




Thanks to all our QCCC volunteer members, Team Leaders, and especially our show leaders: Tommy Loftin, Paul Mitchell, and Roger Winge.

Bloomington Gold... You have likely heard those words, they will be at our car show, but what exactly is it? Owned by Guy Larson, Bloomington Gold is a business that annually holds one of the largest Corvette shows in the country. The organization is a judging process that painstakingly examines and complies points to determine how close each car's condition is to when it left the factory. Restored cars can have points deducted from their score if they are "too perfect" since back in the day paint, panel fit and finish was not as good as what today's restoration shops and restorers can produce.

The first show was a swap meet held at the Bloomington, Illinois Fairgrounds in 1973. On June 10th & 11th of 2022 the show was held in Normal Illinois, at the Illinois State University grounds which is adjacent to Bloomington. This year they celebrated 50 years of shows... just 5 years less than the beginning of QCCC!!!

There are several levels of certification the cars are classified and judged in: Survivors - cars that have very little to no repaint or restoration done to them; Gold Certified - close to the original factory production condition; and the highest level is Benchmark - these cars are considered almost exactly the way they rolled off the assembly line. The whole judging process is based on points deducted from a perfect 100 score and simply a wrong bolt or hose clamp will reduce the score... no stone is left unturned as the judges really know their stuff. The Corvettes that owners bring are some of the best examples of older Corvettes and many hours are spent on making them correct as produced. Obviously, there is more to the process than this, but this is a short description of what happens at their shows.

Bloomington Gold is a part of our car show and is the only other location where they judge, other than Bloomington, IL. If you have time to look at the cars that are at our show, you will experience history on wheels and the evolution from early cars that were the best performance cars of their time to the present C8 and is truly amazing.







With the focus on our "Super Bowl" of the year, *QCCC's Annual Car Show*, I am amazed at how far our club has come. In the early years of the club showing our cars was about the furthest thing from our minds. Most of our Corvettes were daily driven and in most cases in need of a little work. The club's focus was on driving our cars not sitting still and polishing them. But even then, nice street cars were appreciated and the pride of ownership compelled us to show off our pride and joy when given the opportunity.

One of the first shows we did as a club was an invitation to participate in the "World of Wheels" professional car show that was held in Charlotte every February. It was originally held at the old Coliseum (now BoJangles) and had real show cars from all over. These were the ones you saw in the magazines with mirrors underneath, or on turn-tables with angel hair, chrome everything and wild custom paint. But when they moved the show to the new Civic Center on East Trade Street, they needed more cars to fill the larger space. So QCCC along with other clubs were invited. We were placed on the second floor and with only one freight elevator large enough to fit a car, it took hours to get each of the cars up there. We had ten or so cars along the east wall and the Mustang club was on the west wall. And in the middle were lots of hot rods, muscle cars, Harleys and race cars. It was a long weekend, but a lot of fun, until Sunday night when everyone got in line for the elevator. We got home very late.

Another one of our first show experiences as a club was a large Corvette only show held in Laurens, South Carolina sponsored by the local Chevy dealer there. About ten or twelve members met at Stuckey's on I-85 very early that day, and then caravanned in the rain to attend. After drying off my '64 and registering, I observed the competition and realized my chances of winning my class was slim. The '63 Coupe next to me had to be winched on and off a trailer since it was never driven and didn't have any fluids in the engine. The owner said a possible leak might ruin his "perfect restoration". He won but it made my thoughts about having a competitive "show car" disappear. It was a big show and attracted cars from all over the southeast and started us thinking about doing our own show.


So, in 1974, we approached our sponsor, LaPointe Chevrolet, about having our own show at their dealership. They agreed and our first attempt at putting on a show was on. Thru NCCC we advertised the event and probably had close to 75 cars from all over the area. They cleaned out the service department and moved all of the cars off of the showroom floor for us to use. Even though the event was a moderate success, it was the only one we had there as the club's focus had turned to racing and not car shows. Years later, more club sponsored shows were held at the new sponsor's dealership on South Boulevard. (I don't remember their name as they changed hands frequently).

QCCC was also invited several times in the mid-seventies to put our cars on display in South Park Mall. We got lots of exposure there and enjoyed the experience, but when they remodeled the interior there wasn't enough room for the cars anymore. And of course, when QCCC hosted the NCCC Conventions in 1978 and 1991 we had the "Concourse" show associated with those week-long events.

But nothing we have ever done came close to our Car Show last year and we certainly are looking forward to an even bigger event this year *(weather permitting)*.

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



Well, look at what I found...

Silently, and with little intent, Travis and I have been keeping track of our past. It all started when Trav, living in Matthews, paid a visit to Uncle Sam's worst failure, that would be the post office. While there he encountered a friendly face. The quiet figure was Melvin Pace, QCCC member from 1972 thru 1990. He was President in '85 and '89. Melvin may have been the most serious racing participant of QCCC.

His car was quick to gain a favorable reputation that soon preceded him. You see, he bought the first 427 435 horse 1968 Corvette ordered in the state of North Carolina. At once on went the hooker chrome side pipes, you know the ones three quick bolts released and they slide off leaving basically just header pipes and a little chrome piece visible. Melvin went all out for this car and they made an incredible pair. Many a QCCC race event went to Melvin's FTD. He took his racing seriously and never let it get out of hand. He worked as manager of the parts department at Monroe Cadillac. When we would go racing and it was his turn, as soon as he fired up PopTop, you just stopped to watch and listen.

Here are couple of short stories. In early spring of '77 QCCC was scouring places to autocross. We had worn out Penny's at Eastland Mall and Charlottetown Mall was a bit small. Insurance and business going to large corporate offices made it hard to find the right person if they would allow us in. We received a flyer in the mail from someone at UNCC Sports Car Club. They were inviting us to an autocross on one of their outlying parking lots. QCCC agreed and we took several cars. Upon arriving we found it was a sports car club alright. They were all MGs Triumphs, Volkswagons, etc. It was their show so they set the pylon gates and therein lies the problem. Melvin had pulled PopTop off the trailer and you could see it was wider than all the gates. He told Trav it would be a short day. First car up was 'ole PopTop. Melvin revved her up like he was at the drags. Tires were squealing, smoke was really thick, and as it cleared you could see tire tracks where the course went. Pylon cones were a different story, they were everywhere. It seems the gates were set for average and smaller cars. PopTop, having huge flares to handle the enormous tires it carried, was wider than the gate. Melvin thanked the UNCC Sports Car Club chairman, loaded PopTop on the trailer and called it a day. Since it was their event, we just popped the top on a cold brewsky and waited until they had the course ready again. Many followed Melvin's course and it became a day to see who could knock the cones the farthest. We had a great time. We had seen this before. The Porsches tried to do this to get an advantage at the challenge.

The PopTop nickname was adorned on the car having double meaning. Did it refer to the popping of the tab on a cold Budweiser or did it refer to being able for the first time, of popping the tops out the car. Melvin was really the one person you could credit with saving QCCC during the time from of '79 to '89. Racing was prevalent but the club was changing over to a rather wild social group.

We are looking forward to seeing Melvin and catching up. He has vast knowledge of the racing decade, the eighties. He will be bringing PopTop to the car show. It will be in the special corral for one owner over 50 years. He bought it new from City Chevrolet. He is excited and looking forward to the car show. Stop by and visit. He is all in on Corvette, a great gear head. Hopefully, he would like to see what he created some 50 years ago. Win or lose, you will know PopTop was there, a great looking beast. It will be great to have him back!
