

We hold business meetings on the second Saturday of each month. Our monthly business meeting usually incorporates social time. 

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



The Next Three Leaders Made a Big Difference

1. President Tommy Mitchem 1974.

Tommy was born a natural comedian. He was like the Ever Ready Bunny. He packed so much energy in about 5 foot 4 inches, always smiling, laughing, and generally someone you enjoyed being around. In keeping with the times he had his hair done in afro. Seems like we were all copying the Mod Squad "Link" character. Tommy never met a stranger and that was good for OCCC. Put him together with Wayne Marlowe and it was the comedy hour. Tommy's easy going, attitude got tested early in 1975. Charlotte Motor Speedway at the time had an enormous pit that took up the whole left side of the infield. This crater was there because they took the dirt out of it to build the high banks of the track. Tommy and a few others met with the speedway officials and negotiated for OCCC to rent the entire speedway for \$200 for a whole weekend for 1975. Page 2: Of course, we were 25 guys who spent all their paycheck on their Corvettes, so we struggled to come up with \$200. The South East Sectional (all Corvette Clubs in the South East) was scheduled for the fall of 1975. So with no money in the treasury Tommy revisited with speedway officials. He agreed that we would, after the fall Nascar race, clean the entire right side of the infield in exchange for use of the track for an entire weekend. Keep in mind we had 25 couples with shovels and rakes, we had Danny Shaver's pick up, and the speedway let us use their end-loader. So it was scoop the poop into the end-loader, then dump in the pickup, then drive to the pit and scoop it all out of the truck into the pit. Shaver's truck never smelled the same again. The next time you are at Auto Fair or at a race, stop for a minute and think about the task that we undertook. 25 couples. I tell you $\frac{1}{2}$ of the infield was a lot to do. When the campers get ready to leave, they just pull the plug and all the "stuff" they won't take home goes on the ground. Vienny weiners were popular. Basically all of their trash was left behind. Needless to say after about 2 hours, Tommy had a full scale mutiny on his hands. Page 3: A lot of the group said they thought we should call it quits. One of the few times I ever saw Tommy mad, and he rained down upon us. He gathered us around and sternly verbally let us know that QCCC does not quit. He said we will do this job if it takes a month, but nobody goes home until it is done. Think about the monumental job we were facing. Tommy drew a line in the dirt and you could tell now was not the time to challenge him. We dug in and were done by about 4:30 that Saturday. Even exhausted as we were, the speedway was now ours. So from 4:30 to dark (damn daylight savings time) we had a great time. Unhooked the headers and cut loose. Tommy's one act made us a much closer knit group. Only 4 of today's members were there for that chore. I believe each felt like QCCC made a major step closer to our dedicated group we have today. You had some pretty tough ancestors. In the spring Tommy was tasked with planning the first Corvette/Porsche Challenge at the speedway, 100 of each make ran the autocross which was a blast. Along with running the regular duties of President, Tommy had those two major issues. The Vintage gang will always remember page 4: Tommy standing on a stool with a drink in one hand and a cigarette in the other and always a big smile. Sadly Tommy passed last year and he is missed by all who knew him. It takes passion to be your President, and that was his strength. QCCC was fortunate that Tommy Mitchem crossed paths with the club in 1974. He brought so much humor, he made us what we are today

- 2. Sam Mcgee: 1977 a.k.a. Father Time. Sam was originally from Minnesota and maintained a heavy big red beard. During Sam's tenure he also held us together. By this time QCCC was heavy into racing, every weekend. We were trying to hold onto the club house but the landlord was insisting he was going to raise the rent, which would be a death nail for us. That was our watering hole, our place to relax and communicate with all. So Sam was left to deal with racers vs social folks. This got to a boiling point more than once as we still paid dues to NCCC and those that did not race could not be persuaded that it was good use of dues funds to pay NCCC which was mandatory for every member. Then as it became clear that we would lose the clubhouse, page 5: Sam's leadership skills would be tested to the max. So eventually with no clubhouse Sam got us into scheduling meetings at various apartment complex clubhouses (the Lake, Glenn Hollow etc). It may be simple but where would we go for meetings? Our strength and friendships were really tested. This was thru the President Jimmy Carter's tenure where gas was rationed, interest on home loans neared 20%, so money was tight, jobs were not abundant, and u had to change your life style. Thru it all Sam was a good leader, the newsletter remained humorous and membership remained steady. Eventually Sam's job changed, and he moved back to Minnesota.
- 3. Joey Hunter: 1978,1979. QCCC was a tight knit bunch in 78. After Travis,72,76, Tommy 74, David Morse 75, Sam 77, and now Joey 78,79 you can see a trend developing. All of these Presidents had a great passion for QCCC and all things Corvette. Joey was so passionate that he had his 63 coupe painted candy apple red with gold flakes. Then he had a scroll with gold which read Queen City Corvette Club. Little Joey, his son, still races this car page 6: in and around the Fayetteville, N. C. area. (as a side note, Little Joey and Little Marty Ingram would bring their hot wheels to the track and play in the dirt. I believe they are pushing 50 today if not past 50) If you spent any time around Joey, u would say he may be the funniest man you have ever known. He had such quick wit and could land the zingers constantly. Joey was President when our 3 year run on Corvette/Porsche Challenges could not be done as the Speedway got money hungry wanting \$5,000 for that which had been paying \$200. There was no negotiating as that was way beyond our budget. Late in Joey's Presidency he was diagnosed with cancer. It was sad to watch him go downhill. He was strong and put a good fight but in the end we lost him. The vintage gang knows Joey was one of our great Presidents. He never stopped telling jokes but we know cancer waits for no one. Fortunately today we can cure 85% of all cancers.

It is ironic that each of the Presidents we have covered in the last two months had such different personalities and different ways to accomplish "page 7: Things" They all seemed to bring the right personality at the right time and took challenges head on, almost like we had the guidance to match them with a time that we needed exactly their style.

So anytime you think about leaving this group of folks don't think you will find a group with tighter bonds than QCCC. Think about standing on pit road at CMS with a shovel in your hand looking at the size of that infield. Think about being President and having to organize the Corvette/Porsche Challenge including getting the Camel GT circuit to be a main sponsor. As Bob Denney said when he received his Lifetime Service Achievement Award, "This is the finest group of people under God's blue skies."

And Chris Wood always reminded us... "You come for the Car, but you Stay for the People".

As we review these Presidents, we see that Bill Miller is spot on when he says QCCC has the greatest leaders and therefore will always be successful. Stop for a minute and reflect on what these three leaders did to be sure they would pass on to the next President a page 8: A QCCC that was in at least as good of shape that they received. I remember in my own Presidency, the first thought was Keith Cross is handing me a very well-oiled machine, now just don't screw it up.

Great memories from those leaders of the 70's.


