



DID YOU KNOW: The original Corvette logo, (Figure 1 below), was designed by Robert Bartholomew, an interior designer at Chevrolet in 1953. This emblem was destined to appear on the 1953 Corvette prototype which was introduced to the public for the first time at New York's Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in January of 1953. It had crossing staffs with the checkered flag on the right-hand side, and the American flag on the left-hand side. However, four days before the Corvette was to go on display at the show, Chevrolet management decided that it should be redesigned. The problem with the proposed emblem was that it included the American Flag which is illegal to use on a commercial product. Right before the show, redesigned emblems were attached to the front hood and steering wheel of the Corvette. The new emblem contained the checkered flag on the right side as well as the white racing flag, red Chevrolet bow-tie symbol and a fleur-de-lis.





Update for October 2023

I can't believe it is October already and the car show is soon at hand. 2023 is going to be a remarkable year for our car show. With QCCC, City Chevrolet and Hendrick Performance promoting such an event, it is most likely going to be a huge success. We are anticipating over 700 Corvettes this year with food vendors, craft vendors, Corvette-related vendors, kids corral, special VIP parking for some of the most astonishing Corvettes ever and plenty more for all to do for the day.

Our Corvette show is believed to be one of the largest Corvette shows sponsored by and put on by an individual Corvette club. QCCC and our Corvette show is a large impact in the Corvette world. Corvette enthusiasts from all over the nation are familiar with our show. Our show brings in some of the most profound Corvettes in the nation to compete for one of our Famous Hendrick Race Team Trophies. To win a QCCC Corvette Show trophy puts that Corvette into another category of perfection and is considered one of the most sought-after trophies in the Corvette world. We, as QCCC members should be proud to be involved in such a Corvette treasure.

The Corvette show is requires a lengthy planning process and starts months before this years Corvette show takes place. Registration and advertising start in early February, then comes vendor participation, silent auction planning sessions, strategic parking for an overflow Corvette show and how to get all those people through the Heritage Center and Race Shop tours. All of this takes place behind the scenes by our Corvette Show Planning Staff and our Team Leaders.

All of this planning, organizing and work doesn't go unnoticed. At the end of all this process we donate a large portion of the proceeds back to charity. This year QCCC Charity is Wings of Eagles Ranch, and they will receive a donation of \$10,000.00 from the show. Also, the largest portion of the Heritage Center and Race Shop tours go to The Hendrick Family Foundation. This year we anticipate donating over \$15,000.00 to this charity.

With all this said, you can understand why QCCC puts so much emphasis on our Corvette Show. It creates a bond between members and leaves a sense of pride just being associated with such a strong organization. Due to our efforts, we will bring over 700 Corvettes together in one place with the same goal in mind, Corvettes. We will also bring in over 3,000 spectators just to see what we have achieved, one of the largest Corvette shows in the nation. Yes, we/you are involved in such a feat.

Now, onto the begging part, we still need help with judging and parking. The team leader for judging is John Callahan and Brian Moore. The parking team leader is Justin Cross. You can contact either of these team leaders or myself to show your support.

We also still need your Corvettes. We currently have 120 QCCC Corvettes signed up for our event. Our goal is to have over 150 Corvettes from QCCC. Remember registration is free, so go to Queencitycorvetteclub.com and click car show registration. Then go to QCCC Member Car Registration and fill out the form.

Lastly, we need your help to get the word out to the general public about our show. They can go online to register for Tour Ticket Purchases at Queencitycorvetteclub.com and click car show registration. Then go to Tour Ticket Purchase and fill out the form and sign up for the Heritage Center or Race Shop tours for \$30.00 each per person. Mr. Hendrick's personal museum is not open to the public, so this is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for them to see Rick Hendrick's private Car Collection. He has about 250 cars on display in this museum. The public can also purchase tickets the day of the show on a first come basis.

Thanks to all Queen City Corvette Club members for your dedication to this event.

NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM – NEWS AND UPDATES

Paul Mitchell - QCCC Ambassador to the NCM

October 2023

Each year at the anniversary meeting on Labor Day weekend the Corvette Museum inducts 3 new members to the Corvette Hall of Fame. The list of inductees is amazing, covering all aspects of the Corvette world for the three classes of members – Enthusiasts, GM/Chevrolet, and Racing.

The Corvette Hall of Fame was established by the National Corvette Museum in 1998 to confer official recognition upon the most influential individuals in the history of the Corvette and honor their achievements. Corvette Hall of Fame inductees have distinguished themselves, not only through their accomplishments, but also by their high standards of integrity and character that reflect and enhance the reputation of the Corvette and the National Corvette Museum.

Go to the Museum website and click on Hall of Fame to see the current members. One of note is Rick Hendrick, for obvious reasons. The other of note is QCCC member Tom Wallace, who was inducted in 2018, Tom was Corvette Chief Engineer from 2005 to 2008, and during his tenure the 2009 638 HP ZR1 was developed! Tom was also a professional race car driver, and participated in 24 Hours of Daytona, 12 Hours of Sebring, and Talladega 6 hour race. The only other Chief Engineer that was also a race car driver was none other than Zora Arkus Duntov! We are proud and honored that Tom is a member of QCCC!

As mentioned in last month's article I will be attending an Ambassadors Conference in Bowling Green in November. If anyone has issues, compliments or suggestions for the Museum please let me know so I can address them at the meeting. The Museum personnel are very interested in our input and certainly want to hear from us on any topic.

Car show time is approaching. Please get silent auction items together and bring to the meeting at the Loftin's on October 14. Get your car registered - FREE - as we need 50+ member cars at the show. Sign up for a job at the show. And get ready to be a participant in the biggest and best club-run Corvette show in the country!



Well, here we are, only weeks away from our biggest car show ever. Expecting over 700 cars from all over the Southeast, it's an opportunity for our club to show just how it's done! I hope all of you have figured a way to participate in some way, you don't have to drive a "show car" to enter, just come and help. If necessary, ride through Auto-Bell and join the fun.

But looking back (since this is the "History Article", I must), we will examine QCCC's very first real car show. The year is 1974 and the club is active in the National Council of Corvette Clubs sanctioned events which are mostly made up of competition events. They did have rules for car shows and we had attended a few that other clubs held in our region. The biggest show in the area then was at a Chevrolet dealer in Laurens, SC. We took about twenty cars and did pretty well considering all were daily drivers. Plus we had displayed our cars at South Park Mall several times and received a great response. The club even had displays at the annual ISCA (International Show Car Association) Custom Car Show that was held at the downtown civic center every February. It was decided that it was time for us to put on our own show.

Plans were made and our sponsor at that time, LaPointe Chevrolet on East Trade Street in downtown Charlotte, agreed to letting us have it at the dealership. They cleaned out the service department and emptied the showroom for us. They even advertised it in the Charlotte Observer. The day of the show arrives, we put five or six cars in the showroom, and the rest lined up in the service department. There were about fifty cars from six or more regional clubs participating. The big winners were two trailered cars from Atlanta, a perfectly restored black '63 Fuel Injected Coupe and a '64 customized Coupe with a paneled candy apple red paint job. The irony of this photo of my '64 on the LaPointe showroom at the 1974 car show is that 10 years earlier my Corvette was there as a brand new unsold unit in LaPointe's inventory.

The club had several other car shows during the late seventies and early eighties, mostly at the new sponsor's dealership, the Chevrolet store on South Boulevard (sorry, they changed hands so many times I can't remember the names) and even at the minor league baseball stadium in Fort Mill. They were moderately successful, but the competition events ruled the day. QCCC changed direction in the early 2000's and became more social-minded and car shows weren't a priority. In fact, a couple of years ago, he made each of the other three Vintage Gang members a model of the cars we had back in the '70s. When you drag race you learn quickly which cars you should be buying. So next up for him was a 396 Chevelle. Who has not had that thought? I need to add that Trav is a talented artist, not only creative, but also able to put those visions to paper (witness our many club t-shirts and posters).


