Dues and donations are not tax deductible. In addition to various social activities for members, QCCC raises money for and participates with various local charities. We strive to promote exciting, safe and fun ways to enjoy our Corvettes. We hold business meetings on the second Saturday of each month. Our monthly business meeting usually incorporates social time. ## The President's Vault

I was recently asked what makes Corvette a sports car icon. I've been thinking about it, and here are some of my thoughts regarding that.

First of all, I think the Chevrolet and GM commitment to build a sports car, and stick with that platform, gave it a chance to become what it is today. When it began, it was



underpowered with a six cylinder engine and a two speed automatic transmission. No one in the world considered it a sports car with the automatic transmission. In 1955 when the Corvette got some competition with the Ford Thunderbird, it looked bleak for Corvette. The Thunderbird sold 16,155 units compared to Corvette's 700. But, the new V-8 and three speed manual transmission in 1955 gave Corvette some spark. A passionate letter from Zora Arkus-Duntov to the GM executive board kept his dream of the Corvette sports car concept alive. Through 55-57, Ford's Thunderbird, considered a two seater personal luxury car, continued to outsell Corvettes five to one. Chevrolet stuck with their concept of a two seat sports car, and didn't follow Ford's step of changing to a four seater luxury car, as the '58 Thunderbird. Corvette continued to improve engines, transmissions, and chassis to make it a world class competitive sports car.

Duntov continually raced the Corvette, and used the knowledge learned to improve the production cars. By 1960 Briggs Cunningham took a three car Corvette team to Le Mans and raced it to first in its class and 8th overall. This made an impact on the Corvette brand in the automotive world, and secured the sports car image for Corvette. Zora, in continuing the evolution of the sports car, built five 1963 Grand Sports for racing. At that point GM cut off the money and said there would be no more factory sponsored racing. Corvette continued to race for the next 30 years in the hands of privateers. Over these 30 years the production cars had various personalities, from grand touring to flat out straight drag cars. In the mid-eighties, when the C-4 chassis came out, Corvette was back on track as a sports car contender. The C-4 has some racing success with records in endurance racing. The chassis improvements continued with the C-5 and also heralded the Corvettes return to a factory sponsored race team. They have had great success with many podium finishes in Le Mans and Petite Le Mans series in the United States. Chevrolet stayed committed to the two seater and worked their way to a level of competing with what is considered the world class sports cars such as Jaguar, Ferrari, Porsche, and Aston Martin, beating them week after week at tracks around the country, and at less than half the cost.

These are some of my thoughts of what makes it an American icon. I also think that it's the little boy's dreams of owning a Corvette, that keeps it alive. Let me hear from club members, when was your first Corvette moment. What made you decide that you had to have a Corvette?

Remember the wave, and let's drive 'em and enjoy them!





## Chevrolet Aims For Sinister Corvette and Hits Their Mark

QCCC Gazette Chief Field Correspondent Wade Stickels has been scouring the autoblogs in cyberspace to bring us the latest secrets that Chevrolet can't keep. Wade alerted us that the latest special edition package for the Corvette is black and loaded with technology. The racing inspired 2012 Centennial Edition package will be available on all models – including the Grand Sport, Z06 and ZR1. Carbon Flash Metallic paint with black graphics, satin-black wheels and red calipers will identify the new edition's exterior. Inside, ebony leather wrapped instrument panel and doors are complimented by red stitching. A closer look shows upgraded seating with suede inserts.

stitching. A closer look shows upgraded seating with suede inserts. Magnetic Selective Ride Control, the world's fastest-reacting suspension and a technology advance initiated by Corvette, is included on all Chevrolet Centennial Edition Corvette models. The Centennial Edition also features special badges that signify Chevrolet's racing history. A graphic logo featuring an iconic image of Louis Chevrolet appears on the B-pillars, the center caps of the wheels, and the center of the steering wheel. The seat headrests also carry an embossed centennial logo. Aficionados will note one other small detail: The historic crossed flags badge contains a small adaptation, with "100" in place of the traditional fleur-de-lis symbol, only for the Centennial Edition.

The real shocker has to do with the elimination of a color. Black – the top selling color for every year since 2004 has been deleted for 2012. The only

way to get a black Corvette in 2012 is to order the Chevrolet Centennial Special Edition which only comes in Carbon Flash Metallic. The other new color for 2012 is Carlisle Blue Metallic, which replaces Jetstream Blue. But never fear, black will return for 2013 according to the Design Team.

QCCC Members attending this year's C5/C6 Bash were treated to the unveiling of the Centennial Edition package on several models. The presentation by the Corvette Design Team confirmed what Wade had discovered.

Keep the "scoops" coming, Wade!



- Theme packages are fun try sending packages for 4th of July, Halloween, Holidays, possibilities are endless.
- Please always include a card or letter with your package that has your logo, name and address on it so soldiers can send notes of thanks.
- Use postal service's flat rate boxes. You will be able to send heavier items at a flat rate.
- Put all items in plastic bags to prevent spillage from items that may open. The plastic bags will be reused by the soldiers.
- Cushion the items in the boxes with baby wipes. Baby wipes are popular with soldiers. Boxes should be full to prevent items from jostling around during shipment.
- Remember that the things we send will have to be carries and put in pockets. Please send small items.
- Postage stamps are not needed. Soldiers that are deployed can send letters back to the United States for free.
- Please do not send liquids or aerosol cans. Send dry drink mixes (pre-sweetened) instead.
- Please do not send items requiring a can opener.
- Please do not send articles of civilian clothing. Soldiers can wear only their uniforms.

- Alcohol, pork / pork products cannot be sent.
- Please do not give out the unit's APO address to others.


## Vintage QCCC

We applied for and were awarded the opportunity to host the *NCCC National Convention*. Drag Races were worked by *Greater Columbia Corvettes* and held at Blaney Drag Strip in Blaney, SC.


The Silver Anniversary Gum Ball Ralley had help from Appalachian Corvette Club of Boone and Confederate Corvette Club of York, SC.

## National Corvette Museum's 2011 C5/C6 Bash

QCCC Members enjoyed great weather, the introduction of the 2012 Corvettes, Seminars, Banquets, Vendors, Corvette Race Team Luncheon and Loads of Fun at this year's Bash.





#### Seen & Heard at the Bash

GM's Corvette Chief Engineer Tadge Juechter, Product Manager Harlan Charles, Exterior Lead Designer Kirk Bennion and Interior Lead Designer Chris Sass were on hand at the Bash to unveil the Centennial Edition, present the 2012 Corvettes and answer questions from the attending Corvette Fans. Below are a few highlights -



- Carbon Flash Metallic and Carlisle Blue will only be available for the 2012 model year. Black returns as a color selection in 2013.
- Corvette's greater performance for 2012 begins with the new, optional *Michelin® Pilot® Sport Cup Zero Pressure* tires, which are available on the two highest-performing models, the lightweight, 505-hp (377 kW) Z06 and the maximum-performance, 638-hp (476 kW) supercharged ZR1. They are competition-oriented tires, optimized for warm, dry conditions to increase cornering and handling capability. When combined with the Corvette's exclusive Performance Traction Management (PTM) technology which manages torque delivery for maximum performance the tires are expected to help set



new benchmarks for Corvette performance. Engineers estimate an 8-percent gain in maximum lateral acceleration, to more than 1.1g, and improved braking distance. Testing at Virginia International Raceway has demonstrated improvement of approximately three seconds per lap.

- A carbon fiber hood will be an available option on 2012 Z06 models, while the standard manual transmission for ZR1 will include taller gearing in fifth and sixth gears, for a 2-mpg improvement in highway fuel economy.
- All 2012 Corvette models will include a *new seat design* and a *new steering wheel*. The seats feature larger bolsters on the seat back and cushion areas, which provide better driver support, especially in high-performance driving while remaining comfortable for daily street driving. Microfiber suede seat inserts are optional and improve tactile feel, as well as add additional support.



- Also coming in 2012 is a new *Bose uplevel audio system*, which includes nine speakers (compared to seven in 2011) for improved audio quality that is more precisely tuned to the cabin's acoustics. New tweeters located in the instrument panel and improved Bose Nd next-generation bass performance is the main benefit that Corvette drivers will hear.
- Customers will be able to select brake caliper colors for more personalization of their Corvette. The calipers are offered in the red, yellow, silver or gray.
- Performance Traction Management will be offered for the first time on the Z06. The system also integrates traction control, active handling and selective ride control systems to enhance race track driving consistency and overall performance. When full throttle is applied upon exiting a corner, it automatically manages acceleration dynamics.
- New wheel options will be available.
- Boyd Kurt provided this info from the Bash *Tech Talk at Bowling Green C5 & C6 Bash:* Paul Koerner gave a great talk at the C5 & C6 Bash. He was also available to talk to each of us one on one. We learned about steering column lock fixes, why top tier gasoline was important, why we should use our oil life monitor to know when it is time to change our oil and many more things. 

- More good news from General Motors regarding Corvettes Sales of America's sports car continue to gain momentum as outlined in GM's monthly sales report for March 2011. 1,163 Corvettes were delivered last month, a 17.3% increase over the 955 Corvettes delivered during March 2010. This was the best sales month for Corvettes since July 2010 and the first 1,000+ selling month since October 2010. For the calendar year, Corvette sales were 2,839, a 16.7% increase over last year's 2,433 Corvettes sold January-March 2010.
- Kentucky Gives GM Tax Incentives to Keep Plant in Bowling Green Rumors have been circulating that GM is considering moving Corvette production to another plant as a consolidation and cost saving move. These rumors (similar rumors circulated in previous years) have not been confirmed or denied. The Lexington Herald-Leader is now reporting that GM is considering a new vehicle for its Bowling Green Assembly Plant and the Kentucky State Govt. stepped in to entice it with \$7.5 million in tax breaks. GM is mum on what vehicle, although the local union head there said he thinks it's the next generation of Corvette. "You never know from one generation to another if you'll get the opportunity to build it" he said. A plant spokesperson stated that other plants are being considered for the new vehicle, but declined to say if it was the next generation Corvette. Thanks to Gazette contributor Wade Stickels for this Heads-Up.
- This Just In General Motors is expected to announce this week that it will make a major investment in its Assembly Plant in Bowling Green. General Motors employees are expected to have a plant-wide meeting at 10 a.m. Wednesday, presumably to discuss the announcement. Read the entire story in the Bowling Green Daily News.
- Prized Documentation May be Available For Your Corvette If you own a 1962 1975 Corvette you may be able to get documentation now from the NCRS. With permission granted by the GM Heritage Center, the NCRS announced that it can now offer, solely to current NCRS members, certain information contained in the '62 '75 Corvette Month Car Shipped Reports. The Corvette Shipping Data Report consists of Chevy dealer code, dealer name and address and exact date that your Corvette was produced according to Chevy. Corvette Documentation Validation Service -


NCRS will compare any of your current GM documents to the GM records and if verification can be achieved, will establish the authenticity of your factory documents. Fees for either service is \$40. Check <a href="https://www.NCRS.org">www.NCRS.org</a> for more info.



David E. Davis, Jr. passed away last month at the age 80 years old. A former ad man for Chevrolet, he made his mark writing ad copy that told a story instead of focusing on the technical. After leaving Chevrolet, Davis went on to be a writer and later the editor for *Car and Driver*. He founded *Automobile magazine* in the mid-1980's and was the editorial director of *Motor Trend* in early 2000's. In 2009 was back at Car and Driver as a columnist. "Out-Of-This-World-Travel" is just one example of a David E. Davis Corvette ad that appeared in the Feb 1962 issues of Car and Driver and Road and Track magazine:

"We can't understand all the hullabaloo about manned space vehicles. We've had something out of this world since 1953. It carries two people in royal-suite comfort and it can take the measure of any distance you'd care to name, always delivering its passengers amazed and excited. We call it the Corvette and you'll call it the greatest car you ever owned. A test drive in a Corvette with the Fuel Injection V8 and four-speed box isn't a drive at all, it's an emotional experience. Pick your favorite bit of road, fasten your seatbelt, and place your right foot on that long narrow pedal on the right. Three shifts and a quarter of a mile later you've cleared out all the cobwebs and left all your troubles, not to mention everything else on the road, behind you. It's a good thing that all cars aren't this nice. Every good stretch of road in the

county would be jammed with 'em and we Corvette drivers would have to switch to sky diving or bird watching... " Our sentiments exactly!
