxiously looking for Dollar Bill Ingram who had not yet shown. It seems a deal was brewing and Big George had an urgency level above ol' Dollar's. 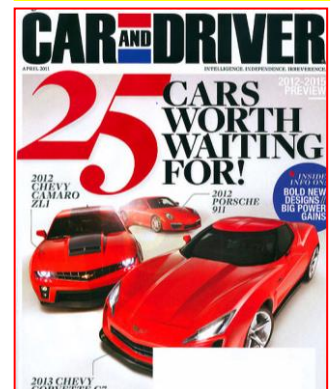

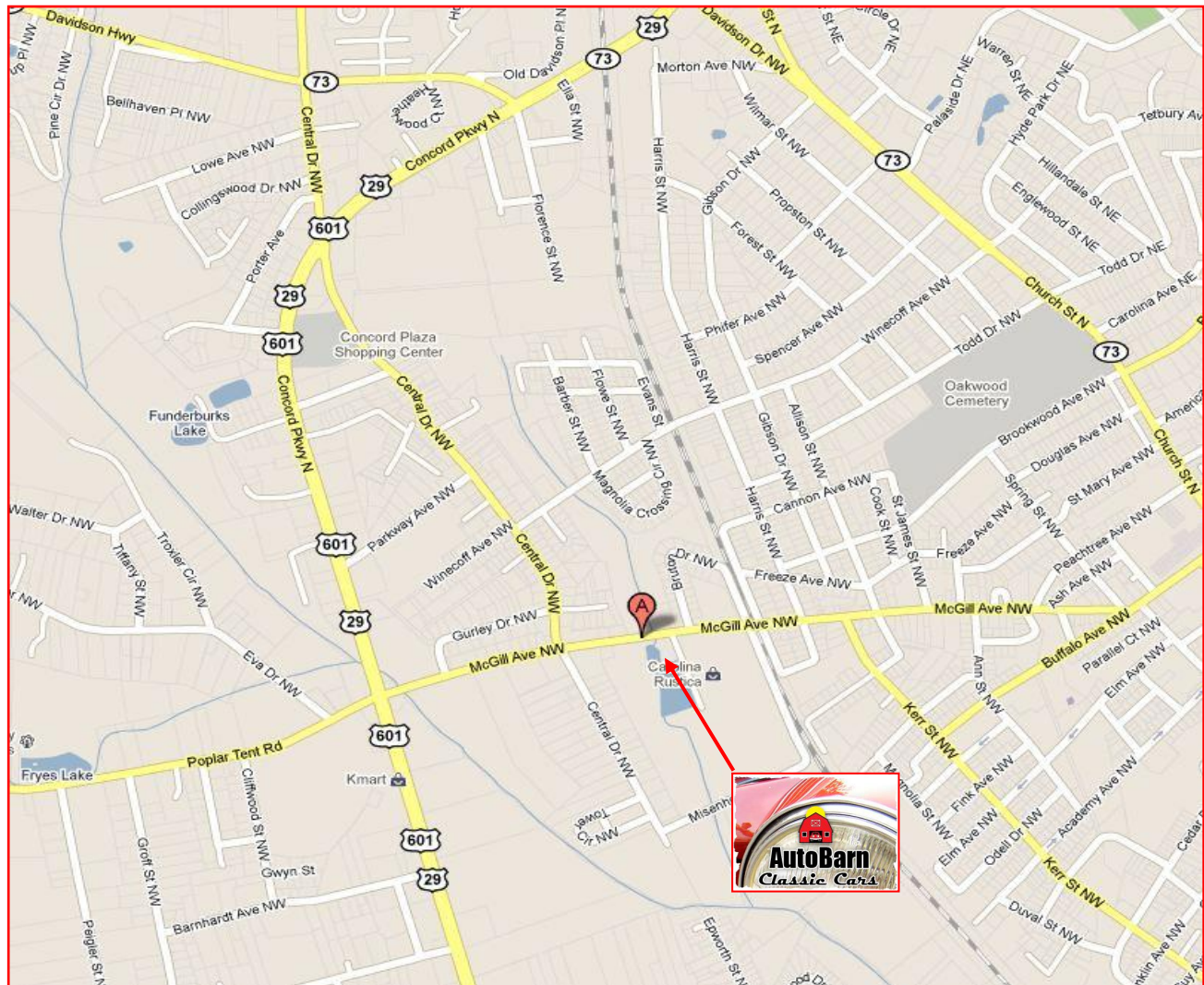

**Keyless entry systems vulnerable to high-tech car thieves** provided by 

Swiss researchers find holes in the keyless systems from eight car manufacturers.

Remote keyless entry has been around for a while – since the late 1980s, in fact – and today it's almost standard on all new cars. But the pervasiveness of this feature is not without consequence. As researchers in Switzerland point out, the technology can make vehicle theft a breeze for a savvy thief.

Remote keyless-entry systems use radio waves that typically are specific to a manufacturer, and the signals are usually encrypted. When your vehicle's key fob is within 20 feet of the car, you're allowed to transmit a signal to unlock the doors, pop the trunk, remote start your car (when equipped) or activate the car alarm.

Researchers at ETH Zurich discovered that these encrypted signals are easy to intercept and trick.

The theft works by setting up two antennas, one near the targeted vehicle and one near the holder of the key fob — be it in a purse, bag or pocket. This equipment can usually be purchased for \$100 to \$1,000. The person with the antenna aimed at the owner of the key fob needs to get within 26 feet of the target. In a store, this could be a few aisles away, so as to not arouse suspicion.

Once the antenna is near the intended victim's key fob, the key transmits a low-power signal to the antenna, which is then relayed to the antenna near the vehicle. Once that occurs, the thief can unlock the doors and drive away (if the vehicle has push-button start).

The Swiss researchers hacked into eight car manufacturers' passive-entry systems using this method. No cryptology or protocol could stop it.

While this system may seem fairly complicated, it could catch on with car thieves because of the cost of the equipment and anonymity. However, the hack cannot start the cars with traditional keys. Today's ignition systems are increasingly complicated and secure. That's one reason why car thefts are largely on the decline in the U.S.

David Wagner, a computer science professor at the University of California at Berkeley, said there are probably easier ways to steal cars, but the "nasty aspect of high-tech car theft" is that it doesn't leave any sign of forced entry. That could lead to problems with police and insurance companies in tracking down the criminals or with filing claims.

Right now, the only way to protect yourself is by either shielding your key fob's radio with a guard or leaving your key fob at home. Srdjan Capkun, an assistant professor at ETH Zurich, says the institute is working on a way to prevent this sort of theft.
