



NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM – NEWS AND UPDATES

Paul Mitchell – QCCC Ambassador to the NCM

I want to thank the Board for the opportunity to serve as your Ambassador to the National Corvette Museum. I look forward to supporting the NCM and hopefully continue our excellent relationship with the Museum staff. I will also continue to solicit membership to the Museum from the non-members in QCCC.

QCCC has always had a significant role and reputation at the Museum. Thanks to our beloved late Paul Mariano, that relationship was strong for many years. We will maintain and continue to grow that relationship.

Just to give everyone a foundation of the Museum, here is their position statement:

The National Corvette Museum acts as the steward for all Corvette enthusiasts, by fulfilling our mission to celebrate the Corvette's invention, and preserve the legendary automobile's past, present, and future. The Museum will serve as an educational and research model for all to enjoy. The Museum was opened on Labor Day weekend in 1994. At that time, the NCM stated that the Museum belonged to all the Corvette enthusiasts and therefore it was their Museum.

And here is the statement on the purpose of the Ambassador program:

The purpose of the Ambassador Program is to provide Corvette clubs/organizations a two-way communication link to the NCM. This program provides several opportunities to offer support through participation and involvement in the functions of the Museum. Corvette clubs/organizations can play an important role in the mission of the National Corvette Museum by providing the NCM and its staff guidance and assistance.

I will provide updates and news from the Museum as needed and will be a two-way communication source for the QCCC. Please let me know if you have any questions that I can help with.

You may have received the notice that Lifetime Membership price is going up from \$1500 to \$2000 on October 1. So, if you are planning on this Membership you need to act before our car show – take advantage of the savings.

If you are 65 years of age or older, there is a new membership class that is an amazing deal. For \$750 you will receive a membership that is good for 20 years. You get all the benefits of any membership program, including discounts to events and the Corvette Store, subscription to the America's Sports Car magazine, free admission to the Museum display, and many more. Thanks again for the opportunity, and I look forward to serving QCCC in this new role.

QCCC HISTORY

As the huge QCCC Car Show is almost here, the excitement is building and this one should be the best yet. As we did last year, there will be a special display for the "Golden Gears" Corvettes that have had the same owners for at least fifty years. We now have six cars that fall in that category with the inclusion of Jim Holland's 1957.

But this year we have invited a special guest to join this display. We are encouraging former QCCC member and past President Melvin Pace to bring his one owner 1968 Corvette, which was one on the club's most popular cars in the early days and has a rich history on its own.

Melvin ordered the car from City Chevrolet in October of 1967, but it didn't arrive until January of 1968. With a sticker price of \$5729.20, the red-on-red coupe was ordered with all the popular performance options of the day: 435 horsepower, 427 engine, 4 speed transmission, 3.70 posi rear gear, and side exhausts. Since he worked for GM parts, it wasn't long before he added L88 fender flares and hood. He drove it daily for a couple of years and then, through Corvette News, joined the "Corvette Club of North Carolina". After being the only club in the area during the mid-sixties, it finally disbanded in the early 70's. Melvin then joined QCCC in early 1972 and become very active in both automotive and social events. The 68's tag was "POP TOP", we weren't sure if that was because of the T-tops on the car or the Budweiser in the cooler.

As QCCC got more involved with the National Council for Corvette Clubs and the competition events they sanctioned, Melvin dedicated the '68 to participating in every type of event there was. He was fastest time of the day many times and led the club to the many regional championships and eventually the national championship. He was club President in 1985 and 1989 and I'm sure his easy-going nature held the club together since there were some high-strung members during the racing era.

Melvin dropped out of QCCC in 1992 and the '68 was parked with 53,000 wide open miles and a blown head gasket. Life moved on and it wasn't until early this year he got the '68 back on the road. And when I heard that, I started trying to get him back involved with the club. He has some health issues that may prevent that, but it sure would be great to see him and his legendary '68 again. It's one of those cars that you wish could talk. . .the stories it could tell.

We certainly hope Melvin and his '68 can attend our show, and if he does, I encourage each of you to spend a minute or two getting to know a former member who, by example, was the ultimate Corvette enthusiast.

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



Many years ago, at the Rick Hendrick Museum, rested a unique race car. I later learned this was a Lola T710 Corvette GTP which was raced in the IMSA circuit. The car was solely sponsored by Goodwrench Performance Parts. Several Lolas were raced in IMSA in the first half of the decade of the 80's with a modicum of success. Ironically, the T710 had no Corvette parts on it. A power plant of a Ryan-Falconer Buick based 3.4 l V6 was in the T710 while a sister car, a T711 carried a 350 Chevrolet motor. The ride was partially to test some of the look of the C-5, which was under development at the time. You can see the headlights and taillights taking shape in the attached photos. After 4 years, in 1985, the car was in the hands of Rick Hendrick, having changed over to a Chevrolet motor producing 775 hp. Every driver that drove the car said it was the most exciting racer ever.

Now, for the rest of the story. In the early 80's, Rick Hendrick's personal assistant was none other than our own Darrell Kirkley. A portion of his efforts were spent chasing after Mr. H.'s sports cars. Arriving at work one morning his duty was to take a Hendrick dually to Detroit to pick up the Lola and trailer it to Ocala, Florida to display it at the convention of GM parts managers who sponsored the car. Next came more surprises. Rick was ready to return to Charlotte and he brought Darrell with him leaving the trailer in Ocala, as after the convention it was to go to Watkins Glenn for an IMSA race. Darrell was on the plane with Mr. H., Dale Earnhardt, and Richard Childress. As he says, he felt like being at a funeral in a black tux with brown shoes. Then, the Lola is in Watkins Glenn with the trailer and a dually borrowed from GM Detroit, while the Hendrick dually is getting repaired, but Darrell is in Charlotte. His orders then, were to get a nice big passenger van and drive it to Watkins Glenn for the race team. After the race he traveled to Detroit to get the dually and the Lola trailer, exchange the duallys and trailer the Lola to Charlotte. Seems like going from your elbow over your shoulder but sometimes that can not be helped. Then came one more call from Mr. H., "I want you to stop off at Goodyear Tire Test Track in Akron, Ohio on the way back. We are shooting some commercials with the car and you will need to drive it." Are you kidding me. . .giving Darrell free rein with a million-dollar GTP car was like giving booze to an alcoholic. Darrell seldom drives less than flat out open when it comes to racetracks, so you can imagine what a day he had. He said, "there was a small turbo pause, but when it kicks in it's like an 18-wheeler plowing into your backside."


