

Ok, so where did this year go to??? So as we close out the year I am going to list some of the Corvette milestones that were significant in the history of the car we all love, Corvette, America's only true sports car!

1953-300 roadsters were produced, all had a 6 cyl, 150 HP engine with an automatic transmission.

1955-A 265 cubic inch V8 débuts along with a 3-speed manual transmission. Yippee!

1957-The famous 283 cubic inch engine arrived along with a 4-speed transmission option and fuel injection. Performance is here at last!

1963-The first coupe body (the very valuable split window) and independent rear suspension were introduced as C2's.

1965-The 396-425HP big block (known as the Mark IV engine) arrives along with disc brakes. This was the last year of the fuel-injected 327 engine.

1968-This was the year of the first Corvette coupe with removable T-tops and a removable rear window. The 3-speed Turbo Hydra-Matic replaced the 2 speed Powerglide.

1971-All engines had reduced compression ratios to prepare for unleaded gas. After 18 years of horsepower gains, the power decrease starts.

1982-The C3 run ends after 14 years, the longest of all generations. An automatic transmission was the only transmission offered.

1984-First year of the C4 was introduced in March of 1983 and meant the long run produced over 51,000 units, the second highest volume of any year.

1990-The mighty ZR1 arrives, developed by Lotus and Chevrolet, and manufactured by Mercury Marine. This option was \$27,016 over base cost!!!

That covers just some of the big C1 thru C4 highlights. There are certainly many more and in future newsletters I might digress and list some of the failures and setbacks Corvette had... or I might not.

Next month, I will tackle the C5 thru C8 big milestones.

That's it for now; see you at the VFW for our December 3rd year-end meeting.



NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM – NEWS AND UPDATES

It's hard to believe that the year is ending, the Holidays are upon us, and after this week's club meeting we are in for a long winter's nap, at least until January, when we start up again with another calendar full of great events for QCCC.

One of those main events is the upcoming Michelin Bash at the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, KY (the official "other home" of QCCC). Put April 26 - 30, 2023 on your calendar for this amazing trip with about 75 of your closest friends. This is one of our biggest and most popular trips for the club, and you don't want to miss it. Anytime I ask a first-time attendee about the Bash, all they can say is how great it is – the Museum, the displays, seeing new car models and options, and especially enjoying the camaraderie of QCCC members. This is one of the best ways to get to know people, so make plans to attend this year. I will notify you when the Bash registration opens on the Museum website.

Thank you for the responses I have received so far on the status of Museum memberships. I have a good list started, but I need to be sure everyone is recognized as a member. And if you are not yet a member, please consider joining.

There is still a buzz and sighs of relief that our postponed Car Show was such a whopping success. The hard work and dedication of everyone involved resulted in one of the best shows ever. The positive response to the "Golden Gears" display of Corvettes that have had the same owner for fifty years has me thinking "where do we go next"? As historian, I am thinking of past QCCC cars and their owners and how we might get them into next year's show.

The very first car that came to my mind is the 1966 Coupe belonging to QCCC's founder Earl Ferrell. If we numbered all the Corvettes that have passed through this club, this car would be serial number 1. Here's the story:

It's the fall of 1966 and the new 1967 models are arriving at the dealerships. There is a little disappointment in the Corvette community that the new C3 body style did not arrive as predicted, so there was a little chill over the 1967 models. Ironically, today the '67 is the high-water mark of all C2's. So, when Earl found a brand-new leftover 1966 Corvette Coupe at the Chevy dealer on South Boulevard, he was able to put together a really good deal to make the purchase. He traded his lavender colored '65 Chevelle Malibu SS and drove off in his dream car.

Earl's '66 was unique in that it was silver exterior with silver interior, not only a rare color combination, but very striking in appearance. The car was equipped with a 327 cubic inch, 350 horsepower engine and a 4-speed transmission. He almost immediately added the factory side mounted exhausts and a set of American Torque-Thrust wheels. This car was so gorgeous that I can truly admit that seeing this car for the first time was the initial spark that set off my "Corvette fever", I had to have one.


So, Earl drives his pride and joy daily and along with some buddies, forms QCCC to complete the full Corvette experience with like-minded gearheads. (You can see that story in the August 2021 newsletter History article). But around 1969 bad luck hit Earl and his '66, literally. He was involved in a traffic accident on Sharon Amity Road that did some damage to the front of the car. While being repaired, he decided to make some changes. A '67 big block hood was added along with flared fenders, wide Ansen slotted wheels and the color was changed to maroon. These changes were not uncommon during this period and Earl's cars fit right into what was popular for that time.

As QCCC entered its racing phase in the early 70's, Earl tried his hand at autocross events with the '66, but his heart was into drag racing. As the years passed, Earl drove the '66 less and less on the street as he continued to make the necessary changes to make his car move competitive on the drag strip. Finally, in time for the 1978 NCCC Convention hosted by QCCC and held here in Charlotte, Earl's '66 had evolved into an allout drag car, and he won the MB class (modified small block) with an 11.87 ET. His closest competitor turned a 12.60. The photo shows his wheel-standing launch at this event.

For the next few years Earl continued to tinker with his toy as it became more and more competitive as a drag car. One of the last things Earl did was to have it painted back to silver with gray accents like the '78 Silver Anniversary edition. He and his wife, Martha, were always huge supporters of QCCC, as he quietly let others lead the club he started, and they enjoyed all the activities the club had to offer.

Unfortunately, Earl battled cancer and after a long painful fight, he passed away on October 20, 1987, at the age of 41. Martha still has his '66 along with his 1960 Corvette that was his father's. They haven't been touched in 35 years. Wouldn't it be great if we could display this car at next year's car show? Just thinking...

More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



In a Parking Lot Long, Long Ago

I hope many of you got by to see the Golden Gears-winning Corvette Cars in their corral. For us old guys it was a special day as an old friend accepted our invitation to display his car for the show. So next to Travis Meredith's 1964 Coupe sat Melvin Pace's 1968 coupe. I told Travis those two cars pretty well sum up QCCC. Melvin was our President in 1985 and 1989. Trav was President in 1972 and 1976. Between 1972 and 1990 the two of them glued QCCC back together several times. It was a great day of bench racing with Melvin. He, like most of us has found some health issues. He is finding it harder all the time to get into and out of the old 427 '68 roadster. Because of issues with his back, he must take the T-Top off of the driver's side and store it in the back, then he can get in and out of the car. Folks, that is a lot of determination and passion. Not only did he buy the car new but has kept it all of 53 years. At one point myself, Trav, Melvin, Bill Ingram, Darrell Kirkley, and Larry Miller were all standing and bench racing. I thought to myself, how many decades of Corvette ownership was in the conversation. Certainly, we had all the QCCC years covered. I think Melvin, who arrived wearing his original QCCC jacket was pleased. Many times, during the day, old friends would stop to visit. All of them glad to see Pop Top as his license notates, back on the road again.

During Trav's tenure he had to deal with wives getting to vote, issues with the clubhouse, dealing with the Charlotte Motor Speedway use, the Sandkhana (racing on Myrtle Beach, and 3 years of Corvette\Porsche Challenges at CMS, plus the regular event issues. Melvin had the challenge of holding the club together as we were racing so much that we won the National Championship for NCCC. Problems he faced were as the cars went up in price we were becoming more of a social club and less a racing club. Now if you think those two veins did not cause an excess of testosterone then think again. I was in some of those meetings; it was hot and hotter. It was like politics today; you were not going to change many minds. The issue being to race we had to get insurance and to get insurance we had to join National Council of Corvette Clubs. Members who did not race were reluctant to pay dues to something they got no benefit from. NCCC required every member pay them dues, a Governor of the club would attend a quarterly 3-day meeting and one event per year our club had to designate where all proceeds were to be given to Spinal Bifida charity. Most members were not to keen on this. So, Melvin had his hands full.

Making the day complete, Robert Scognamillow stopped by to visit. Robert was a heavy racer with his 66 450 hp convertible. He was the chief Corvette mechanic for 5 decades at City Chevrolet and he retired last year. Hendrick group missed his talent and they persuaded him to come back but he no longer is on the line. When you had that whole group of six you have QCCC's racing days covered pretty well. We would love to see Melvin come back around. He would be such a great asset. For those who missed the Golden Gears Corral here is what you missed:

1957's Paul DePascal and Jim Holland

1964 Travis Meredith

1968 Melvin Pace

1975 Gary Spencer

I still maintain the most treasured award QCCC has is the Golden Gears award. You had to buy the Corvette at an early age and have the kohonees to resist selling. How many times do you say it is not for sale when you get the pestering "how much would you take for it?" Then, there is temptation of trading up for the latest and greatest. That is the one that got me. After 31 years I got so much that I could buy a new C6 with change left over, and poof, the split window coupe was gone. So, most of us are approaching 70 or past it, meaning you had the wisdom and funds to purchase a Corvette at 20 years of age. I did not and I can not think of a scenario where I would have done that. We salute the 8 members who are Golden Gears award winners.

Thanks to all of QCCC for putting on a great event. Travis summed it all up as we waited for the awards when he said, "these are the real car people right here".

Thanks to Melvin Pace for bringing back the memories of ole Pop Top, the first '68 big block, tire smokin' loud and fast Corvette sold in N.C. You helped keep QCCC alive and well. It was great to see you again.
