



THE CAROLINAS & VIRGINIA CORVETTE CARAVAN OVERVIEW

2019 National Corvette Museum Caravan

The National Corvette Museum (NCM) Caravans have become an integral part of the National Corvette culture. The following provides some background information on these caravans.

A nationwide caravan was organized in 1994 to celebrate the opening of the National Corvette Museum and again in 1999 to commemorate the NCM's 5th anniversary celebration. In 2003, a 3rd National Caravan was organized to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Corvette marque. The 2009 and 2014 National Corvette Caravans were held to celebrate the NCM's 15th and 20th anniversary. Our own Paul Mariano served as the NCM's National Corvette Caravan Chairman in 2014. The 6th National Corvette Caravan in 2019 promises to be the largest caravan yet.

Twenty-nine+ local caravans will be organized across the country and, in most instances, merge with other local groups as they proceed to Bowling Green, KY. It is anticipated that the approximately 300 Corvettes departing Charlotte, NC will join 7500+ other Corvettes in Bowling Green at the conclusion of the caravan.

Our local caravan covers Corvette enthusiasts in North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia. It will originate in Charlotte, NC days before with our own events and depart for Bowling Green with an overnight stop in Sevierville, TN. Our local caravan festivities include catered meals, track laps at Charlotte Motor Speedway, ice cream socials, raffles for valuable prizes, a great goody bag for each Corvette entered, NC/SC/VA Caravan T-Shirt and more. After combining with other caravan participants, the caravan will arrive in Bowling Green, KY on August 28, 2019 for the weekend festivities, vendors, events, concerts, and more..

In addition to caravan participants from the Carolinas and Virginia, Corvette enthusiasts from the surrounding area will be converging in Charlotte to participate in the kick-off activities at designated locations. Many who cannot participate in the actual caravan will attend our festivities throughout the Charlotte metro area. Our NC/SC/VA Caravan Chairs, Frank & Laura Sancineto have a fun experience planned for us.



More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past





Vintage QCCC days with the Vintage Gang: Bill Cruthis, Bill Ingram, Darrell Kirkley, and Travis Meredith

QCCC remained committed to racing from 78 thru the early nineties.

I will include a scan of Trav's artwork on the inside cover showing the then current board. For a while we had the spotlight member which high-lighted facts and info on a member/family. Around 2005 to 2009 Phillip Lewis did the member of the month and we should re-start that program. A hand drawn flyer for an autocross in Statesville. And some monthly copies of the QCCC Enquirer. Remember this was about the time Dallas was big on TV and often we had to hurry thru the meeting and meal to rush home and watch J.R. I don't remember any Corvettes in the Dallas show, but that was good as they had a long dusty drive way leading to the ranch.

I know back in these days there were events every weekend in the neighboring clubs. We will address that next month. I had in my mind that we were always going to events weekly and that may have tailed off, however if we look at our calendar today usually 3 weekends a month are covered up and we want more day trips added. The difference between now and then, we were working and could not do much during the week, so the Friday, Saturday, Sunday trips/ events were well attended. When viewing the flyer notice we were racing on the city road which was blocked off. This event was sponsored by Plastic Cars of Statesville, and was done at the city Dogwood Festival. A flyer was made and distributed to surrounding clubs. Think of our technology today to send information out and realize the extra time it took to get it in the newsletter. If you will take enough time to read this and go over our history I think you will find how hard it was to keep us growing to where we are today. You will see familiar names like Meredith, Kirkley, Strausborger and Craig. Enjoy learning about our past they also were great times.

QCCC Cars at the October 12, 2019 Corvette Show

Last year we judged 235 Corvettes which included 60 QCCC Corvettes. The judging process started at 8:00 AM and was finished around noon. It was conducted by 20 highly trained and highly skilled judges with the goal to judge each Corvette equally.

As mentioned in 2018 we judged 235 Corvettes and Bloomington Gold had an additional 65 Corvettes totaling 300 Corvettes on premises. In 2019 our goal is to have 500 Corvettes on premises at Hendrick Motorsport Complex which would include 100 QCCC Corvettes, 100 Corvettes involved in Bloomington Gold and 300 Guest Corvette Club cars to be judged. With this calculation it will take about 24 judges or 12 teams of judges. We are requiring all judges go through a training program with instructions as how to judge so we all can be on the same page and judge all cars equally and fairly. If you feel you are qualified please let your Judging Team Leader, Brian Moore or myself know of your interest.

Due to the large number of Corvettes to be judged we have decided to change the QCCC Corvettes from a Judged Award to a Participants Choice Award program. This is how the program will work and we expect 100 QCCC Corvettes to participate.

QCCC Participants Choice Award

Each participant will receive a ballot, guest Corvettes and QCCC Corvettes alike

Each participant will be allowed one vote for the QCCC Participant Choice Award

Participants Choice Award voting will be open from 8:00 AM to 12:00 Noon

Voting criteria is based on the Corvette you prefer the most

The top 10 QCCC Corvettes will receive a Participants Choice Award for 2019

This awards process will eliminate the need to judge 100 QCCC Corvettes and allow the judging team to begin the judging process earlier for guest Corvettes.

The second part of this new car show process will include new rules for QCCC as a host club. Rather than focusing on our Corvettes we need to focus on the Corvette Show and our guest. In the past we all have paid a registration fee for our Corvettes to participate. This year we will still have to register our Corvettes, however there will be NO CHARGE REGISTRATION for QCCC. We will still be allowed to participate in the door prizes, silent auction, 50/50 drawing, Hendrick Tours, T-shirts and all other show functions. As nothing is truly free, there is a catch for this NO CHARGE REGISTRATION and is outlined below.

QCCC Corvette Show NO CHARGE REGISTRATION

There will be no charge for QCCC registration, but you must register.

We expect 100 Corvettes to register.

Each QCCC member MUST sign up for one of the work stations during the show. Sign-up sheets will be available for you to participate.

To offset the cost each QCCC member must donate an item for either the goody bag (300 goody bags), silent auction or door prize items. A list of items will be available for your convenience.

Each QCCC member must help promote the Corvette show by using the flyers provided, word of mouth or the internet. We also encourage you to contact your local newspaper, TV, radio or magazine to promote the show.

This year will be one of the largest Corvette shows in the country and I am sure you want to be a part of this HUGE QCCC event at Hendrick Motorsport Complex in 2019.

Thank you for all your dedicated help and I will see you at the sign-up table.
