



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






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














Tales and Trails from Up Yonder



Thoughts of Changes

Since this month we are talking about changes, you won't believe all these.

After a member went through the rock drop on the way to the museum, and now his car will have to be totally repainted. I thought wow what a job. Then thinking back to the old days, we all did it. Think about changing the color of your Corvette. That includes the door jams and anything under the hood where the original paint is evident. Yet in the '70's color change was rampant. It meant taking all the chrome off the car, weather stripping, tail lights, head lights, C-2 and C-3 pods, bumpers, mirrors, antennae, door handles, door locks and anything else I am forgetting. In other words, to change the color of your Corvette was a huge undertaking. Now today we don't see anyone doing that. So let's go back to the late '60's and all thru the '70's and see how many cars QCCC went to the trouble of changing the color.

- 1. Earl Ferrell (founder) '66 coupe went from silver to maroon.
- 2. Robert Scognamillo's '67 convertible went from blue to gold, with an American flag painted on the deck lid.
- 3. Buzz Cagle's '67 coupe went from yellow to red.
- 4. Rick Wilson's '63 convertible went from blue to red
- 5. Travis Meredith's '68 convertible went from dark green to white.
- 6. Bill Henderson's '72 coupe went from orange to red then he added black splatter paint.
- 7. David Morse's '66 roadster went from blue to copper
- 8. Darrell Kirkley's '77 roadster went from green to orange
- 9. Joey Hunter's roadster went from primer to metallic red
- 10. Melvin Pace's '68 coupe went from red to burgundy

Then there were some that started and never got past the car being in primer.

- 11. Harry Jackson's '65 roadster went blue to primer
- 12. Billy Coates' C-3 we never saw other than primer
- 13. Ed Sloan's '66 coupe was always in primer
- 14. David Hunter's C-2 always in primer
- 15. Tim Hill's '65 always in primer
- 16. Bud Landacre's '65 always in primer

Then there were others that took the stock paint job and added some custom work.

- 17. Captain America a.k.a. Bill Murray put a band of stars and stripes on his car.
- 18. Pete Walther added some psychedelic bands of color to his white C-3.
- 19. Steve Burleyson added a Confederate look to his red car with white housing blue stars.

So for a Corvette club of about 30 members we had over 2/3 that either went to the trouble to strip their cars and prepare for a new color, or perhaps put the same color back on as I did with my '63 coupe. Can you imagine today if 2/3 of the club wanted to change the color of their cars by stripping and repainting them?

Back then the paint and quality control at the plant was so inferior that it would spider web under stress of cornering. Once you had all those "varicose veins" all over the fenders you just had to repaint. Since you were going to strip the car anyway, the common theme was what color would I rather have. I cannot imagine stripping the paint off my 2009 Z06 to make it a different color. But back in the day, that was the in thing to do. It is hard to realize that we really did that.

So who will be the first to change the color of their car today? Maybe one of those yellow primer cars. We loved the cars and the people back then, the same as today, but we had more energy and less wisdom and money than today's members. Wish you all could have been there. QCCC rocked then and now.

We are the best, but just thinking about all this work makes me need a nap now.




