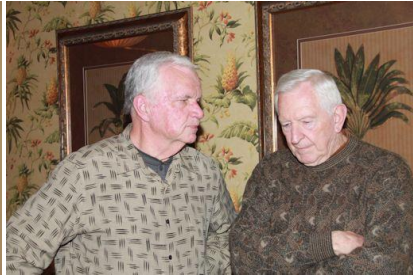
Why He's Called "Poot" Instead of "Lucky"

With the tire exposed, they limped back to Charlotte. Having no collision insurance, Rick started to piece his pride and joy back together. And after another four or five months and some volunteer help, the repairs were complete. Everyone in the club felt bad for Rick and all the time he had spent working on his car, so President Jim Whitley suggested that the club award him the "hard luck award" for the year. Nice gesture. Sure! We'll give him a trophy. *That* will make him feel better. Club member Al Starnes, who owned a trophy shop, was commissioned to make the awards for the year end banquet. Toms Tips



How to prepare your C-5 and C-6 for a Show and Shine Car Show

This segment covers the tire and wheel portion

Next we need to go to the tires. This is the area that most people don't clean good enough to win a trophy. The tires have to be cleaned with a good tire cleaner such as Wesley's Bleach White, Purple Stuff, or Simple Green. You need to use rubber gloves for this operation as the strong soaps will remove the oils from your skin. Most people think you are done at this point, wrong. Now you need to clean the rims. Corvettes have large flat surfaces behind the spokes and they are full of brake dust that is stuck like glue. To properly clean them you need to remove the wheels and tires from the car and most of us are not going to do this, so here are some tips you can use. There are a number of rim cleaners on the market that remove brake dust. The ones I use are Armor-All Wheel Cleaner or Turtle Wax Wheel Cleaner. Here is how I do it; first get a long brush such as a dryer vent cleaner brush or a long cloth duster about a foot long to scrub the flat surface of the rim. Rinse the rim with a hard spray of water, then spray the flat surface of the rim with the wheel cleaner of your choice, next scrub the rim with the long brush or duster removing the brake dust. You have to scrub it or it will not come off. Rinse the rim thoroughly with clean water, then I use a car mitt soaked in car wash soap and reach as far in the spokes as you can, cleaning behind the spokes and the brake calipers. This is a good time to wash the wheel wells and under the fender area making sure you rinse out any road gravel that may have collected in crevices. Now clean the outside of the rim and around the valve stem and lug nut area. They make a tool to clean the lug nut area that works well. It has a "T" handle and foam brush shaped to fit the lug nuts. After the rim is clean you must dry them to prevent water spots and finally you can dress the tire with a good tire dresser.

A good tip; when you have your tires replaced make arrangements with your tire dealer to allow you to wash your rims before they install new tires. I always take all my tire cleaning supplies and do the job at the dealers shop.

Next time we will cover the Engine compartment.
