

Last month I wrote about the National Corvette Museum and had a couple issues I would like to correct. There were two links that didn't work properly so here are the right ones:

Moving on... The 24 hours of Le Mans saw Corvette Racing taking the win in the LM GTE AM Class. This was the ninth victory for Corvette Racing at Le Mans, an incredible accomplishment! After starting on the pole, a shock absorber problem caused the No. 33 Corvette to go down 2 laps, last in their 21-car field. After repairs and a series of well-timed pit stops the No. 33 muscled its way back into the lead. At the end, drivers Nicky Catsburg, Ben Keating, Nico Varrone and Corvette racing had overcome adversity and once again conquered the prestigious but difficult 1<sup>st</sup> place trophy!

Next year Corvette Racing will look a bit different as Chevrolet will no longer field a factory team but instead shift to a customer racing program. According to Laura Klauser, GM Sports Car Racing Manager, "our desired plan is to launch in 2024 with four cars racing in IMSA – two in GTD Pro and two in GTD, also two cars in the WEC (which is the class the 24 hours of Le Mans is in)". It will be different, but this should mean more chances for Corvette to rack up even more wins.

On August 27th the IMSA race will be at Virginia International Raceway. Corvette Corral tickets are still available. If interested, this is the closest Corvette racing will be to Charlotte. It is usually a good one!

# QCCC HISTORY

It is ancient Corvette lore that sometime in late 1953 the first two Corvette owners passed each other going in the opposite direction. Recognizing that even though they had never met and didn't know one another, they immediately knew that they had something special in common, and threw their left arm out the window and gave each other a vigorous wave. That action started a tradition that continues to this day: the "Corvette Wave".

The "Corvette Wave" is now an integral part of the mystique and culture of the Corvette owner experience. Corvette owners who wave at fellow Corvette owners when they pass on the road, show a mark of recognition that you are among the elite group of intelligent people who are driving America's True Sports Car. If you are new to the Corvette hobby you may have already experienced passing another Corvette and receiving the wave. And Zora would roll over in his grave if you didn't wave back. I'm not sure who wrote these rules of waving, possibly the recipient of that first wave in 1953. Anyway, here are the rules:

**There is no excuse for not waving at your fellow Corvette owner.**

Although most Corvette owners have the class and understanding to accept when their wave is not returned, not waving is a serious breach of proper Corvette etiquette.

**Whoever sees the other Corvette first, starts the wave.**

There isn't any rule about who waves first. This is simple; if you see another Corvette, wave!

## Sand in Your Shorts

Let's revisit one of the greatest weekends in QCCC's history. Pictures can tell what the words cannot.

First, having grown up in the Midwest, this constant beach thing was new to me. However, as Trav and Darrell can attest, spending time at the beach was mandatory if you were raised here. Therefore, QCCC did not make a beach trip as an event, they went several times each year. When you are 25 in the 70's and driving a Corvette, that is where the girls are. Vegas has nothing on Myrtle Beach. Beach music rivaled Rock-n-Roll in the Carolinas.

On a crisp fall day in 1975 a handful of QCCC guys headed out to Myrtle Beach for the typical weekend of Schlitz long necks and a last of the summer brush-up on their tans. Travis was one of the group. Another of the members who enjoyed every day of life was Rick Wilson. They wanted to spend the last moments with a look at the ocean. Things were not as restricted then as they are today. Not considering the consequences, Rick drove around the end of road guardrail and was very soon going in and out of the surf. From the photo we have it is a wonder he did not get stuck. He was having a ball with pedal matted as he could side all around. Soon others joined him, not in the surf, but driving on the hard-packed sand. Alas, along came one of the locals finest complete with blue lights. He was courteous and informed the group that driving on the beach was not permitted. Something about running over folks, but he did mention we could talk to the Mayor and try to get a permit to do so. When they got back and informed the group of this situation, it was decided to make it a club trip in '76. After some thought and discussion, someone said let's race on the beach like NASCAR did in Daytona. So it came to pass that Travis Meredith, Richard Breyer, and one other from QCCC made a trip back to ask for permission. We sent the right folks as they were successful and it was a NCCC sanctioned event for the fall of '76. I believe it was in October when the beaches are mostly empty.

We arrived after work on Friday and rose early to set the pylons for the track and the timing lights and the first car went off as the sun was coming up. Very soon we got educated. Corvette power on wet sand did not make for a great launch. It turns out we had to keep shoveling sand into the ruts made at the start finish line. Then you went north through some gates on the wet sand before sliding through a big sweeping curve and through more gates going back south to the finish line. Everyone got 3 timed runs, but there were problems. The tide was going out so the northbound route kept changing with the amount of water in the sand and the southbound lanes were up in the dry sand. The ocean washes a very smooth wet surface, but at low tide it leaves a very bumpy surface where it does not reach. Then add to that we, of course, were pedal down and sliding all around. A gentle throttle would win the day by not making ruts but gliding across the surface. We were constantly filling in ruts. The south side was like driving a pickup on a farm trail.

When it was all over, everyone had a blast and they were all ready to go again, not withstanding all the complaints about the early entrants had a big advantage as the course deteriorated pretty badly with each run thru it. When I was at Ron Fellows Motorsports Track in 2015, we introduced ourselves and where we were from. I said QCCC in Charlotte. At our first break a fellow came up to me and said he was

from Louisville, Kentucky and had once taken two Corvettes long ago to race on Myrtle Beach. Small world! Little did we know we were solidifying a solid reputation as a mover and shaker in the Corvette Club world.




