

Also thank you to all the volunteers that have signed up for specific assignments. We still need people to help with parking, and judges. Let Tommy know which job you can help with.


We are 60 days away, and many pieces are already in place to make this event a truly memorable one. This will continue the QCCC tradition of making this car show/event bigger and better each year.

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



Maturity and Evolution

As we approach QCCC's 51's year and I reflect on my first joining the club 49 years ago, I have witnessed an amazing evolution and maturity in both the Corvette and the club.

I purchased my first Corvette in May of 1970 and joined QCCC late that year. The Corvettes were, by today's standard, crude and so were the club members.

Remember, QCCC was formed in 1968 by two Corvette buddies, a neighbor and a new acquaintance, who enjoyed cruising thru Shoney's and Bar B Q King. These four guys were in their early-mid twenties at the time. In fact, it wasn't until the late 70's before the average age of QCCC members reached the ripe old age of 30. So, without crunching numbers on the average age of the club's current membership, I think we all agree that the membership has matured.

I left the club in the early 80's to raise a family and run a business. But frankly, I didn't see a car at that time that lit my fire. Even though I had hung on to my 64 Coupe, I sat on the sideline of the Corvette hobby, very uninspired by the cars being produced at that time. When the C5 came out I was impressed with the improvements but still didn't have the urge to buy one until I drove a C5 Z06. GM had finally built something that I really wanted, and I bought one. The evolution of the C5 was remarkable and I believe saved the Corvette from extinction. And it brought this Corvette enthusiast back into the club. The improvements to the C6 and C7 proved that GM had their act together and sales reflected that. The majority of QCCC's members and Corvette buyers today are baby boomers who grew up in the car culture age with owning your dream car becoming a reality. GM has given us what we want by continuing to refine the Corvette with each generation. It has evolved into a world class car.

Of course, there are those oldies like myself who hang on to the past and keep the older classics and enjoy driving, showing and bragging about what it was like in "the good old days".

But time is flying by and who is going to replace us when we are gone? It seems the younger generation of car guys' expectations have changed from ours and I think the radical changes in the C8 Corvette reflects that. I believe GM is doing all they can to attract younger buyers and I truly hope they are successful. I am also struck with the fact that those who enjoy actually driving our cars had better take advantage of it while it is still an option. It appears driver-less cars will happen sooner than we ever expected.

I am very proud I had the opportunity to experience the Corvette hobby in the 70's thru today, to experience the evolution and maturity that has brought us to this milestone: A brand new adventure: the C8 Corvette.


