

QCCC HISTORY

It's hard to believe it is 2022! That means it's been 50 years since the first famous "Sand-kana" held in North Myrtle Beach (Ocean Drive). But how such an event came to happen is this month's history lesson.

The annual Queen City Corvette Club February Beach Trip in 1971 started out very normal. An early Saturday meeting at Zayre's parking lot on East Independence Boulevard led to an uneventful caravan of about twelve Corvettes to Ocean Drive. Upon arrival at the Mar-Vista Motel and check in, the group enjoyed a quick lunch and the start of happy hour. It was noted during the casual cocktail time that we needed something to do before the serious drinking started. How about driving on the beach? Here's where things went sideways (literally).

Since I'm not sure of the statute of limitations, I'll just call the responsible QCCC member, Jerry D. Well, ole Jerry D. He was a confirmed bachelor, a little older, very nice looking, and never dated the same girl twice. He had a brand-new Ontario orange Corvette coupe and since driving SLOWLY on the beach was permitted off season, took his new girlfriend out on the beach for a spin. (Another literal statement). With encouragement from other members on the balcony, he sped out on the beach and started doing a series on donuts and power slides that would have made Joey Chitwood envious. Suddenly, from about a mile down the beach comes a black and white police car at a high rate of speed with his red light on. Our hero quickly exits the beach and rejoins the group. After some excellent detective work, the officer investigating the incident invites several of us down to meet the Ocean Drive police chief.

Down at the station, Chief Belamy very carefully explained the rules concerning driving on the beach and during the conversation made the statement that if we wanted to go fast on the beach, we should have an organized event and he would be willing to help. That statement started a chain of events that led to the first "Sand-kana" held in 1972. And our hero was released without charges. To prove his support, he had a police car escort the entire club down the beach at a very slow pace on Sunday before our trip home. All of this is documented on super 8 film (no sound) now in the club's historical archives on DVD.

This is just another example of how simple things were 50 years ago and you could make a mistake and it wasn't turned into a felony. Also note that the beach was very seasonal back then, hardly anyone was there in February, no one was on the beach and this incident did not put anyone in danger.

Next month, we'll explore the Sand-kana event further.



More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



Well, look what turned up during spring cleaning...

There in the very bottom of that old toolbox, laid what should have been mouse nest material. I will remember to remind the agent how well mouse proofed my garage if I should ever sell the house.

A "barn find", if you will, also was located, a show ready, solo copy of the National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) quarterly magazine called Blue Bar, dated Sept/Oct 1978. The entire issue is dedicated to coverage of the 1978 NCCC National Convention hosted by QUEEN CITY CORVETTE CLUB OF CHARLOTTE N.C. This is 31 pages long so I will break it up into the next 3 months articles. I will highlight a few things for you to look for on the pages. I hope you can imagine what a feat about 30 couples of QCCC pulled off. Corvettes arrived from all over the country ready to race, shine, drink, and be entertained. This was very much like a bash except the entrants entered the events. Many thanks go to Governor of QCCC David Morse, Event Chairman Melvin Pace, Darrell Kirkley, Joey Hunter, Earl Ferrell, and the ladies of QCCC. This week in 1978 did more to put QCCC on the Corvette map than anything we could or did do beyond. It went off without a hitch and it was very special. A lot of QCCC used their vacation days to be off to help get it all lined up. We assigned events to other clubs in the Carolinas and they all came thru hosting the events just as we would.

Now the cover and first 10 pages:

Cover page, top from left to right:

- Custom roadster at the concourse.
- Roadster at Charlotte Motor Speedway high-speed event.
- Unidentified attendee.
- Staging lane at CMS for high-speed event, & on the track. I believe that is Butch Southwell from Central Illinois Corvettes on the road course high speed in a brand new '78 Pace Car, I think a '54 at Blaney drags.

Pages 2 and 3 are self-explanatory.

Pages 4 and 5:

- At the Speedway, notice how young everyone is, while the speedway looks old and tired.
- There is a split window coupe on trailer ready to run the high-speed event (value then about \$8,000).
- The Sunday night party is mentioned along with the wet t-shirt contest.

Pages 6 and 7:

• Notice Monday night entertainment was Rockin' Ray, a well know DJ in the area and he is in the Shag Hall of Fame.

Pages 8 and 9:

- Concourse at Carowinds and drag race at Blaney Drag Strip.
- Stroh's Beer sponsored a beer case stacking competition.
- Also, money was raised for NCCC charity Spina Bifida.

Page 10:

- Drag Race results.
- Of note, our founder Earl Ferrell placed first in Modified B (small block) at 11.87 seconds. That was good for a top ten at #8 overall.
- Melvin Pace (future President of QCCC) ran 13.75 in A class (big blocks).



City Corvette Club, and the other Carolina Region clubs and people who helped out. It was, as usual, a week well spent.



Of course Stroh's Beer was flowing all day, and our thanks go out to T. Michaelis Corvette Supplies who was the sponsor of the Concours event.





Tuesday - - - Draggin', Beer Stackin' & \$3 Bills


Tuesday morning it was off to Blaney Drag Strip near Columbia, South Carolina for the annual Corvette Nationals, sponsored by Hurst Performance.




