QCCC is a non-profit club (501-C7) whose members all share a common appreciation and love of America's Sports Car – the Corvette. Dues and donations are not tax deductible. In addition to various social activities for members, QCCC raises money for and participates with various local charities. We strive to promote exciting, safe and fun ways to enjoy our Corvettes. We hold business meetings on the second Saturday of each month. Our monthly business meeting usually incorporates social time. Our socials are always fun and are focused around fellowship, food & drink. We've had swimming parties, bar-b-ques, cookouts, day cruises and weekend trips. We participate in / conduct mountain tours, holiday parades and several homecoming parades at local area high schools. We also support and participate in local auto shows and hold charity Corvette shows each year. After an initiation fee of \$7.00, club dues are only \$8.00 a month, per family, and are to be paid quarterly or annually. These dues go to cover the costs of running the club, mailing newsletters, and subsidizing the costs of our meetings. Club officers and supporting staff serve as volunteers.



An Update on Corvettes in Racing

Corvette Racing Wins Grand Prix of Mosport

Congratulations to *Corvette Racing* for winning the *Grand Prix of Mosport* on July 24th! *Oliver Gavin and Jan Magnussen* brought the # 4 Compuware Corvette C6.R to a 4.4 second win over the Ferrari 458 Italia of Jaime Melo and Toni Vilander. Tommy Milner and Olivier Beretta finished sixth in the # 3 Compuware Corvette C6.R after contact with the # 11 Porsche GTC knocked them out of contention on the high-speed Canadian circuit. Milner had fought his way to 4th before the incident. After qualifying sixth and eighth on Saturday, Corvette Racing rebounded with a strong race day setup that ultimately broke BMW's three-race winning streak. Gavin and Magnussen are in 2nd place in the overall ALMS GT standings behind the BMW team of Joey Hand and Dirk Mueller. The top 10 Mosport GT results are:

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past

"Trailer Queens and Bad Ass Rides"

The mid '70's saw 3 distinct groups in QCCC; avid racers, guys with show ponies and a third group that drew folks from the other two, social partiers. This is a summation of mostly the avid racers.

We are not sure when it started, but being located in Charlotte, there were many race tracks within a couple of hours that had a huge influence, as did the growth of NASCAR, SCCA, and Can Am. As racing caught fire in QCCC it became obvious that the sole purpose was to go as fast as you can until you win or break something. We attribute the influx of trailers to the break something part of the equation. It was not deemed wise to drive your car to Rockingham Speedway and drop the rear end in turn one as you were 2 hours from home. Enter the trailer brigade. We think it started with President Dave Morse whose C2 roadster was borderline street legal, even though he could not drive a lick (a.k.a. crash). Soon there were many

regular and borrowed trailers, Melvin Pace, Joey Hunter, Tommy Wood, Steve James, Billy Coates, and Harry Jackson, to name a few. Some we remember well were Brillo's (a.k.a Bill Cruthis) Silver I-Beam with mahogany floor, Darrel Kirkley with the black trailer with the checkered flag pattern floor, and of course, Dollar Bill Ingram had to have a rollback. Kirkley should get the award for best of show trailer and as usual with Darrel it was spotless and fancy.

Then things got out of control. A trailer was no good without fenders. So Bill headed off Plaza road to get some diamond plate fenders installed. As he veered off Harrisburg road he saw something over in the ball field to his left, yep it was his trailer that had come unhooked along with the safety chains. The trailer passed him and stopped over second base where he was informed kids were playing an hour ago.

As is human nature, bigger and better took over and the trailers kept getting fancier. They started with mobile home axles and wheels and tires, but soon were equipped with mag wheels and wide ovals. Now what was missing on an open race trailer was, you guessed it, places for tools, tires, etc. So Kirkley added a tire rack, while others went to fancier tow rigs, El Caminos, Vans and Pickups. Then of course the tow rig and trailer eventually had to match in color to the Corvette. So now weekend caravans went down the interstate to the race track with some Corvettes driving but many on a trailer. Bill trailered his '70 show pony to Knoxville, Washington D.C., Laurens S.C. and Charleston. Kirkley trailered Ingrams '67 big block to D.C. and Charleston where Dollar won his class and Brillo got shutout. A large group went to Charleston where

Ward Marsh from Knoxville won a '59 Corvette with his '69 maroon coupe which had no fluids in the engine, was pushed on and off the trailer. That was Brillo's last show, how do you compete with that? But we had fun all day watching the girl in the short pink shorts.

Shortly after getting the split window painted, Brillo, Ingram, and Shaverstein went to a small hill climb and autocross in Statesville. After one run it started raining so we loaded up and headed back. Bill, in a rush to get out of the rain, loaded the split too far forward. Note to trailer owners; don't screw up the tongue weight. As we started down I-40 and up a steep hill on a curve all the sudden Bill could see the side of his split window in the passenger side mirror then the other side in the driver side mirror. Whoa! All you can do is hang on and hope. Shaverstein said you could not drive a 10 penny nail up Brillo for a while after that.

That was it for Brillo and he sold the trailer soon after. Looking back, the most amazing part of all this is we were mostly all strapped for cash yet when it came to our Corvette there was no expense spared to travel in style. Racing--- it gets in your blood then in your wallet, but they sure were some good times. Just try pulling off for a pit stop at Burger King with 10 or 12 trailered Corvettes, you gotta be young.

Such is the way it was in QCCC circa 1976.

Loss of Corvette A Turning Point – In More Ways Than One

In June, 1981, Corvette production moved from St. Louis to Bowling Green, KY. The total impact of GM's decision would not be felt for decades.

QCCC Member Q. Gross lived in St. Louis when the announcement was made and during the relocation process. He ran across this article recently in **stltoday.com** and wants to share it with QCCC Members, along with his comments. It describes the challenges faced by combining many of the people and traditions of St. Louis into the small community of Bowling Green that many Corvette fans are unaware of. Thanks, Q., for a look back at this important time in Corvette production history.



I came across an interesting article published recently in the St. Louis Post Dispatch recalling when the announcement was made the Corvette plant was closing in St. Louis and moving to Bowling Green. It also tells the story of UAW workers who moved from STL to Bowling Green and difficulties encountered trying to fit into the new community of BG.

Having lived in St. Louis from 1977-1999 I can remember when the announcement was made and how the city didn't appear to be too upset the Corvette plant was moving. At that time, STL had Ford, Chrysler, Boeing, Anheiser-Bush, Brown Shoe Company (my former employer), Ralston Purina, and others that had plenty of factories cranking out endless goods. Now most of those factories and plants have closed along with the GM plant.



At least back then GM had the foresight to know the move would be good for Corvette production as well as the growth the museum has provided to the Bowling Green area. In my opinion, sometimes review of history is good to really appreciate how certain things have evolved and changed, even in modern times. *Q. Gross*

The original St. Louis plant was designed for 10,000 cars a year and Corvette production had been over 40,000 / year since 1976. The new Bowling Green plant would also feature more modern production capabilities. The last St. Louis

Corvettes were built on August 1, 1981 and on June 1, 1981 Bowling Green production started so for a couple of months Corvettes were built in two different places simultaneously.

"The Corvette emerged as its own statement; that a machine could also be art." "For 55 years, the Chevy Corvette has represented muscle and grace... and if today, many of us are rethinking our love for the automobile, this machine remains an expression of American fantasy." In 1958, **KETC TV** in St. Louis produced a short story about Corvette production in St. Louis for its **Living St. Louis** segment. These photos were snapped at the *Barrett-Jackson Las Vegas Auction* in September 2010 by QCCC Member Chris Wood. The pair of '81 Corvettes sold for \$300,000, which went to charity. The buyer then donated them back to be auctioned again at *B-J Scottsdale Auction*. The last St Louis '81 Corvette has just 4 original miles while the 1st Bowling Green '81 Corvette has just 14 original miles.



This Month In Corvette History – August 1958: Sales of the 1958 Corvette model reach 9168 units, enough to turn a profit for the Corvette for the first time. August, 1981: The last Corvette built in the St. Louis assembly plant rolls off the assembly line. August 1998: Dave Hill officially introduces the 1999 hardtop Corvette – priced at \$38,777. August 6, 2000: A Sports Car America Le Mans Series race is held at Mosport Int'l Raceway in Ontario. A Corvette C5-R driven by Ron Fellows and Andy Pilgrim finishes 2nd in GTS class, 0.353 seconds behind a Viper. August 10, 1993: The 1997 Corvette program begins Concept Alternatives Selection, in which virtually every part, procedure and design layout is presented, defended and decided on. The program provisionally passes, pending a two-week review of some components. August 24, 1963: The Corvette Grand Sport records its first victory, at Watkins Glen, driven by Richard Thompson.






Too Good To Leave Out
