QCCC is a non-profit club (501-C7) whose members all share a common appreciation and love of America's Sports Car – the Corvette. Dues and donations are not tax deductible. In addition to various social activities for members, QCCC raises money for and participates with various local charities. We strive to promote exciting, safe and fun ways to enjoy our Corvettes. They feel the 60th Anniversary Edition was responsible for Artic White to move up so high from past years. The following colors rank as follows. Torch Red at 14%, Night Race Blue at 11%, Crystal Red and Cyber Gray at 9%, Blade Silver at 7%, Velocity Yellow at 4%, Supersonic Blue at 2% and Inferno Orange at 1%. They noted that Inferno Orange orders were so low that the color was discontinued before the end of the year.





1. What was on the original Corvette emblem that had to be changed?

Right before the Corvette's release in 1953, Chevrolet had devised a plan to use a checkered flag and an American flag – the two things that best signified the Corvette – as a part of its original emblem. Well, 10 years prior to the Corvette's release, the U.S. passed the National Flag Code into federal law (Public Law 77- 623; chapter 435) and one of the provisions is that "the flag may not be used for advertising purposes."

For this reason, we can now only see the original emblem in the Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

2. What year and month was Zora on the cover of Hot Rod?

Corvette hero Zora Arkus- Duntov is featured on the cover of the December 1967 issue of HOT ROD. The Chevrolet executive was seated among a group of experimental Chevy power plants, over a banner headline screaming, "Inside Chevy's Secret Engines!" However his name is also listed on September 1967.

3. Who is Vinny?

A Corvette in a children's book.

4. How many chief engineers have there been for Corvette?

In the six decades Chevrolet has built the Corvette, only five men have served as its chief engineer. Zora Arkus-Duntov Dave McClellan Dave Hill Tom Wallace Tadge Juechter

5. What astronaut members had Corvettes?

Released in 1979, author Tom Wolfe's bestselling book, "The Right Stuff," recounted the beginnings of America's space program. The book's success sparked a revival of interest in the original Mercury 7 space heroes—and their Corvette adventures. Prior to that, astronaut- related Corvette stories were just kind of folklore... thanks to Tom Wolfe that the Corvette is today so solidly cemented to the legend of the pioneering astronauts. The 1995 movie "Apollo 13" featured two era- authentic Corvettes, one of them used in a key scene featuring Tom Hanks as astronaut Jim Lovell. The 2009 movie "Star Trek XI" opens in the year 2245, with a 12- year old James T. Kirk driving a 280- year old 1965 Corvette Sting Ray.

6. How many women are in the NCM Hall of Fame?

One.... *Betty Skelton Frankman....* (2001 Induction). Betty Skelton (Frankman), frequently referred to as the "first lady of firsts", worked side- by- side with some of the biggest names in Corvette, and established unbelievable records of her own in racing, aviation and automotive history. The first woman to be inducted in to the Corvette Hall of Fame was also the first woman in the world to drive racing cars to new records through the famous NASCAR measured mile on the sands of Daytona Beach. Skelton established records for Chevrolet behind the wheel of the Corvette, and appeared at major auto shows, as well as national ads and TV commercials. Working as the first woman technical narrator for GM at major shows, Skelton attended and participated in many major races where Corvettes were showcased. She was on the committee that originated the "Corvette News" currently "Corvette Quarterly", and worked as the agency's editor for many years. Harley Earl at the GM Tech Center along with Bill Mitchell designed a special Corvette for Betty in 1956- 57. Skelton drove the translucent gold Corvette to Daytona for Speed Week and then paced all the NASCAR races with it in 1957. In 1959, she was invited by NASA to become the first woman to undergo physical and psychological testing for the first seven astronauts, and was directly involved with arranging America's first astronauts to become Corvette Owners.

When President Keith asked me to write a monthly Gazette article about Membership I had some reservations. How much is there to say about membership? THE BEACH BECKONS

We probably need to make a little disclaimer here; the Vintage Gang was not, is not, and never will be politically correct. We make no excuses for that. We worked hard, played harder and, to our knowledge, we never hurt anyone. Although a lot of what we did in the 70's would be a felony today. Some folks today may have issues with the baby boomers but we know one thing for sure, cars and music we got right. If you do not think so compare a big block 67 and Elvis tunes to a new Honda and this rap noise of today. So if you are one of the pc police read no further it will only raise your blood pressure.

When you live this close to the beach, winter blues start setting in and the urge grows to get your toes in the ocean. So early in April around 1981 a group of 20 (10 corvettes) set out for North Myrtle. Keep in mind that, at that time, it was not illegal to have an open container inside the car, just not in the driver's hand. So it was our typical protocol to have a small amount of luggage behind the seats with a couple of changes of clothes and a small cooler with one or two six packs on ice. Our destination in North Myrtle was a vacation home with several bedrooms for Friday and Saturday nights (\$200). Brillo at the time had a 454 chocolate brown 74 with a luggage rack. Most cars carried food for the weekend, but Brillo had also neatly packed a large cooler with a lot of beer on ice and Spyder bungeed it on the luggage rack. The trip to the beach (about 2.5 hours as we drove then) was all 2 lanes and, as usual, there was always a Friday night train on the track blocking our path half way to the beach. Also, as usual, beer doing what beer does and getting processed in the body, it has to make an exit. As we waited for the train, all the cars emptied out and it was down the embankment to nature's toilet. Brillo was the last one out of the ditch and, to his surprise, the bungee and lid were off the cooler and the extra beer had been appropriated and divided up. This group could drink a lot of long neck Schlitz in a hurry.

Late Saturday afternoon it was customary to caravan down the Grand Strand and check out the action. This day we were cruisin' along when Barney Fife came out of nowhere and pulled us all over. We are not sure if he put his bullet in his gun. Sam Orender was in the lead car and he reported Barney asking for our parade permit. Duh! Seems Barney was a stickler for the rules and any group of 3 or more like cars traveling together was deemed a parade. So Barney made us all split up and go in different directions. He may not have been too good for the tourist trade but it was either split up or we followed him to jail.

Saturday night in North Myrtle in the early 80's was not as it is today. There were only 2 or 3 really nice restaurants so we decided to break into 2 groups of 10 in hopes of eating before midnight. Brillo, Dollar Bill, and Shaverstien went with Charlie outlaws group. Charlie was an electrician with arms of a blacksmith, bigger than most people's legs, so he presented a commanding appearance. As we got to the restaurant it was packed, so much you could not move in the bar, shoulder to shoulder. Charlie entered us on the waiting list as outlaw party of ten. After 15 minutes it was apparent that it would be a long night. Maybe midnight would be our eating time. About that time a waiter came pushing his way

thru the crowd hollering Johnson party of ten. You know what was coming. Charlie stepped right up towering over the waiter and said right here, Johnson party of 10. So we ate really early and had time to return to the beach for a beer blast.

What a great time and memory it was for those QCCC members. As Travis says driving a Corvette is the most fun you can have with you clothes on.

Chevrolet received the GT manufacturers' championship, and Corvette Racing won the GT team trophy - the second consecutive season for both. Antonio Garcia and Jan Magnussen, drivers of the No. 3 Compuware Chevrolet Corvette C6.R, were the recipients of the GT drivers' championship - the second for Magnussen and first for Garcia. Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner, last year's GT champions, walked away with third-place championship trophies in the driving category.

It was a doubly special night for Magnussen. The Dane won the ALMS' Most Popular Driver award for the second time in his career. American Le Mans Series fans voted on the honor through alms.com, the series' website.
