














Tales and Trails from Up Yonder

We visited a small brewery close by – Rivermen Brewery – who are in the process of building a big brewery/ restaurant to hold 200-300 people in downtown Belmont. We will have to go check it out once it is open. For dinner we sat outside at The String Bean Restaurant in downtown Belmont and finished out our day.

There are so many smaller towns in the surrounding areas to Charlotte who have interesting things to do and see. I will be trying to find some others we can take a day trip to and learn what they have to offer for us.


"A Real Good Time" -




