More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



Trailers for Sale or Rent

Nearing the middle of the decade of the 70's, after getting involved with the National Council of Corvette Clubs, racing rapidly took a tight hold on the membership. It was fun, not terribly expensive and the NCCC events were opportunities we never dreamed we would have.

Once this process started, the club cars started changing from nice drivers, show cars, and street racers, to stripped down, lighter Corvettes with side exhaust or headers to unbolt for the track. Wider fender flares and tires came next. Once the cars became less street able it was only a matter of time before members started finding old trailers to tow their hot rod to the speed events. Most of the trailers were previously used to haul dirt track cars around. A lot of them were home built starting with a couple of mobile home axels. Welding a small steel frame then some boards on top and walah. Many had no fenders over the wheels and most had wood which went unpainted and soon became rotten. These were plentiful and cheap as many a racer has found the cost more than their ability to pay and they folded up their tents.

I remember David Morse had a trailer because every racing weekend he hit something and the car was not going anywhere under its own power. Thus his CB handle "Captain Crash". Harry Jackson ended up with a trailer, as did Travis Meredith, Billy Coates, Darrell Kirkley, Melvin Pace, and Brillo Pad. Of note, Bill Ingram, whose hobby has always been making money, did not own a trailer at this time. Instead he would talk Darrell into putting Bill's car on Darrell's trailer. Later Dollar Bill had his own rollback for use in his Southern Imports business. Darrell then started a new fashion trend in trailers. He painted the trailer black, added a tire rack on the front. Then he covered the floor with the black and white look of a checkered flag. The result was very eye catching when hooked to his bronze El Camino. Before long others were trying to keep pace with Darrell, myself included. Having visited a lady in Winston Salem I decided with my big brain to get out of the northern non-car-loving winters. I decided with my small brain to move near the lady, so Charlotte was the destination. Only one of these was a good idea, you guess which one. So I had one week to find a trailer to bring the split window coupe 860 miles thru the mountains. A friend found an old dirt track trailer which was formerly used to carry a D-9 dozer around. It had no brakes, no lights, rotten boards on the deck, but it was cheap. Central Illinois Corvette folks added breaks, wired lights and made sure the '63 would not fall thru the deck. The base of the trailer was 2 mobile home axels under a frame of 8 inch I-beam steel. The Vintage folks still get quite a chuckle seeing the vision of my '74 Ranchero pulling that trailer which, with the car, outweighed the Ranchero by several thousand pounds. Trying to keep pace with Darrell is tough. My Ranchero was blue (of course) with a silver stripe on the side. So I added diamond plate fenders then sprayed the trailer frame and fenders with chrome spray paint. I added new treated lumber to the deck and stained it a rich mahogany.

When you put the Daytona Blue '63 or the Cortez Silver '70 on the trailer it made a handsome rig. And so it became a trend. Upgrade your tow rig and trailer so your ride made quite a statement.

There are many stories about the QCCC trailers. Including Brillo Pad almost losing his with the '63 mounted, coming back from an autocross in Statesville, due to loading too far forward and messing up the tongue weight. Spiderman Henderson asking Trav to carry his blown engine '72 back from Greer Dragway, while Spider drove Trav's '68 with open headers and no street tag back. Melvin Pace using his trailer as a jack so he could cut his already widened fenders even wider to swap wheels with George McLeod for a grudge race, the trip to Arlington, Virginia with Brillo Pad and Kirkley getting separated. One day going to get fenders a trailer become unhooked and pulled alongside the tow vehicle. Some of the happenings need to remain untold. Look under the archives of our old newsletters that Bob has under the website toolbox to read of some of all of these adventures. One thing is certain. We changed from a caravan of Corvettes heading to a speed event into a caravan of half Corvettes and half fancy tow rigs and Corvettes. Maybe one of the most memorable was the tow to race on Myrtle Beach. Money was tight for most all of us, but what we had was spent on the Corvettes or tow vehicles and trailers. It was a great time to be in QCCC.


