Shiny things small and large

The last time I checked, a full 45% of our membership have joined our organization in the last 5 years. That said, I think it is time to review our awards programs. I will give you some of the history of current awards and of some long gone.

When racing went from Street to Strip, QCCC was looking for insurance so we could have protection if damage were done to cars, property, and people. We ended up with insurance from The National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC). They had a score sheet that was utilized at events to track results for Male Driver of the Year and Female Driver of the Year Awards. These two awards were not up for discussion. Points for entering, winning Autocross, Concourse, High Speed Events, and Hill Climbs led to the winners. Not one member in our young group was retired and events were held on every weekend.

As we grew in the 70's, QCCC realized that offering only 2 awards was a little thin so we started creating our own. We had a monthly award presented at the meeting which was MEMBER OF THE MONTH. I still have one and will try to photograph. They came in handy at the bar downstairs. These were cheap as the engraving probably cost more than the mug. Luckily member Al Starnes owned a trophy shop, and he gave us a cheap ride. We kept in mind that we had a sparse budget to pay for shiny things. Enter Travis Meredith, who has tremendous artistic talent. We would tell him what we needed, and he would go out back of his workplace and rummage up some auto parts. He had scrap lumber, heck we all had scrap lumber, most had crap lumber.

The results were homemade trophies at no cost to QCCC. I remember one was a board stained and then two 59 Chevrolet slanted radio antennae attached. The greatest ones were the wood arched with a shelf on the bottom. The shelf had a long neck Schlitz attached. Darrell says to this day that is his favorite award as he was the best driver. Mine was "first at last." Was it that I finally was first, or was I always was 1st to be last? In '75 awards started to be added.

Seems like Trav was a visionary as the Hendrick Award now has a piston on it. Also, Tony Stewart started making awards with engine parts. Most Popular Male Driver, Most Popular Female Driver, Rookie Driver of the Year were added. Rookie of the year was deleted in 2015 as it was not fair judging a rookie from all year who joined in January vs one who joins in say October. We were aware that sometimes a member would just have bad luck racing, so the Hard Luck award was added. The first year we gave it to Rick Wilson. As Trav handed the trophy to Rick it fell apart. According to Senator Meredith no-one had tampered with it, simply hard luck. There was an award called the porta potty award. Hard to say how you got this one, but Jim Nichols was the lucky winner in 1980.

This all served us well until the mid-nineties when racing became too expensive, and we drifted to mostly a social club. Now with all our awards previously they had titles that would not work. Not sure who gets credit for the change, but a point system was implemented. The vice president via the by-laws is to come up with an equitable system for awards. The next phase was to have the V.P. keep track of the points. You got a point for meeting attendance, one for up yonder dinners, one for QCCC Wednesday dinners, you got points for attending auto fair, winning at auto fair, winning any other car show etc. We ended up at the banquet with a king and queen award. You got points for attending day trips and other social events. We even had a mess with this in that by the first decade of the new century, as we had working people and retired people which led to complaints. V.P. Matt Dieger tried to track in two groups to make it fair: Working Stiffs, and Retirees.

When I became V.P. in 2014 the outgoing V.P. Bill Rambo handed me a computer print-out that was about 3 inches thick. I was told that was one month of point tracking for banquet awards. I took that home to file 13. Now I had to come up with an awards program. Using the movie theme of Corvette Fever, I made 8 groups with each committee having 20 members. Our club has so much Corvette Fever we just had to observe and see which member in each group was showing the most. Our newer members may see Corvette Fever T-shirts, this is where they came from.

Two awards that have longevity are Member of the Year and The President's Award. MOY carries prestige as it is awarded by the members. In 2014 we implemented the new program to recognize members who have had 15 years of active dues paying. This group is awarded a jacket patch that has our original logo, and states Vintage Member. We bought 100 patches which will not quite carry us thru this year which means of 350 members we have 100 couples who are vintage.

Two years ago, we started the Golden Gears Award, given to any member who has owned the same Corvette for 50 years. That is a tall order. So far, we have Walt and Wendy Krupowiscz, DePascall, Travis and Sharon Meredith, and Steve and Laura Pelchat.

The Service Excellence Award originated in 2020 is given to those who are showing above and beyond in spending extra time and dedication to QCCC activities.

In 2014 we needed to address the Lifetime Member Award which was no longer effective as we aged. Keith Cross designed the LSAA (Lifetime Service Achievement Award.) This is the highest compliment our members can attain. To date we have 5 members receiving this award. Eddie Burt (deceased), Bob Denney (deceased), John Meadows, Travis Meredith, and Bill Cruthis.

Some of the old awards were mainly about recognition. With only 27 member couples we really needed to gin up good attendance. As treasurer (76) I would collect dues of \$5 a month, payable at the meetings. Hard to believe how many of the 27 would dodge the meeting as they did not have \$5. Lest they forget, I like beer so I would collect on Wednesdays at the bar.

Most folks enjoy recognition by their peers. If you have taken on extra projects and it works out good for QCCC it is exciting. Our organization from the beginning has had plenty of members ready to step up and go beyond. Just think of the newer members that are stepping up now: Roger and Dee Dee Winge, Justin Cross, Paul and Christine Schmidt, Dick Gwilt, Jamie Stamey Hinson, Brian and Barbara Kruse, Tommy and Brenda Loftin, Ron and Donna Berst, just to name a few. We will continue to excel as others step up going forward.

I hope this will be helpful for those who are interested in how our awards developed over the decades. All the methods to nominate somebody plus discussion info can be found on the website under awards.




