
We will be under a cover, but in the event of inclement weather we will move inside.





Representatives from Chevrolet, Mobil 1, Michelin and experts from technical automotive fields presented all you ever wanted to know about many topics. Then there were all the dinners, parties, beer trucks and other social happenings in case you got bored with getting smarter. Folks, you are truly missing out on maximizing the fun you can have with a Corvette if you don't take advantage of the NCM events.

Doug Fehan, Corvette Race Team Manager, made the best case yet for proceeding with the Motorsports Park. With his inputs and careful analysis of the business model, the park will be developed in four stages with the first stage being a complete road course that shows it can be self supporting when completed. It will take two million dollars to start moving dirt and to date almost \$600K has been raised. I only wish everyone could hear Doug explain what this park means to the race team, other teams, and the museum overall. I attempted to get a movement started several months ago for our members to buy an acre for the park but it has sort of fizzled out. Should we reconsider and make QCCC a real contributing member of the Motorsports Park?

Did you catch the latest test on the <u>allaboutvettes website</u>? They tested five spark plug brands in the same car, same dyno, and on the same day and the results were eye opening. The brands tested were NGK Platinum, Nology Silver, Pulstar Iridium, E3 Diamond Fire, and AC Delco Iridium. Long story short, there was an eight horsepower spread over the five and the winner was the AC Delco plug. You can pay more, but you can't buy better. 

Don't Forget the Queen City Corvette Club Adopt-A-Platoon Project

lead in coordinating the collection and shipping of supplies. Boxes will be available at the QCCC Monthly Meetings to collect items brought by the members. Please remember our troops while you are shopping and pick up items we can share with them to remind them they are not forgotten! Let's remember that Freedom is not Free."

Care Package Suggestions:

- Try to send at least one care package per month.
- Send the packages to the platoon point of contact. The items will be shared among troops.
- Theme packages are fun try sending packages for 4th of July, Halloween, Holidays, possibilities are endless.
- Please always include a card or letter with your package that has your logo, name and address on it so soldiers can send notes of thanks.
- Use postal service's flat rate boxes. You will be able to send heavier items at a flat rate.
- Put all items in plastic bags to prevent spillage from items that may open. The plastic bags will be reused by the soldiers.
- Cushion the items in the boxes with baby wipes. Baby wipes are popular with soldiers. Boxes should be full to prevent items from jostling around during shipment.
- Remember that the things we send will have to be carries and put in pockets. Please send small items.
- Postage stamps are not needed. Soldiers that are deployed can send letters back to the United States for free.
- Please do not send liquids or aerosol cans. Send dry drink mixes (pre-sweetened) instead.
- Please do not send items requiring a can opener.
- Please do not send articles of civilian clothing. Soldiers can wear only their uniforms.
- Alcohol, pork / pork products cannot be sent.
- Please do not give out the unit's APO address to others.



More adventures of the Queen City Corvette Club's hosting of the 1978 National Council of Corvette Clubs Annual Convention in Charlotte



Speed Events — Harry Jackson ran the *Tech Inspection* which, for the speeds we ran, was way short of good. Helmet, battery secure, shake the front wheels for "play", view the tires for wear and ask if lugs were tight, glance at belts and look for leaks. Were we safe? Nope!

Autocross was ³/₄ mile, basically the road course on the infield at Charlotte Motor Speedway. The big curve was hard to apex correctly and one car did go through the chain link retaining fence. He was from South Carolina. Not to worry, however, he told his insurance agent the car came off the trailer on the interstate so he got it fixed for free.

High Speed Event was backward down pit road, 180 around a barrel, down the front straight, onto the road course, off the road course onto turns 1, 2, 3 and 4 and through the timing lights at the start / finish line. Pure stock and modifieds clocked the lights inn the 135 MPH range while several race prepared Corvettes were pushing 160 MPH. Darrell Kirkley controlled it all from up in the Press Box high above the speedway. To his credit there were no incidents and it was a great event.

Rally was two hours and with the Boone Corvette Club helping it had a "mountain direction" but ended up at the speedway.

Drag Event was held at *Blaney Dragway* South of Camden, S.C. It also was incident free. Chairman Joey Hunter was one of our most avid racers so we were in good hands.

Concours, Cleanup and Tech were at the speedway which, looking back, made no sense as we then had to drive to Carowinds for the Corvette Show. But it went well with hundreds of great looking cars.

The biggest downside to hosting the convention was the difficulty of hosting and participating in the events. So, you missed out on some of the fun of being in the events. But the tenacity of our former QCCC members was amazing. Richard says we took in \$48,000 in revenues for the convention. Did we make a lot of money? Nope. Between paying for the entertainment, the rooms, the souvenirs and dividing what was left between all our neighboring Corvette Clubs, it was gone. But we sure had a great time and we put Charlotte on the map in the Corvette World. We know "Brillo" (Bill Cruthis) had 8 cars in his driveway from Illinois and they still talk today about racing Charlotte Motor Speedway.

Convention '78 – part of the great heritage of our club and another part of why we remain so strong and dedicated to the club and the marque.

Not to be outdone by others, however, QCCC would again host the *NCCC National Convention* in 1993 QCCC's 25th anniversary. Watch for that article soon.




This Month In Corvette History - June, 1953: Chevrolet begins production of the Corvette on a tiny assembly line in Flint, Michigan with the first car rolling off the assembly line on June 30th. Sticker price - just over \$3000. June 1, 1981: Production of Corvettes begins at a new plant in Bowling Green, KY. The first Corvette is a beige 1981 model. June 2, 1990: Ground-breaking begins on the national Corvette Museum. June 4, 1957: The Automobile manufacturer's Assn. passes a resolution recommending that member companies (including GM) not participate in auto racing. June 21, 1996: The last 4th Generation C4 Corvette (used since 1984) is produced. Over 300,000 cars were produced since 1984. June 26, 1994: The first C5 (1997 model year) alpha

test car rolls out of the assembly room. June, 1978: The movie "Corvette Summer" premieres, in Maumee, a suburb of Toledo, Ohio. Terry Michaelis, of T. Michaelis Corvette Supplies, Inc. arranged to have the world premiere there, and raffles off a 1978 Corvette Indy pace car replica. Plus, every Corvette in the country was invited to the party. The Corvette parade set a new mark in the Guinness Book of Records, at somewhere between 5000 and 7000 Corvettes. June, 1985: Group Lotus in Norfolk, England, proposes building a new engine for Chevrolet, who quickly approves the project. The engine would become the LT5 for the ZRI Corvette.



North Carolina Bill to Inform Consumers of Ethanol Content in Gasoline Signed into Law - Legislation (H.B. 187) requiring ethanol content labels on all pumps that dispense ethanol-blended gasoline has been signed into law by North Carolina Governor Bev Perdue. The new law requires these labels to indicate that the gasoline contains 10% or less ethanol or greater than 10% ethanol. Previously, retailers operating pumps dispensing ethanol-blended gasoline were not required to post labels regarding ethanol content. The new law also includes a provision allowing retailers to post labels that include more detailed information than required. Ethanol increases water formation in the fuel system, especially when the vehicle sits over a period of time. Under these conditions, formic acid is created which corrodes metals, plastics and rubber. This can lead to engine/parts failures and, potentially, safety hazards. Many products on the market, including older cars, special interest collector vehicles and historic vehicles, use materials that are incompatible with ethanol. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has been urged by several organizations to create national labeling requirements for ethanol blended gasoline that are placed as close as possible to the pump's product selection mechanism, but since such requirements are not currently in place, vehicle owners must rely on state labeling requirements for information about the gasoline they use in their vehicles. Auto enthusiasts have a right to know what blend of ethanol is going into their collector cars.


