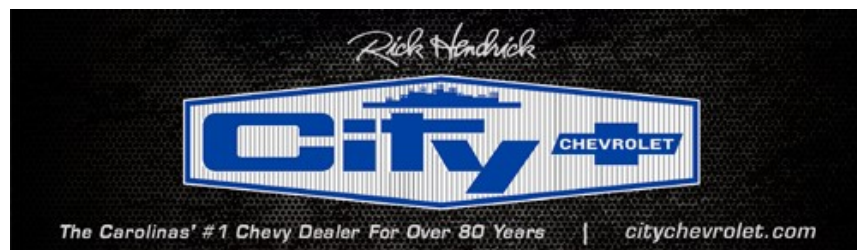

On Sept 9th Antonio Garcia and Jan Magnussen placed 3rd in class Sunday at Laguna Seca and will head to the finale of the IMSA Championship with the Driver and Team points lead in the GT Le Mans (GTLM) category. The #4 team finished 5th.

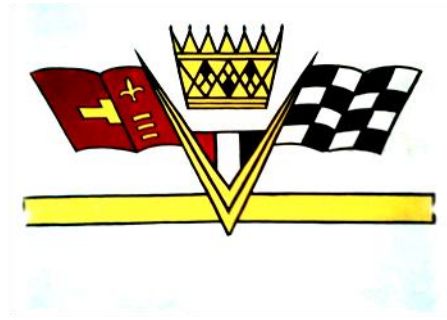

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



Effort

This month is about effort. A small word with big impact.

Add American to effort and you changed the world. Add Corvette to effort and you get QCCC. I hate some missed the 50th anniversary party last Saturday. It was a top 3 day for QCCC and maybe it was tops. Great job by Paul and the Board, and how about that slideshow. Now that was effort.

Let's go back to 2003. One person had a huge vision to bring a major Corvette event to Charlotte. As you read through this notice what a class event it was. They took their idea to the board and were told no, we could not afford the event which may have had some unknown costs. Undaunted and with QCCC effort, they started pursuing funds. First a call was made to GM in Detroit and Chevrolet. Now that is strong. Surprisingly GM liked the concept and wrote a check for \$7,000. With that money in hand they approached City Chevrolet and wal-ah another \$3,000. (Stop and think a minute, one person was able to persuade these huge organizations to hand over \$10,000. A really strong effort.) Eventually other merchants wanted in and the following contributed: Sam's Mart, Anheuser Busch, Miller and Miller Attorneys, MBV Corvette Specialties, Templin Associates, Stoners, Eckler, Zip Products, Mid-America, Meguiar's, Vector Shirts and Garage Tek. A very impressive group. With money in hand they formed a committee to plan the weekend. The Westin Hotel in downtown was the host. Out of town Corvetters checked in on Friday. Saturday morning the committee planned a tour of Charlotte, headed up by Robert Morgan. At noon they were at Dale Earnhardt Incorporated Race Shop for an inside tour of the facility. DEI put on a great lunch and they ate in the pit crew's dining room. A great chef made for a great lunch. A photo was taken with about 46 Corvettes in the curved drive in front of DEI. Then Saturday afternoon it was on to tour the Hendrick Shops which also provided some inside looks. Saturday evening was the banquet at the Westin. Plans were to have Andy Pilgrim as the guest speaker. Unfortunately he got tied up with the race team and could not come. Driver Frank Freon spoke and the man who later saved Corvette between C-4 and C-5, Jim Perkins, also spoke to the crowd. Each table had a centerpiece of a 1/18 scale C-5 by Maisto. With 15 tables they bought all of these that Costco had. One person at each tablet won the centerpiece. Jim Perkins won for his table. After he autographed the car he raffled it off. The winning bid was \$500. The group awoke Sunday for their drive back home. There is no record of attendance but we think over 100 people were there.

Think about the effort this took. To get the money, the hotel bookings, and to pack Saturday full with a tour of downtown, tour of Earnhardt's, tour of Hendrick, then a dinner banquet with

nationally known figures. That is what our QCCC family does. We just roll up our sleeves and make it happen.

Now for the rest of the story as Paul Harvey would say:

And the person who had this dream and made it all come true was:

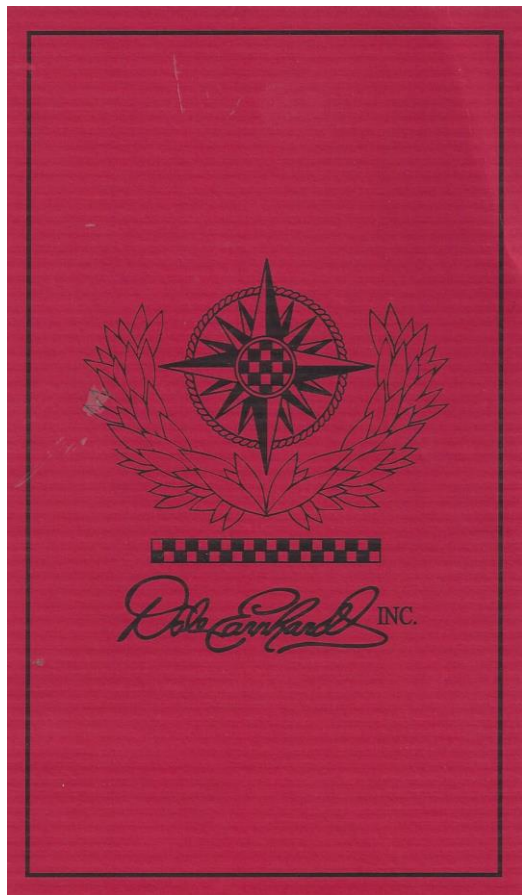
