It's A Small World Everywhere (you can't make this stuff up.)

Car people's lives seem to have a history that is always intertwined.

Many of you know my history of wanting out of Illinois winters leading to my picking Charlotte as my adopted home town. As I planned my trip, I knew there were a couple of things I wanted to check out. (where were the women, the OCCC Corvette Club, and where do I go to find a basketball league). I had looked up what I could on OCCC and once I arrived in town I headed, under the guidance of Shad Alberty, straight to the clubhouse and it's back bedroom bar. I was 27 and a single guy with a 1970 show car and a 63 split window coupe, and little else. So I figured I would take a course in interior design at CCCP. The course had 30 women, me, and one other guy. Turns out they were all married but one and we went out but my Buddy Holly birth control glasses were of no help. It was a great course and I learned a lot. On the basketball front I got an early opportunity. I was managing the Revco Drug at the corner of Lawyers/ Albemarle Rd/Harris Blvd. I struck up a friendship with Mickey Price RPh., and Bobby Tamplin Rph. Mickey drove a 75 blue Corvette, and Bobby had a yellow 75 (they managed the Revco Drug on Central Ave). So I was starting to feel at home. Mickey took me under his wing and invited me to play on his league basketball team. Mickey was 6' 5", David Poole and his brother were both 6' 10", and Ron Sherrill (nicknamed Tree) was 6'7". Myself and a fellow by the name of Harmon, who sold men's dress shirts out of his car were the bench. First game I am watching as he says, I think I should start and play more. At which time I had to explain to him that he was 5'8" and that was over a foot shorter than most, so unless he had some kind magic in his game he was placed well on the bench where he would not get hurt.

Little did I know at the time that these guys were the peak of the 20 somethings in Charlotte. Tree was the pinnacle of the bunch as he owned a local brew house and dance club correctly named the Tree House. He got super bands, a great bar, and all the ladies that bounced off him were there for the rest of us to console. Many nights after closing down the QCCC guys that were there would grab some gears heading south on Independence Blv. Look in the archives for the night Darrell Kirkley made a bad choice to run, destroyed a Corvette and made money on the deal. One night I think we played the late game and Tree asked me to ride to the bank night deposit with him. He had his bank bag and a pistol with a long barrel. That is when I found out he was driving a 69 Corvette Coupe, Green out and green inside. The car was originally sold at Chevrolet in Statesville. In 69 with Tree buying it in 71. Tree knew the original owner so he got a jump on it.

After moving to Harrisburg, I was not able to run amuck anymore, plus I got married. Anytime I went by the Treehouse I would look and there was the 69. I next saw Tree probably 8 years ago. Our up Yonder Group went to Hickory Tavern in Mooresville and I found out he was managing it at the time. We had time for a short visit, and he said he still had the 69, He did not stay managing there long and I believe he was trying to open his own place. Keith Cross told me not long ago he really would like to have one Corvette from every generation and he was asking about my 71.

Turns out Tommy and Tree both grew up on the same street in Troutman. Tree was about 4 years older than Tommy so they were not as close as they might have been. Since Tree knew Tommy when the time came to sell he went to Tommy knowing his love of Corvettes.

Tommy bought the car but decided to sell it as he has so many Corvettes that he does not have time to drive them all. It has 93,000 original miles and factory air, a good car. It had been stored in Florida for a long time and now Tommy stored it for 2 years. He contacts Keith Cross who buys the car. He is on a good streak as the 61 Keith bought from Tommy has been a great one. So it turns out he has a car that is a 4 owner with Tree owning it the last 46 years. I actually rode in the car in 1975 and now it is in Keith's stable. Charlotte was a much smaller city back then but it is ironic how a Corvette from 1974 would touch threw several QCCC members after all these years. Seems like with great Corvettes what comes around goes around. When C-3s go up in value, and they will, Keith will have a 4 owner well documented car. I can vouch that is was always a southern car here in Charlotte. It was Tree's only car for a long time but he took good care of it.

Watching him get in and out of the car reminds me of watching Andy M. get in and out of his 69.

Fond memories of great cars and folks in QCCC, the early days. My cat is fine, maybe a little hoarse, but I think I kind of detect a little meowuff in her cries.
