




The month marks Vintage article #144 since the inception of the idea in 2009. We plan to keep going as long as we can. In the meantime, the newer members will enjoy a new article by historian, Travis Meredith, detailing the history of the origins of the club and how it grew to be what it is today.

And now some edumacation on car shows!

How did the car shows develop? This is my take on it and I am confident it has a fair amount of accuracy. Back in the late 60's, Corvette clubs were popping up everywhere. From mid-sized towns to metro areas, all supported by Chevrolet thru the NCCC (National Council of Corvette Clubs). NCCC was a blessing and a curse. They were great for areas like the deep south, which had a proliferation of racetracks, as they offered insurance for our cars while on track in timed events. One of their strict rules stated that every member club must donate the funds of one event to the NCCC charity which was Spina Bifida. Most of these small clubs were just getting organized and did not have the jam-packed calendar we see today. Hence came the idea to have a small car show amongst members and charge a small entry fee which would be sent to NCCC. QCCC had small events like our car show (which was really a car display), held at Southpark Mall in '75. After a couple of years, it was found that we could open the show up to other Corvette owners and increase our revenue to NCCC. Many clubs set their car show with their club picnic in a park. Then in '73, along comes Bloomington Corral and the whole car show world changed. I attended their first show and was amazed. I had never seen so many Corvettes in one place before. Like a Good Guys show, you would see anything. I remember a '66 convertible painted mint green fulie car with factory air. Obviously, that could not be ordered so the owner had added the air and done an excellent job. The show was held at the Bloomington (McLean County) fairgrounds in Illinois. I entered my '70 silver coupe in '74 and won best in class. I still have that small 8- inch trophy. The next year, the show was named Bloomington Gold. It grew like a California wildfire, only limited by early owner greed trying to make more profit by squeezing the host property.

This caused a move to the Illinois State Fairgrounds (where it should have stayed), back to Bloomington, then to Turkey Run outside of Chicago, then to the campus of the University of Illinois in Champaign and finally to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. Most, but not all changes were by new owners including Meacum. It is now a 4- day event pulling in 30,000 attendees complete with autocross, scenic drive, drag racing, show judging for certification, 3 stages with nightly band performances. This is why we are so fortunate to have them as part of our show.

So, what happened? In our great country a good idea attracts inventive investors such as Guy Larson who are willing to take the risk to be successful. The small club car shows had to find creative ways to grow which took better advertising and new rewards. A small trophy with a bigger one just was not enough. So, cash is always good, right? All the sudden car show flyers were stating \$100, \$200, even \$500 to best of show and now you saw the beginning of the "garage queen Corvette". Once the car was detailed, the less dirt it acquired between shows, the easier it was to prep. As the cash issue grew and got higher, it soon yielded another alternative. Whamo! circa last half of the '70's decade, the flyers started showing up offering a used Corvette to the Show winner. These were not show cars but pretty well used up daily driven Corvettes. None the less, they were a free, and in most cases, a restorable vintage Corvette. These were back in the days where a daily driver would retail for \$1,000.

QCCC travels to Sumpter S.C. for a car show, best of show prize was a '58 Corvette. I trailered my '70 and Darrell Kirkley trailered Dollar Bill Ingram's 67 coupe. I had no shot as the '67 was such a popular car and it was Ingram clean. Enter stage left, one Ward Marsh from Knoxville, Tenn. He brought a gorgeous Marlboro Maroon '69 coupe with chrome side pipes and lots of chrome under the hood. This was a frame off restoration with no fluids in the car. That's right... pushed it off the trailer into the show and back on the trailer after the show and he won the '58. That pretty much ended my show days as frame off cars became the standard. Just like other things in our country, ie: Walmart, Amazon etc., the big eat the small for lunch. The day in Sumpter was not a total loss, as the single guys got to watch a young lady in short pink shorts and high heels enjoy the show.

QCCC continued to have our small show, including some at Larry Jay Chev. On South Blvd. when they were our sponsor, we had a few down at Hendrick's until we grew to a size that was disruptive to their Saturday business. Ten years ago, we met with Hendrick and it was decided to try a show at the Hendrick complex. While it has been a joint effort, we cannot overlook the effort and results that Tommy Loftin has achieved. In an era of shrinking number of car shows, or somewhat car displays now since most new ones are just a different color, Tommy is approaching a 500 Corvette count. That is tremendous.


Car shows went from easy to win to impossible, to what special car do you have. It has been an interesting ride. Stay tuned for the next change.

At the Speedway Club meeting last month, Prez Paul asked for members who had joined QCCC in the last year and a half to stand. I was surprised at the large number that stood. We have a lot of new members and that started me thinking that these rookies need a history lesson. We published a series of "Vintage Gang" articles for the newsletter back in 2013 that covered the origin of QCCC and for the next couple of months we will revisit the club's history, just in time for our 53<sup>rd</sup> anniversary in August.

But first, a little background:

Chevrolet promoted the "Corvette life style" from an early point in the mid fifties when the Corvette reputation for performance was established by the "godfather" Zora Duntov. Starting in 1957 CORVETTE NEWS magazine was published by GM and was free to new Corvette owners. Along with interesting articles on racing and club events, the magazine inspired the owners to organize and join the fun. Each issue listed all of the clubs throughout the country with contact information to promote membership. The National Council of Corvette Clubs was formed in 1959 and was instrumental in providing guidance and insurance for club events. The "Corvette Club of North Carolina" was formed in the mid sixties, and even though based in Charlotte, it had members from all over the state. It seems this group "aged out" in their mid 30's and became inactive in the late 60's.

All of this laid the ground work in 1968 for a group of young men from North Charlotte to get together and form a new club.

Next month, "QCCC.....The Very Beginning".


