



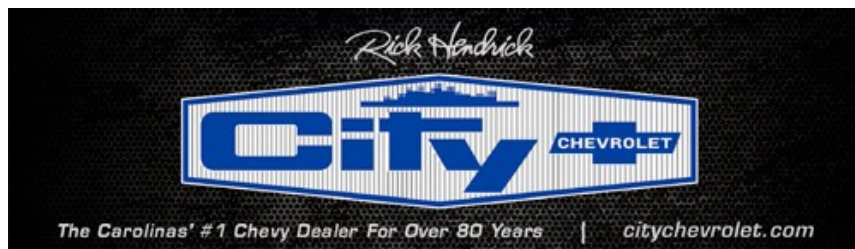

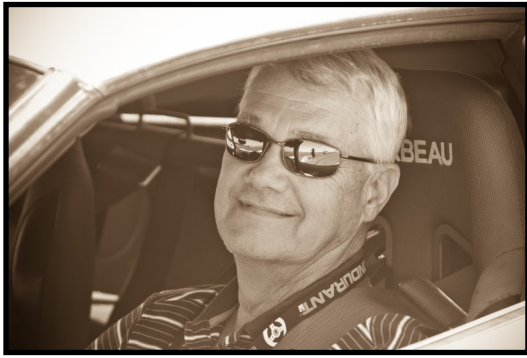

Congratulations to **Norm and Joyce Lontz** on their tenth anniversary as NCM members. Your support is greatly appreciated.

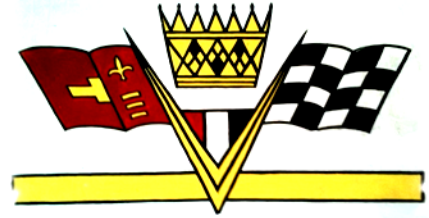

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past

Animal House 3

At the car show this month I got a chance to visit with one of our newer couples and excited enthusiasts. In talking with Greg and Gloria Stewart our conversation reverted to the old days with the QCCC Corvette Clubhouse on the corner of Westover and Independence. That night I really gave all that thought some serious time. What is the purpose of a clubhouse, what would be the important history of it? I started thinking about Spanky, Alfalfa, and the Little Rascals and how they had a clubhouse which was all the boys until pretty little Darla came along. They even had their own soap box racer. That reminded me of our own ladies right to vote passing in 1976. Next I thought of my own fraternity house in college where only members were welcome. The same struggles to keep it clean and everything working. We had bands in the basement for parties and it was the same watering hole as the clubhouse. Many old movies were centered around fraternity and sorority houses. There were also many movies made about outlaw motorcycle gang clubhouses which did not shed a good light on the others. Then, of course, there were multitudes of car club clubhouses starting on the left coast during the early hot rodding and drag racing days. So to say the clubhouses have not had a large impact on the American culture over the years would be an error.

Our clubhouse showed some traits from all of the above. It was our gathering hole. Just like the Monday and Wednesday night dinners, except you could come and go as you wished. We did not have a secret word to get in. Only the house committee chairman and the President had a key to the door. As I was house committee chairman in 1975 I spent a great deal of time there cleaning up and making sure folks could get in. I have described the house in earlier articles so here is just a brief description. A two bedroom brick ranch about 1100 square feet. Living room/dining room combo held a vinyl couch and a juke box, the rest empty for dancing. A large kitchen, one back bedroom which held our timing equipment, cones, posters, banners and assorted junk. (This room could be filmed on the Hoarders TV show.) The other back bedroom we made into a nice bar. No seating, just a bar. There was a narrow, maybe 20 inch wide, staircase leading to the attic where our meetings were held. Then the dreaded toilet. What a mess. It held a small filthy tub, equally bad stool with a loose seat, and a pedestal sink. The linoleum floor would not scrub clean with any of the products back then. The same for the sink, tub and stool. It had a very flimsy lock. My biggest problem as chairman was explaining to the ladies that I fixed the lock every month and somehow it would be broken on meeting nites. Remember we were 25 years old.

So the watering hole served a lot of purposes. You could come on Wednesday nites and drink all the 50 cent beer you wanted. You could spill it on the floor. You could talk cars all nite, or women, or politics, or anything. It was our monthly meeting where all attended since there was no e-mail, or blasts, or web sites, or cell phones. The meeting was how you found out what was going on.

The clubhouse is where you bonded. This is what gave me the purpose of this article. I was telling Greg and Gloria the same thoughts I expressed at the 6th year anniversary party of Road Runners Corvettes last week. We did not have the issue of new folks coming around, joining then quietly slipping away. The bar in the clubhouse was where we got to know the new folks and they got to learn about us. The same happened to me in 1974, after being in Charlotte less than a week, I found myself at the bar in the clubhouse drinking beer with Travis, Darrell, and Bill. Getting to know new members in a group of 350 folks is a daunting task. We have tried many methods with most fading away. This is not good, as we fail to hang onto some super folks.

We lost the clubhouse in 1979-80 when the rent was raised. That started a very difficult few years. Once we lost our gathering spot, it was hard to get and keep new members. We would meet at apartment complex clubhouse, member's homes etc. We pulled through with heavy racing in the 80's. Then in the early 90's we began the Jane and Eddie Burt era and QCCC was again secure.

With the clubhouse, we were Spanky's Little Rascals Our Gang. We were very much like a fraternity house, no Mustangs or Porchei allowed. We were definitely like a Southern California Car Club except we had no place there to work on our cars. And in some cases we were really like an Outlaw Motor Cycle gang clubhouse. (Here I am thinking of our nasty toilet.)

Those of us around back then miss the old place and have a lot of memories, but maybe we are missing the most important part and that would be the ability to meet and greet new folks easily, and they stayed. Maybe next year it is time to work on this issue. We won't have the clubhouse, but there have to be ways we have not explored. Greg, Gloria and I will be thinking about a solution. As QCCC grows we keep making new memories to add to these old ones. We celebrate 50 years of memories next August.

The charity committee supplied us with a well deserving recipient for our efforts and the 50/50 raffle collected \$1,929.00 at the show. This committee worked hard all year long in preparation for the event. The silent auction committee outdid themselves again this year. They had over 200 items up for auction and spent months gathering, assembling and delivering all these items to the show. Some special thanks go out to all our club members who were involved with the goody bags, both in collecting items and helping assemble the bags. The show could not have happened without our event liaison person and the hospitality team. What a job they did from distributing goody bags, handing out club t-shirts, Corvette Racing t-shirts, helping the DJ, dash plaques and much more.
