# Te President's Vault

We just back from the "Charleston Outer Limits" trip with several other QCCC members, and it was a great time. We avoided most of the bad weather, had a pleasant harbor boat tour, toured a plantation, ate too much food, and had lots of time to visit with each other and share stories. I think everyone that went had a good time. Thanks Susan & assistant Boyd, for setting this up.



Driving to Charleston we passed several Vettes, and had an opportunity to observe "wave" etiquette. Sometimes it's tough to tell if the other driver waved, but we'll give them the benefit of the doubt. I'm not sure what the etiquette would be for the Vettes that our group passed on the trip. Do they need to wave continuously, wave to each, wave to first & last? Personally, I wave to each in that situation; it's always fun to see a group out enjoying their cars.

Last month we went over the history of the wave, and had examples from a few of our members. This month I have some examples of wave styles, and more member stories. For the complete article that I took the information from, just Google "Save the Wave". It will bring up an article that was in "Corvette News", which, in the beginning, was a free publication sent out by Chevrolet to Corvette owners, beginning in 1957.

A few example of "Wave" techniques:

- ➡ The Gaping "Yoo Hoo!" good for waving at Vettes on the other side of divided highways.
- The Two-Finger Flip hand stays on wheel; index and middle finger pop up.
- The Four-Finger Pop-up hand stays on wheel, all fingers pop up. Less likely to be misinterpreted than the two finger flip.
- De The Eight-Point Spread thumbs around wheel, all fingers up, reminiscent of Al Jolson at his best.
- ➡ The Pointer Sort of a wink, a click and a bang combination.
- 😁 The Wiping Swipe sort of a "hi, guys".
- The Right-handed "Hi-g'bye a desperation move, given only at the last minute. Hand shoots straight skyward, occasionally scrunching fingernails or knuckles in the process.

I asked Walt Krupowicz if he remembered how he learned about the wave. He said it was from reading this August or September 1969 issue of the Corvette News, which he received when he & Wendy bought their 1969 Vette.

For the "newbie" drivers, it takes a while to get used to waving. Laura was so worried about waving during the first month of driving her car, that she embarrassed herself and waved at an old Camaro. The other day, she told me a guy in a truck waved at her - that he must have forgotten which vehicle he was driving.

Bob Becker had the best "wave" story, but it was about a different wave. He was in his early 20's, and had a 1970



350/350 and was coming back from a wedding. He had run a few miles with a Jag XKE, when a New York state trooper "waved" him over for doing 135 in a 50. The trooper told Bob that when they hear about a Corvette accident on the highway, they send 3 vehicles to the scene. A pickup truck to pick up the fiberglass pieces, a wrecker for the frame, and a hearse to "pick up your dumb a—". He received a ticket for no registration.

Remember the wave, and let's drive 'em and enjoy them!

# The *"Barn Find"* To End All *"Barn Finds"!*

We all have heard of barn finds where people find a special car in someone's barn that has been there for years untouched, well this is actually a garage find. On Tuesday March 1<sup>ST</sup> Brenda was riding our Granddaughter, of 3 years old, around trying to get her to go to sleep for an afternoon nap. As she drove through our old neighborhood which was only a couple of miles from our current house she spotted an old Corvette in a garage

and the owner was outside working in the yard. She stopped and began to talk to the gentleman and found out that the car was a 1954 Polo White Corvette. As they talked she told him we were Corvette people and we had a 61, 66, and a 2010 Corvette. She also told him that I had been looking for a 1954 Vette and had made several offers on different cars and had even placed bids on them at auctions. He then looked at her with a surprised look and asked if she would like to buy this car and that he was going to put it on the internet for sale the following week. She was so surprised it left her speechless for a moment and as she got her breath she then ask the price. I was out of town so she immediately



called me and explained the condition of the car, which she said was in perfect condition and the asking price. I told her not to hesitate and to write the man a check before he changed his mind. I arrived home on Saturday to find a 1954 Corvette in near perfect condition setting in our garage.



This car is unbelievably perfect with all original parts that came on the car in 1954 except the tires, top and ignition coil. I have all the documentation on the car from the original owners who bought the car in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida on November 11, 1954 and had a lien amount of \$1,903.92 which was cancelled "Paid In Full" on October 24, 1956. The owners had the car for 30 years, and drove the car 39,876 miles during that period (1954 – 1984). The car now has 40,926 documented miles on it and we are the 6<sup>th</sup> owner. We have all the original registration cards and copies of the titles with documented odometer readings and dates of transactions with owner's names. The gentleman that we purchased

the car from bought it in 2002 and the car had only 40,016 original miles on it when he bought it. They only drove the car 900 miles in 10 years.

The car had a complete frame off restoration in 1991 and received a fresh coat of lacquer paint from top to bottom and looks as fresh today as when it was applied. The carpet, seat covers, trunk liner, gauges, Wonder Bar AM radio, windshield and everything else is from the factory in 1954. Everything works as it should including the radio. The engine received a full rebuild, balanced, and blueprinted in 2005 and has only 500 miles on it, all of which is documented. The car is the 1,461<sup>st</sup> Corvette built in 1954 and has a 235 cubic inch, 150 HP Blue Flame straight 6-cylinder engine with a Powerglide two speed transmission,



and BF Goodrich 670-15 wide white wall tires. This Polo White exterior with Sportsman Red interior and Tan top is a beautiful combination on this vintage Corvette. The car has not been NCRS judged, but we plan on having it judged this year.

We are proud to own such a near perfect classic 1954 Corvette and look forward to sharing it with all of our Corvette friends.

# Does sheriff need 198-mph cruiser to enforce 65-mph law?

RALEIGH, N.C. — If you plan to outrun the law in Wake County, you'd better have a very, very fast car.

### Or maybe a rocket.

Wake deputies have been spotted using a black Chevy Corvette Z06 to pull over speeders on Interstate 40. Among the fastest production cars in the world, the Z06 has base sticker price of \$74,875 and a V8 racing engine that turns out 505 horsepower.

The car has a top track speed of 198 miles per hour, according to Chevrolet.

Though the car has set tongues wagging among Triangle sports-car enthusiasts, Sheriff Donnie Harrison declined to talk about the Corvette Monday or Tuesday. He did show the car to crews from local television stations.

"You're not going to force me to talk about anything, you understand?" the sheriff said by telephone late Tuesday, his voice raised. "Ive got a schedule to run. I don't sell papers."

Harrison said he was upset by an N&O reporter calling county commissioners for comment about the Corvette before he was ready to hold a media conference about it.

County Manager David Cooke said it is his understanding that the Corvette was seized from a drug dealer, but that he could provide no further information, such as how much county money had been spent to upgrade the car.

Gary Buchanan, a Raleigh resident who owns a 2007 Corvette, saw Wake deputies last week utilizing the stealthy, unmarked Z06 to enforce the 65-milesper-hour speed limit on I-40 in Cary.

"It had blue lights in the back and blue lights in the front," Buchanan said. "It was the most amazing thing I've ever seen. Something like that is so extreme. I mean, if my wife was out driving and this thing came up behind her and the light's started going off, man, she'd be scared to death."



Pixar recently announced that NASCAR racer *Jeff Gordon* will make an appearance in the upcoming *Cars 2* movie as a "respected competitor – and legitimate threat - at the World Grand Prix." The character of *Jeff Gorvette*, "an up and coming *Chevrolet Corvette C6.R* that's turning hoods wherever he competes" will wear the number 24. *AUTOBlog*, reporting on the announcement, commented that "Pixar needed an accomplished road-racing car and probably wasn't interested in a character named Jeff Gimpala."

*Darrell Waltrip* also returns reprising his role as racing announcer *Darrell Cartrip*, although he's graduated from being a Piston-Cup announcer to a World Grand Prix announcer in the sequel.





## A Special Challenge to the Members of

## Queen City Corvette Club



Our NCM Ambassador, Paul Mariano, received a message from Wendell Strode, Executive Director of the NCM asking for our help in gathering and sending much needed personal items to our troops in Afghanistan. Included in Wendell's email was the following message from Major Michael C. Greene:

"Would you approach the Corvette Clubs/National Corvette Museum and the Corvette Assembly Plant on supporting a donation drive for comfort items (snacks, toiletries, socks, books, magazines) for the 3rd "Duke" Brigade recently deployed to Afghanistan for a year? Corvette Clubs are known for their generosity, and I wanted to do something for the Brigade for their support of the Corvette and Cadillac Teams. Task Force Duke's mission is to assist Afghan National Security Forces and government leaders in conducting counterinsurgency operations, restoring stability and security, and setting the conditions necessary for future transition of governance and security to the Government of Afghanistan. Task Force Duke is comprised of more than just the six organic battalions that make up the 3/1 Brigade Combat Team at Fort Knox (these being the Blue Spaders of 1-26 Infantry, Ramrods of 2-2 Infantry, Raiders of 6-4 Cavalry, Centaurs of 1-6 Field Artillery, the Valiant Warriors of 3/1 Special Troops Battalion, and 201st Brigade Support Battalion, Thor). Joining our team is 1-168 Infantry from the Iowa National Guard, the 92nd Military Police Battalion out of Fort Leonard Wood, the 1-10 Aviation out of Fort Drum, 703rd Explosive Ordnance Disposal and other Counter-IED elements, two Provincial Reconstruction Teams (PRT), and Agriculture Development Teams (ADT) out of both Indiana and Oklahoma. All together we have just under 5,000 Soldiers on the team. Some Soldiers live better than others here. We have a good number, however, that don't even have running water, flush toilets. hot showers, you name it. They don't complain about the lack of amenities, but won't refuse care packages full of good will! Some suggested items for the care packages: Snacks - cookies, candy, peanuts, Toiletries shaving cream, razors, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush, etc. Books, Magazines Socks Check the links below--- the first has the forms/info needed to be fully informed on Adopt-a-platoon as well as a video commenting on the program. The second is also the same video, but with a motto that finishes at the end (first video cuts off the motto). http://www.etownchamber.org/adopt-a-platoon.asp http://www.thenewsenterprise.com/content/adopt-platoon

Wendell provided these comments as well: "NCM Ambassadors...a couple of personal thoughts on this from a Vietnam Veteran:

- I cannot put into words what hearing from back home and getting care packages meant to me personally and our entire infantry company in Nam. I ask and highly encourage each club and each entity represented by our Ambassadors to take on this project.
- Major Greene was instrumental in assisting Pratt & Miller in sending an American flag to Afghanistan, where it was flown, then returned to the U.S. and flown at Petit Le Mans in Atlanta. The flag was gifted to the NCM and is now on display. Major Green has done two tours of Iraq and is now a Public Affairs Officer at Fort Knox. He is also a Corvette owner and a member of the NCM.
- The request is that we as a Corvette community conduct a donation drive of items needed by the soldiers of the 3rd Brigade in Afghanistan. As has always been the case and going back to Valley Forge, our American soldiers make do with whatever they have and whatever the circumstances may be. Each Ambassador and their group can make a difference.
- Items that are being requested or suggested include: snacks, cookies, candy, peanuts, toiletries, shaving cream, razors, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, socks, books, magazines, cards and letters, etc. Anything you send will be appreciated and used by the soldiers. Also, remember that females are in our military and representing our country as well, so include some things with our brave ladies in mind.

Such was the life of caravan travel in QCCC in 1974. The CB radio was actually quite an upgrade from hand-signals. Most had 6-foot antennas. I think a few had antennas built into the radio antenna but they were not very effective. *"Brillo-Pad"* (Bill Cruthis) had one that was 6 feet with a magnetized base which he placed on the bar of his '74 with the T-Tops out. The magnet base was good as you could move it to your tow vehicle when you Corvette was on the trailer. I am sure it was a strange site going down the interstate with all the long antenna waving in the wind, but it sure saved some speeding tickets. Long haul truckers were the best, they loved playing cat and mouse with the troopers, just ask Fred McCoy.



Smile When You Drive I-95 - Surveillance cameras along Interstate 95 in Ridgeland, SC have nabbed thousands of

Ridgeland's Mayor said the cameras in his town about 20 miles north of the Georgia line do what they are designed to do: slow people down, reduce accidents and, most importantly, save lives. But lawmakers who want to unplug them contend the system is just a money-maker and amounts to unconstitutional selective law enforcement. Earlier

this month, a Ridgeland Police Officer clocked a passing Mercedes with South Carolina tags going 83 miles per hour. A camera fired and pictures of the tag and driver appeared on a monitor in the van. The motorist continued north, unaware of the \$133 ticket that would be following in the mail.



If the request can be accommodated when the vehicle is produced, the invoice will include a Manufacturer Suggested Retail Price (MSRP) of \$5000 for the Customer's Selectable VIN Ending Option.
- \* "Order Constraints" on Cyber Grey Metallic We recently told you Jetstream Blue was no longer offered. Now Clark Belvin alerts us that Cyber Grey Metallic, along with Crystal Red Metallic, are listed as "Zero Availability". The world's only plant that produces "Xirallic", the enhanced aluminum oxide that creates the metallic glow when applied to paint, is located within 28 miles of the Fukushima nuclear power station. It is unclear when the plant, which was damaged by the earthquake, could resume production.







Chevrolet general manager Jim Perkins and Chief Corvette Engineer Dave McLellan deliver the car to the National Corvette Museum. April 30, 2000: Dave Hill, Chief Engineer of Corvette, unveils the 2001 Z06 model Corvette, with new 385 HP LS6 engine. April, 1965: The Mako Shark II (project XP-830), formerly called the Mako Shark, makes its debut appearance at the New York International Auto Show. The non-running full-size model cost nearly \$3 million to create.
