
We had 218 guest Corvettes and our Judging Team judged 153 of them. We also had 95 QCCC Corvettes and another 20 QCCC support vehicles. QCCC had a staggering 149 people helping with the show. Bloomington judged 33 Corvettes and between the Gold display, Hendrick Corvettes and other Corvettes on the premises, we had a total of 413 Corvettes at our show. What a wonderful job everyone did with such a large number of Corvettes. We had approximately 350 tours through the Heritage Center and another 214 tours through the Race Shops. We donated \$14,100.00 to the Hendrick Family Foundation and Mr. Hendrick said it would be used to feed 6,000 people in need at Thanksgiving. QCCC all of you are part of this. We also gave \$4,500.00 to The Wings of Eagles and \$4,500.00 to Team Driving Solution.

The event staff, Hendrick Motorsport and City Chevrolet realize the work and effort that all of you put into this event. We also know that you had little time to view the show, so we are going to have a QCCC day at Hendrick Motorsport and our club will be able to have a private viewing of the Heritage Center and Rick Hendrick's private collection. We will have an entrance fee as Mr. Hendrick charges everyone that tours the facility and all the money will go to the Hendrick Family Foundation. We will have more information about this at the next club meeting.

Everywhere you looked the yellow shirts were busy making sure no detail was overlooked.

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



#### Leaders are like eagles, they don't flock, you find them one at a time.

Last year we hit a milestone of 50 years since the inception in the minds of 3 young men who owned Corvettes. It took everyone to get here. Leaders and followers are like the chicken and the egg. Good leadership leads to good followers. Good followers without good leadership will not work. A great friend to QCCC, Bill Miller, started Road Runners Corvettes, told me once that QCCC would always be successful because we had great leadership in our Presidents. We have had 37 Presidents. I am vaguely familiar with some and very familiar with others, to account for 18 for the 37. Today and for the next couple of months I want to praise these guys for their leadership. They have all made a difference and held their flock together thru prosperous and lean times.

1. 1968,1969 Earl Ferrell: One of the original three who decided to start a Corvette club in 1968. Earl was totally a Corvette guy. Lest anyone think it is easy to start a Corvette club, it is seriously hard work. Earl had a 66 coupe and also a second C-2. I remember him at the first Corvette – Porsche Challenge at the speedway. Being the first President is a huge challenge. You start with 3 members so you can not lose anyone, there is no margin for error. Earl's wife Martha to this day has both of his Corvettes stored in a safe place. QCCC was so much a part of their lives that Martha still grieves for her husband. Memories of QCCC and the old days are always on her mind. These folks were Corvette lovers, top shelf. Earl's challenge which he succeeded were to wing it and leave a trail for the next guy. As we plan the year now, we have meeting places lined up and we have a lot of social and automotive lined up. Often we just follow what we did last year. Remember Earl had a blank canvass, there was no last year to work off of, and you had to grow the numbers. For these reasons Earl Ferrell remains the father of QCCC, he is our Zora. Sadly we lost Earl to cancer before the decade was out.

2. 1972, 1976 Travis Meredith. I arrived in 1974 so I missed Trav's first year but I was his treasurer in 1976. Trav came along at a very good time. These were major growth years and many changes occurred under his watch. There is just something special about him. He is cut from the block of the old storyteller. Many of his stories have been documented in former vintage articles. Trav had the level of calmness needed to keep us on the rails. During his tenure he and others approached the Charlotte Speedway for our speed events. I don't know how they did it, but they got the speedway for \$200 (the whole place) for weekend use. There was no Petty Driving School. We just stopped by the back gate and got the key from the watchman that lived in the trailer. He would just say lock her up when you are done. Both Darrell Kirkley and Trav were on a first name basis. We used the speedway for the 1975 South East Sectional race for all Corvette clubs in the south east. Then we held the Corvette-Porsche Challenges in 1975,1976,1977.

Darrell Kirkley was in charge of the High Speed Event at CMS during the national convention in 1978. You can tell how often we had \$200. In 1976 Trav was President when the ladies decided they should have a vote. Until then only male members voted. As much as this seems a no brainer today, back then it was a close vote with some tempers getting out of hand. He also presided over the only black ball we have ever had during membership request. Trav had to be the one to tell the prospective member that he was not voted in. I can't think of any member that would have attained so much during the tumultuous times. I have never seen Travis get mad at anyone. His calm demeanor was a good match and gained him a lot of respect. Keep in mind during all of this he was hand writing and typing a monthly newsletter which had to be addressed and mailed. Plus he was working at Charlotte Body Shop and he and Sharon had 3 little Merediths to raise. Sharon was great help with the newsletter. I submit that if Earl Ferrell was the igniter of QCCC, the fire would had burned out without Trav and Sharon doing all they did.

3. 1973 Jim Whitley. I missed Jim's presidency but I have heard a lot of the stories. Most notably was the acquisition of the clubhouse. Jim knew some of the real estate salesmen back then. Buzz Cagle had a detail shop across the street from the future clubhouse. Jim and Buzz were talking about QCCC obtaining a clubhouse to rent when Buzz said he had heard the house across the street was for rent. There was no sign but Buzz knew which company had it. Jim knew the man in charge of finding a renter. Jim was able to get it rented for QCCC for \$125 a month. We had 25 members paying \$5 a month so we just could pay the rent. So we built a bar in the back bedroom with a keg on tap. <u>Beer was our one way to pay for utilities</u>, <u>upkeep etc</u>. Beer was 50 cents for a large dixie cup full. Jim was also an easy going man. He attended Trav and Sharon's 50 year wedding reception and former President Tommy Mitchem's (1975) funeral. I believe Jim still lives in the Sherrell's Ford area. <u>We had the clubhouse from early 1973 until almost 1980.</u> It was the watering hole on Independence Blvd. If you drove by and there was a Corvette in the front yard you knew you would not be drinking alone. The clubhouse held us together until the next rough patch in the late 80"s.



These three fellows were so important for QCCC to grow and survive some hard times. We made it thru the gas shortage and government requirements to add the clunky 5 mph crash resistant bumpers, and thru the Carter years. If it were not for them I fully believe we would have folded.


