



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

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








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LIFE IN THE FAST LANE

This issue we discuss My Top Five Jack Nicholson Movies

....year #49 of the Premier Corvette Club in the Southeast USA...

Check out the pillow with Jack's face on it and pay attention to the quote:

"I Am Who I Am, Your Approval is Not Needed."

That sounds just like Mr. Nicholson, doesn't it? As advertised in last month's article, here are my QCCC VP TOP FIVE JACK NICHOLSON MOVIES. Remember, these may not be his five highest grossing movies, or ones that sold the most tickets, or ones that won him awards. These are MY TOP FIVE JACK NICHOLSON MOVIES. Yours may be different; and he made so many great films, please allow me share my TOP FIVE.

But first; did you know that he's 80 years old? Born April 22, 1937. His 12 Academy Award Nominations make him the most nominated Male Actor in history. He's won two Best Actor Awards (*One Flew over the Cuckoo's Nest* and *As Good as It Gets*) and one Best Supporting Actor Award (Terms of Endearment). Film Critic Roger Ebert said of Mr. Nicholson, '*He creates a character so complete and so complex that we stop thinking about the movie and just watch to see what he'll do next.'*

#5 Batman From 1989, his role as the Joker speaks to the Ebert quote written above. I didn't care what happened in the movie or anything about the Batman, Nicholson's portrayal of the Joker stole the show. His line after you see his surgically-altered Joker face for the first time made the movie; "Wait til they get a load of me."

#4 A Few Good Men Filmed in 1992, Director Rob Reiner said of Jack that his level of

acting experience really made the other actors raise their game because Jack was The Man during filming. His portrayal of the hot-headed Marine Colonel was called '*spellbinding*'. Who doesn't remember the climactic scene with Tom Cruise when he tells Tom "YOU CAN'T HANDLE THE TRUTH!"

#3 As Good as It Gets Filmed in 1989 alongside Helen Hunt, Jack's character was

the obsessive-compulsive, mean- spirited but funny, romantic novelist named Melvin Udall. His character turned out to be real softy at heart. As the movie moves along and the Hunt character is expanded, Melvin quietly picks up the tab for the high medical bills that Hunt can't afford for her terribly sick child. Helen said that during the filming Jack '*treated her like a queen.*'

#2 Easy Rider from 1969 pushed Jack into the spotlight as one of the 'anti-hero actors',

being compared to James Cagney and Humphrey Bogart. He became the 'overnight number-one hero of the counter-culture movement'. All this was because the first actor picked to play the part of hard-drinking lawyer George Hanson, actor Rip Torn, got into an argument with actor/director Peter Fonda and quit the movie.

#1 One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest from 1975 cemented Jack as

one of the greatest actors of our age and of all time. His portrayal of the anti-authority patient Randall P. McMurphy has to be considered as one of Jack's biggest successes. Jack played him perfectly as Randle becomes the inspiring leader of the gang of patients in a mental institution. Included in the cast were two young actors in their first significant roles- Danny DeVito and Christopher Lloyd. Jack learned after the filming that he and Danny grew up in the same area of New Jersey and knew a lot of the same people. The film ruled the Academy Awards that year with nine nominations and won the top five, including Best Actor for Jack, his first. Once again, his performance was noted as *`transcending the screen'* and *`continually inspired the other actors'*.

So there you have, my TOP FIVE. There are so many others that can be mentioned, including Terms of Endearment (1983) with Shirley McLaine, The Bucket List (2007) with Morgan Freeman, The Postman Always Rings Twice (1981) with Jessica Lange, and The Shining (1980). Who doesn't remember that scene when he improvised the line '*Here's Johnny'* as he busts through the door and the crazy look in those eyes....

Quotes from Jack Nicholson:

Beer, it's the best damn drink in the world. With my sunglasses on, I'm Jack Nicholson. Without them, I'm fat and 6o years old. We live, we die, and the wheels on the bus go round and round. There's only two people in your life you should lie to...the police and your girlfriend. Don't ever give anybody your best advice, because they're not going to follow it.

I call those quotes First Class All the Way. Another of my favorites is "If it weren't for women, all men would have money."

Jack's quotes are pretty hard to top, so I'll close.

Remember,

There are only two classes- First class and no class.....David O. Selznick



From the Automotive Director's Desk

The Spring Autofair is now history. We had two beautiful days and everyone seemed to have a great time. Kudos to Bill Cruthis for best in show.

Also in the rear-view mirror is the NCM BASH. For those that weren't able to attend I'll give you a bit of an update. Kudos to Paul Mariano for locking in the Hilton Garden. The QCCC members pretty much own the lobby in the evening and I'm amazed the other jealous guests don't complain about the noise. If you are fairly new to QCCC, I suggest you attend the BASH next year, but sign up early!!! That event is a great way to meet your fellow enthusiasts.

Barb and I arrived Tuesday evening. Being the track-rat I am, I had volunteered to drive a lead car for the Wednesday lead-follow on the NCM MSP track. The Lead follow was staged at the east end of the paddock, and behind each lead car, five participants were sent out in their Corvettes to follow us. I drove for 6 solid hours in the white Museum Camaro. Danny, Norbert Jerry, and Brian-1 (I'm Brian-2) were the other lead drivers. Danny and Norbert are both racers, so the pace we set for the participants was sometimes a bit too much for them. The big boss, Matt Busby, gave us stern instructions; 85mph tops on the track and keep all your followers in your sight behind you. I went out with Danny for a check ride and Danny said, "sometimes we stretch the rules a bit in certain places, but if you do, make sure you can see all the followers.

OK, into the Camaro and out to the track with my first group of followers. They were quite a frisky bunch. The first in line follower had told me just before he started that he had been driving Corvettes a LONG LONG time and knew how to drive fast. All I said was "great you will have fun, then". Now the rule they were told is no closer than four car-lengths to the car ahead, including the lead car, and KEEP up!!!!. We left the staging area and drove down the hot grid from Gate E and onto the track at TURN 1 (T1). That dude was right on my donkey, about two car lengths, showing me what a great driver he was. Turn 2 is a fairly sharp right. I had spooled the Camaro up to about 65 between T1 and T2. Executing T2 correctly you drive track-left, brake hard, turn right and droppa-da-hammer. Well "That Dude", hereafter referred to as "Chuckle-Head" (C-H), was off line to the right and way too close to me. To compound the issue, the normal finish of T2 is to clip the Apex of the turn and "track out". Unfortunately, C-H had decided to carry too much speed, AND to enter the turn from center track. He suddenly saw the right door of the Camaro. C-H found out in a very instant how capable a C7 is. He showered down on the brake and I am sure got deep into the ABS and TCS on-board systems. I'm pretty sure C-H had a squishy event in his Depends.

C-H was much better behaved after that, and kept a decent follow distance. I rolled that little Camaro up to about 85 entering T5, but found out pretty quick that C-H and his fellow followers weren't up to taking that big sweeper so fast.

When my group entered T5, I radioed to Track Control so they could release Group 2. Danny was leading G2 and it wasn't long before he caught up to us. The next high speed section is T13-T16. I had my group at the designated 85 when Danny radioed me "Dial it up!! We're on your donkey". That turned out to be a mistake. I hit the big T16 sweeper at about 95. Looking back all my followers were all over the track. Track Control came on the radio" Danny dial it back!!!". (Ha-Ha, he got blamed for MY misdeed).

I gathered up my team with a slow run through the sink-hole turn and the chicanes leading to the front straight. I dialed up the Camaro with a pedal planted to the floorboard, leaving my followers lagging behind. C-H was holding everyone up. He was able to gather enough courage to keep up for the next two laps, and actually did a little better with "the line".

Later, C-H approached me when we took a pee break. " is that your Camaro?" was his question. "No, it belongs to the Museum I replied". "What kinda motor does that thing have?" C-H asked. " A 2.0 liter turbo" I replied. "Bull\$#?T he said. Well I wasn't B-S-ing him.

If you remember, I offered a ride around the track to anyone in the club. Norm Jungman and Richard Gwilt were the only suckers to take me up on the offer. I think they both had a good time, Norm always had a grin on his face. Feel free to ask Norm if he had fun.

Thursday and Friday, I spent banging my C5 around the track. I absolutely had my butt handed to me by the C7's that were participating. Even if I could close on one in a turn, I would see them disappear on the horizon in the straights, then see them in my mirror at the end of the session. The NCM-MSP and the C7 is a match made in track-heaven.

Thanks to all our QCCC friends that came to the track and cheered us on. Several of you scolded me and said "we waved at you, but you never waved back!!!" Well I tried. Have you ever stuck your hand out the window when the car is doing a buck-twenty? There is a reason they don't have roll-down windows on airplanes. If June-bug hit your hand at that speed, you would probably have a bullet-hole type wound through your palm.

The BASH is now a note in the history books. I hope you enjoyed the event as much as I did. See you at the next one!

A beautiful Grand Sport- 3LT and a Z06- 3LZ, with an ultimate-carbon fiber package, salutes 65 years of Corvette. Corvette will only make 650 models; 400 for the US and 250 for Europe. This Corvette will certainly be a Collectors Model for 2018.

If you missed the NCM Michelin Bash, you missed a good one. The seminars were some of the best ever presented and the Race Team Dinner was one to remember. Anything with Doug Fehan involved is sure to be entertaining. The Winners Circle ceremony was revised to speed up the awards which was appreciated by all. The only area of criticism was the entertainment presented at the Bash Banquet. The magicians were so bad it became comical. Needless to say, they will not be invited back. The biggest surprise of the event was that the entire club wasn't evicted from the hotel. I was astonished that the hotels next door didn't phone in a complaint. The lobby was loud, did I mention that the lobby was LOUD?

At long last the Go Carts are in and running at the Motorsports Park. The track is in place and final tweaks on it and the timing system are being worked out. Next time at the museum, be sure and check them out.

I'm sure most everyone has heard by now about the re-tooling going on at the assembly plant and the impact on deliveries and tours. The last day for plant tours is June 16 and they will not resume for approximately eighteen (18) months. When they do resume, they are expected to be greatly improved and expanded. If you were planning on ordering a new 2018 model you have until June 12 to get it placed for a standard delivery. Any orders after that date will result in a delivery in November or later. This delay is due to the sixteen week shut down for installing the new assembly flow.

The NCM Board of Directors got a tour of the new paint shop and I can report – it is a paint shop and boy is it huge. There will be a mixture of panels from both the old and new paint shops until sometime next summer when the swap over will be completed. Not to worry though, the panels will not get mixed and matched on the cars as all cars will receive panels painted from one shop or the other for consistency's sake.

The previously reported Suppliers Pricing on GM vehicles for NCM members will not last forever. The plan is now to terminate it on December 31, 2017 but there is a possibility it could be extended. However, if you do plan on a new GM vehicle soon, I would not tarry.

Tickets are now on sale for the races at VIR, Atlanta, and Daytona. If you plan on going to one of these IMSA races to root for the Corvette Racing Team, I suggest you don't delay as the Corvette Corrals sell out quickly.



Some are pretty to look at, and done up pretty bold Others you can work in, on Corvettes that are old. They house history and mystery, With oil on the floor, Now's your chance to see, what's inside the door.

QCCC Garage/Corvette Cave of the Month for May

This garage and house have an interesting history. The house is the one Darrell grew up in..... sorta. As his parents reached the dreaded nursing home age, Darrell had the opportunity to update the home he was raised in. We won't delve into the complexity of that other than to cover the garage and bar area. The garage had always been a two car carport with the typical awning roof. There was a concrete slab on the far side of the carport. A trend we will find in these entries is that many did most of the work themselves. This is especially true for Darrell and Rosie's home. First, he took down the carport and made it all into a 3 car garage. That finished product has a black floor which only Darrell could keep clean. Then the walls are laguna blue, (strange for a confirmed lover of black and red Corvettes), half way up with the top being white. He did have blue tracer lights around the ceiling at one time. He has a computer desk and TV in front of a lighted recessed C7 emblem that is about 4 feet in size. The comment was made by Travis that it only needs a stripper pole to become a nightclub. In order to keep the daily driver and work van out of the Corvette garage, a second garage was built which has a door in the back that opens to let you drive out on ramps that are several feet above ground. This allows for easy oil changes without a lift or jack. To top it off you can go inside to the bar area which he also built himself. A complete enclosed sunroom with pool table and bar which has an aviation theme. Outside, he added a deck with a gas grill mounted in the table. To grab your attention there is a fish pond which he has fabricated curved poles covered by netting. This is all attached in the fall so that leaves and other debris does not get into the pond. When you realize the structural issues Darrell dealt with to accomplish this very nice garage and home you realize how talented many of our group are. So enjoy the pictures and keep this one in mind as I hope later in the year to make some day trips so you may see some of these garages.
