

Ron Fellows. If you haven't heard of him or have but don't know much about him here is a short bio. Ron is recognized as one of North America's most versatile and successful road racing drivers, having won races and championships from NASCAR to long distance sports car events.

With Corvette racing, Fellows is a multi-time champion and was part of historic first victories at the Rolex 24 at Daytona, the 24 Hours of Le Mans and 12 Hours of Sebring. He has also won races in both the Camping World Truck Series and NASCAR Xfinity Series.

In October of 2008, Ron partnered with what is now known as the Spring Mountain Motor Resort and Country Club in Pahrump Nevada, forming the Ron Fellows Performance Driving School along with corporate partners Chevrolet and Michelin. As the "Official High-Performance Driving School of Corvette" the school hosts over 4,000 Corvette owners annually.

Several weeks ago, Donna and myself, along with the Knights, Finocchi's, Dick Gwilt and Jane Burt attended this school, along with a few days in Las Vegas... and yes "What happens in Vegas, Stays in Vegas"!:)

This driving school is second to none as far as professional instruction, track layout, accommodations (one night is included in their onsite condos), as well as breakfast and lunch for both days. The best part is you use their car (they have over 190 C8's at the track)! There is no speed limit so you can drive as fast or slow as you feel comfortable. Classroom instruction and track time alternate each day, every hour. Their goal is to show you the capabilities of the C8 and also make you a better driver. Chevrolet pays for all but \$1000 of the cost and you have 1 year after taking delivery of your car to attend the school. If this sounds like a commercial for Spring Mountain, you might be right, but I can honestly say the school is well worth the time and money spent. I would highly recommend it to everyone that purchases a new C8. I have never heard of anyone that didn't thoroughly enjoy the school, so if you can swing it, do it!

Our May meeting is at Monte Carlo Garage Suites in Indian Land, SC. Hope to see everyone there! That's it for now.



QCCC HISTORY

Last month I took the entire article to explain the cruising scene in Charlotte in the sixties without getting to the point. The question was about street racing, but I felt that deserved an explanation about how the environment in Charlotte led to these things occurring.

The stop light on Independence at Sharon Amity was the last one in east Charlotte with nothing but empty fields all the way to highway 51 in Matthews. So if something started in the center of town, we often wound up there. But late at night Monroe Road just past East Meck High School was popular, with nothing but a drive-in movie near what is now Village Lake Drive. On the west side Wilkerson Boulevard extended the stop light to stop light opportunities with serious matters being settled on I-85 going towards the river or on Ashley Road in front of Harding High School. There were several new industrial parks being built on the north side that had long straight stretches that we found and used. Near where I lived was a dead end road that eventually became the Sharon Amity extension near Harris Boulevard that was popular and I used to tune and test there.

The fastest car in my crowd was my best friend's 64 tri-power GTO with a 3.90 rear gear. It did extremely well from stop light to stop light, but with three passengers the drive shaft bottomed out on the floor when he power shifted. If we pulled up next to a serious competitor, the three of us would have to jump out of the car before the light changed and stand on the curb or median and wait on him to circle back and get us.

I had a spontaneous street race with a '64 283 Chevelle in my '65 289 4 speed Comet on Morehead Street late one night, that turned serious. After some discussion at Harold's BarBQ, a five dollar bet was made and I followed the other guy to a remote location to settle the bet. Now I never gambled, but it so happened my grandmother had just given me a five dollar bill in a birthday card, so I had the money. Believe it our not, we raced on Sharon Road going toward Fairview Road past the corn fields that became South Park Mall. I lost and had to give up my grandmother's birthday present. I never gambled on a street race again.

That event happened in 1965. Fast forward to 1974, standing at the bar in the QCCC club house, a stranger came in with a brand new '74 Corvette and introduced himself. I thought he looked familiar but I didn't recognize his name. After going out to look at his new car and everyone discussing the split rear bumper (an argument similar to the one on the C7 tail lights), he and I started talking cars. The connection was finally made that he was the owner of the '64 Chevelle that took my five dollars nine years earlier. We laughed and laughed and he bought me beers the rest of the night. He later joined QCCC and we became good friends. His name was Al Starnes and he not only became an active member, he owned a trophy shop and provided the club with trophies. We didn't have to make them by hand any more. Unfortunately, he died of a heart attack in 1977 at the age of 32. He was the first loss QCCC had ever had and many club members attended his funeral.

Charlotte was a great place to grow up, especially if you loved cars, even though street racing is a thing of the past, at least for me.



MINUTES OF THE MAY 14, 1977 BUSINESS MEETING

The May business meeting of the Queen City Corvette Club, Inc. was called to order by President, Sam McGee, on May 14, 1977, at the clubhouse.

The roll was called by Vice-President Earl Ferrell, with 16 voting members present, including the club officers.

We wish to welcome the following visitors to our May meeting, and hope they will attend more club functions in the very near future:

Vice-President, Earl Ferrell, announced that starting in June, the clubhouse would be open only on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Wednesdays of each month. This will last until we go back on Eastern Standard Time, or until enough interest and participation indicates that opening each Wednesday is really wanted by the members. Earl also advised that the design was ready for the compitition patches. He will try to order locally if possible in order to avoid delays, as with the back patches.

Treasurer, Lydia Morse, briefly went over some of the expenses of the Corvette-Porsche Challenge, as shown in the newsletter. Our profit from the Challenge was \$372.47, including T-shirts.

Governor, David Morse, called our attention to the calendar of events in the newsletter, which listed events through June 5. He announced that on June 12 there would be a Concours in Winston-Salem, and on June 19 a Speedkhana in Spartanburg. Further details on these events would be announced later. The Hill Climb sponsored by Columbia on April 1 was postponed due to fog, and would be reschedule for September. David then read some of the latest changes in the rule book for nest year. Per our scheduled event at Charlotte Motor Speedway for the July 4th weekend, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday, David advised that the cost of the track would be \$1,975 for the weekend. This would mean we would need at least 150 entries at \$20.00 per entry.in order to make the event a success. David brought up the possibility of holding the event elsewhere due to the cost. He asked that the club think about this and discuss it further at the June business meeting.

David advised that the participation in competition events has fallen off very much in the last two years, and appears to continue to do so. Unless an improvement is seen in this, the club can no longer depend on competition to provide the income it has in the past, which has covered many of our expenses.

With regard to the 1978 Convention, David will be sending out a questionnaire to each member, asking what they can and will be able to contribute to the convention. He asked that each be completed truthfully, so that he knows who will be available to handle what type of function. This way, he can begin to form committees to start work on convention.


