





QCCC....HOW IT ALL BEGAN

It's the summer of 1968. Twenty two year old high school buddies Earl Ferrell and Carl Brown had acquired new Corvettes in 1966 and spent time together cruising Charlotte and hanging out at a local service station enjoying their cars.

Earl had grown up with a mechanic father and a driveway full of cool cars. In high school he drove a modified 55 Chevy and later a 327 65 Chevelle SS. But the Corvette bug bit Earl and he wound up with a striking 1966 silver coupe with silver interior and a 327/350 hp engine. He added side exhausts and American mags to complete the look of the day. Earl was an avid drag racing fan and years later converted his pride and joy to an all out drag car that was very competitive.

When Earl's neighbor Clyde Richards bought a new Corvette the duo became a trio. The *Corvette Club of North Carolina* was not very active and didn't appeal to the trio so it was Earl's idea to start a new club. With influence from a "*Corvette News*" magazine article titled "How to start a Corvette Club", the new club was formed.

With Earl as president, recruitment started immediately. Earl had some business cards printed where you could write in your name and phone number and he would leave them under the windshield wipers of every Corvette he saw sitting still. Butch Bigham remembers being at LaPointe Chevrolet having a problem solved on his new 68 (he was there a lot) when Earl approached him in the service lane. Butch joined in July.

The first thing on the agenda was a name. They all agreed it should have a direct connection to Charlotte and being called the "Queen City" that name was chosen.

The bi-laws were drafted and approved and stated that charter members were to be voted on by August 9, 1968. There were four charter members on that date.

The first club logo was patterned after a fender emblem from a 1966 427 Caprice and tags were made from photo engraving printing plates (source unknown) and hand painted.

By mid 1969 a core group of members included Russell Bryant, Danny Canup, Rodney Floyd, Bill Hardy, Ken Bruner and others had joined the fun. Early events were simple social gatherings, lots of cruising in caravans, including some road trips, and some fun rallies where you had to follow some vague clues to navigate to the destination. But mainly it was an excuse to get together and talk Corvettes.

It is important to note that that QCCC was really the vision of one man: Earl Ferrell. He and his wife Martha were loyal members from the very beginning, attending almost every event even as they added two sons to their family. He wasn't one of the hell-raisers, he was quick to lend a hand and after founding the club and being the first president, he quietly let others lead the club he started. Unfortunately, Earl battled cancer and after a long painful fight, he passed away on October 20, 1987 at the age of 41.

By the end of 1969 the club had grown to around 15 members, with a unique black ball in a cigar box system for approving new members and voting restricted to male members only.


It is ironic to think that 53 years have passed since these very young men in their early 20's found a way to own a Corvette and form a group of like minded people to spend their spare time with. The cars were the common denominator, but the close relationships developed quickly and it became a brotherhood. Of course none of this would have worked if the wives and girlfriends had not joined in and soon it was one big happy family. As it remains today.

Next month we will follow the evolution of the club into the early 70's.


