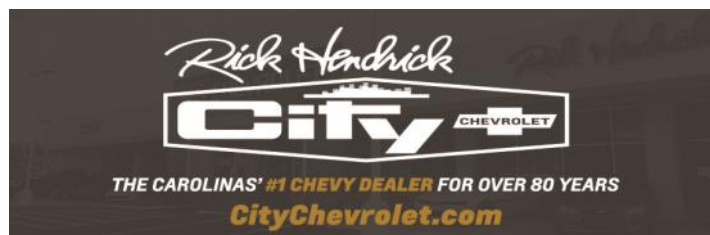

I think we are back on track; we had a club meeting in March! Moving on and thinking about all the prospective members that have attended meetings and new members that have joined QCCC in the last year or so, there are quite a few “terms” and phrases we throw around that might not mean anything to those that are new to the club, so... this might help define and clarify.

Museum or NCM—The National Corvette Museum, is a nonprofit Corvette only museum located in Bowling Green KY (1/2 mile from the assembly plant) supported mainly by NCM members.

The “Bash” – A yearly event the last week of April at the NCM, new models and options are usually unveiled. Seminars by Chevrolet engineers and marketing people, tech talks and assembly plant managers provide great info.

“Blasts” – Emailed communications from QCCC detailing all upcoming club activities and events.

Up Yonder—A monthly dinner the last Monday of the month in the northern part of the QCCC area at a restaurant chosen by the host member.

Day Trip – A road trip to any destination chosen by the host member, usually a few hours or less away with a restaurant dinner or picnic lunch.

Overnighter – A longer road trip than the day trip, with a one or two night hotel overstay, we have three on the calendar for this year.

Caravan – A group of cars following each other to a destination chosen by the event leader.

Cars & Coffee – Usually a morning event where we meet, park together if possible and socialize and talk all things Corvette. There is one somewhere every Saturday, check the QCCC website calendar schedule.

IMSA – The International Motorsports Sports Association. This is one of the sanctioning bodies that Corvette Racing participates in. The series Corvette races in is called the Weather Tech Sports Car Championship. The season starts in Daytona as the Rolex 24 and concludes at Road Atlanta with the Motul Petit LeMans.

WEC – The World Endurance Championship. The other sanctioning body that Corvette Racing participates in. The first race was at Sebring Raceway in Florida, the remaining five are in Europe.

Care & Compassion – A blast sent By Paul Schmitt for members who contact him about illness, surgeries and other health concerns.

QCCC HISTORY

Bill Cruthis and I would like to thank everyone who voiced their approval of the “video history lesson” at the March meeting. We hope to continue to show photos and videos of QCCC's rich history at future meetings. We will continue telling the story of the “Sand-kana” with video later, but I feel that we have some loose ends to tie up that might explain the make up of the club in the 70's.

Some of the photos of the clubhouse showed a lot of dancing. I saw some quizzical looks, why so much dancing in a car club? If you grew up in the Carolinas in the 50's and 60's, dancing was an important part of the social life for kids in junior and senior high school and it carried over into young adulthood. If you wanted to get the girl's attention, you either had to be an athlete, have a cool car or be a good dancer. Now how does this apply to QCCC in the mid-seventies at the clubhouse? Here's that story. . .

QCCC had as a member during that time that was one of the best, award winning shaggers of all time: Shad Alberty. Shad and his wife, Brenda had a yellow “72 Corvette convertible and were very active in all of the club activities. He wasn't as good a driver as he was a dancer as Brenda often had better times in autocross events, but Shad certainly knew how to have a good time. When we acquired the clubhouse, he immediately found an old Rock-Ola juke box, loaded it with great beach 45's and declared the front living room was to remain free of furniture just for dancing. The irony was that Shad didn't dance very much at the club. He would stand there, enjoy the music and smile while we did our best moves to impress him. It was kinda like asking Tiger Woods to join your threesome at Monroe Country Club. While I spent a lot more time in the bar than on the dance floor, it was great hearing all of the classics; “Sixty Minute Man, Green Eyes”, lots of Drifters, Tams, early R&B, and Motown. If I recall correctly, the photos of club members dancing outside and even on Independence Boulevard happened one summer night when the party got really late. It was really hot inside and someone turned the volume way up. There were no arrests. When Shad passed away at an early age, his ashes circled Ducks Beach Club in Ocean Drive in a scale model train car that traveled around on tracks near the ceiling. And the dancing wasn't quite the same.

Since the success of the clubhouse depended on additional revenue beyond club dues, the building of the bar and purchasing a beer tapper was top priority. A used refrigerated single keg tapper was located and the price established. The expense of the tapper and the initial keg of Schlitz was more than the club had on hand, so additional donations were necessary. Realizing the seriousness of the situation and that the success of this venture depended on the beer, everyone dug deep; taking bag lunches to work, no fish Friday's at South 21, and Kotex money all went to acquiring the necessary funds. David Morse volunteered to build the bar, but there wasn't any money left for the materials. We had no idea he had any wood working skills but when he said he would pay for the materials himself, he got the job. To everyone's surprise, the bar turned out great. Another donation to complete the bar room was the “Roman orgy” red wall paper added to the walls. I never knew where that came from. One open bar night on Wednesday it was there and no one seemed to object. With the bar complete and a juke box blaring beach music, life was good in QCCC. This was all done without any consideration for the risk involved in selling beer without a license or insurance. The club wasn't incorporated at that time and the officers who signed their names to the lease took an unbelievable chance. A great example of being young and dumb.

Another thing to consider is how radically different the Charlotte area was 50 years ago. Club members were mostly young local guys who placed owning a Corvette as a high priority and sometime sacrificed in order to do so. In 1970 the population of Charlotte was about 241,000 and was ranked 60th in the country. I grew up less than two miles from the “square”, which isn't really a square but an intersection, Trade and Tryon streets. And back then it wasn't “No-Da”, it was North Charlotte. North Charlotte was basically a little mill town just like the hundreds of other mill towns in the Carolinas, only it was within the city limits of Charlotte. The guys that started this club all went to Garinger High School and grew up in this area. It wasn't until 1978 that things really started to change.

Several things happened that year that changed Charlotte. The big thing was liquor by the drink was finally voted in. That did away with the old brown bagging laws and opened up the local hospitality industry. The other thing was IBM and several big insurance companies moved in hundreds of Yankees from New York and New Jersey to man their new operations centers in Charlotte. Before 1978 there were only 8 Yankees in Charlotte and we kept our eye on them. Also, North Carolina National Bank and Wachovia started what became a banking piss contest with many mergers and acquisitions. Things changed around here rapidly. Now the Queen City has a population of 885,000 and is the 15th largest city in the country. And we can't overlook Duke Power building that dam that turned our beloved Catawba River into Lake Norman.

So you see, it was only natural that as the city grew and changed that QCCC would do likewise. And as the average age of Corvette owners also grew, the club matured. *Really matured!* But, the latest trend seems to be younger and younger Corvette owners are joining and from one old guy, that is the thing that excites me the most. I look forward to meeting and making friends with our new younger members and appreciate that they allow us the opportunity to tell our war stories about the old days. And that there will be someone around when we are gone to continue “Cruising the Carolinas”.

Some nice looking cars, with tops or windows down. Most Southern drag strips were really dusty, dirty, sandy places. The pits rarely had anything but dirt surfaces. Wonder which of us would take our cars there today?

Page 12. Drag strip times. I don't think that is Trav's artwork, but it is a '64 coupe. Again at the drags and dirt and yet there is a spectator in white Levis. White Levis, does that take you back? How would you keep them clean there. Plus the '63 coupe at the concourse either Black or Daytona Blue.

Page 13. August at CMS is always hot. Note the name bands. . . JTS Boogie and Cornelius Brothers with Sister Rose. Note high speed event used entire CMS oval speeds at 160 mph.

Page 14. I don't know how they kept those cars from overheating waiting their turn at CMS. August heat in Charlotte and we were so young we didn't even seek shade. Note left side of picture has cases of Stroh's beer for the stacking contest. Larry Gunter in class C 300 hp placed 8th in autocross.

Page 15. Jerry Rhinehardt QCCC placed 7th in autocross D class, base engine. Charlene Gunter placed 1st by default in ladies class C. The photo is of Harry Jackson QCCC our NCCC Governor for many years.

Page 16. photos at CMS. It took a lot of tape for those paper numbers. Bottom right looks like into the wall but I don't remember that. Note the dead chicken on a leash. I remember it but not the facts.

Page 17. The Rhinehardt's finished 75th in the road rally. A pretty drive up in the mountains!

Page 18. High speed event times. Harry Jackson QCCC placed 8th in race prepared class, a tough class.

Page 19. Photos at CMS. Artwork shows the influence of John Greenwood's wide body cars he was running in SCCA .

Page 20. More photos at speed at CMS.

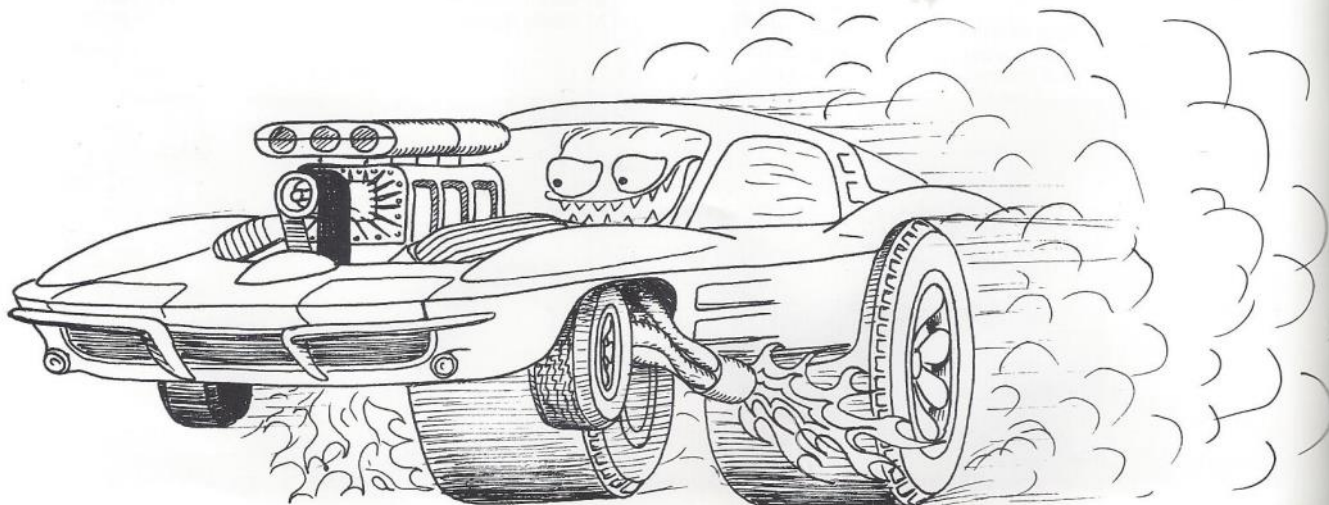

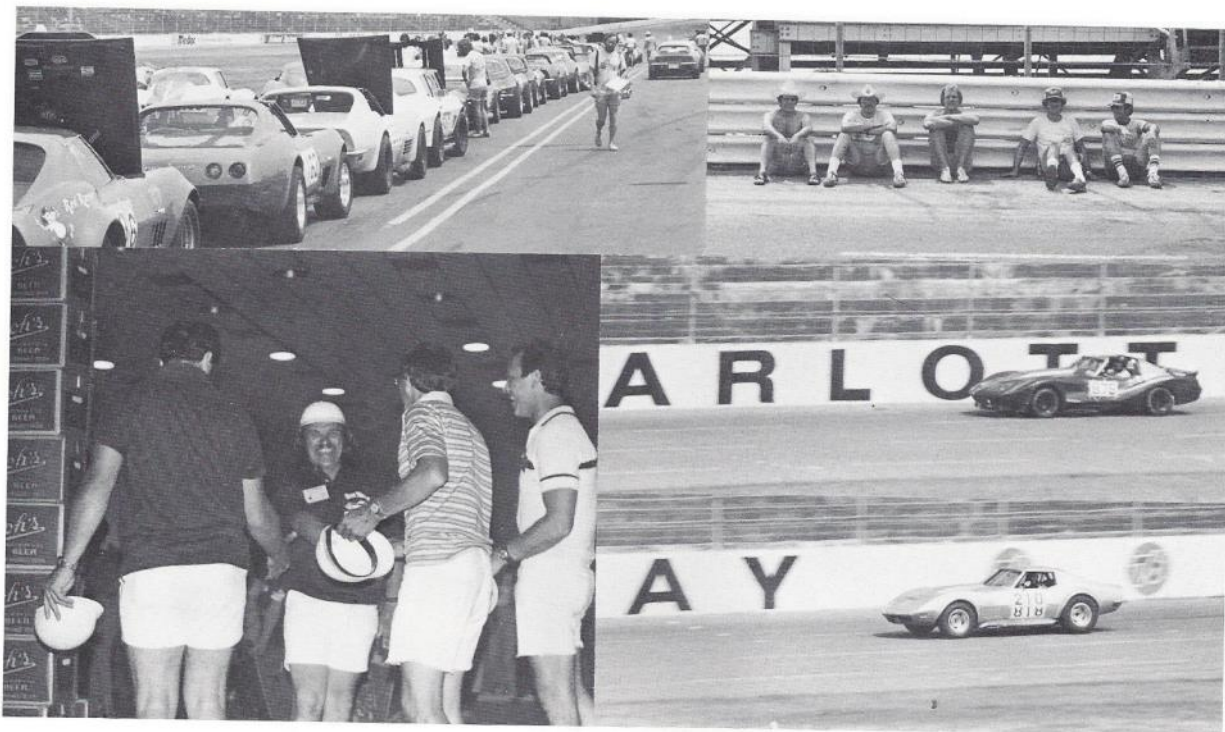
Thursday was the day for all of the "Stockers" to try their hand at the big track. Then Friday saw the Pure Stocks on the Charlotte track while the Men's Auto-
