

Plus 1963 was the creation of one of my all-time favorite Corvettes.....the original and amazing racing CORVETTE GRAND SPORTS!!

It was decided that a caravan would be organized every five years to celebrate the NCM opening but under more controlled conditions. With next year being the 25th it is expected to be an event with around twelve thousand Corvettes and an overwhelming number of enthusiasts pouring into Bowling Green. The caravan will be on the Labor Day Weekend so if you are still employed, plan your 2019 vacation for that date. 

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



With Age Comes Wisdom

As we voted in our newest members at the Valentine Party, something clicked in my memory so Travis and I discussed it.

As the by-laws state, a 10 % negative vote turns down any new member. I think there were 106 members voting last Saturday, therefore 11 negative votes would have turned down those couples. Keep in mind that same 10% was the level and back in the 70's we only had 25 – 30 members. Plus not all members attended each meeting. Therefore negative votes from 1,2, or 3 members could decline someone entry.

I looked up the definition of black balling. It is Greek starting its origin from “to have backlash.” That eventually turned into blackballing. It is good to see we have left all of prejudices of our youth. As now we know that all Corvette owners bring knowledge, not only of their Corvette, but also of their lifetime experiences. We have grown into such a talented and interesting group.

Travis deserves a lot of credit for having the burden of informing the candidate that they were rejected. I suppose every organization has its dark secrets and these two nights would be ours.

On the bright side, we are older and wiser, these days. We have learned a lot in the last 40 years and our membership realizes the value of every one of us. Somewhere along our path we went to a show of hands and the box of marbles went away.


