



Jo's Spiced Nuts

Ingredients

- approximately 7.5 8 cups of nuts (bag said 7.5, but was closer to 8)
- a full stick of unsalted butter (adjust salt, if using salted butter)
- 2.5 tsp. salt
- 2.5 tsp. chili powder
- 3/4 tsp. ground black pepper

<u>Instructions</u> Preheat the oven to 325 degrees in convection roast & 350 degrees for regular baking. In a pot big enough to hold all the nuts and stir around, melt the butter completely and add all ingredients. If in doubt, use slightly less seasonings and add to warm nuts. Add the nuts and stir until evenly coated. Pour out onto a baking sheet so that the nuts are in a single layer. Roast or bake for 8 - 10 minutes; check for doneness. You want a nice mahogany color. If more time is needed, check every 4 - 5 minutes. Taste while warm and add additional seasonings to your liking. Let cool on the baking sheet and store. Stores well.



With the success of the "Golden Gear" display, I'd like to thank Bill Cruthis, Steve Harshbarger, and the rest of the "Vintage Gang" for all the effort, planning and execution of what has turned into a very popular part of the car show. Meanwhile, I was in Illinois at this age I was probably trading baseball cards and putting model cars together and Steve Pelchat, at age 16, was buying his first Corvette. I am still trying to catch up.

Fast forward to the mid-sixties and Bill graduates from USC and starts doing cost audits for a major firm. He has his first Corvette, a '67 roadster in Marina Blue. Corvette fever strikes again! To this day he claims that was one of his favorite cars. But we have moved on to the late '70s. Now, with a head full of facts, it did not take long for him to figure you make more money working for yourself. So what did he like? Cars! He pops up with a small shop between Monroe Road and Independence after selling out of his house basement that held 5 cars. The new shop footprint with, I believe, one bay for mechanic duty. He started with some Corvettes. Very soon he knew that you cannot make a fortune selling just Corvettes. Now all that magazine knowledge he has would pay off. He will be stiff competition as he gives 110% all the time. There were lean times but in the end he sold Mercedes, Porsche, Corvettes, and other used sports cars. He could find cars, great cars, to flip that the rest of us could not find. With new growth Bill moved the shop out by the airport for a bigger footprint which did not turn out to be a high traffic area. Eventually, he built Southern Imports on the Boulevard 74. Thus far, a lot of the funding came from the purchase and resale of the Corvette Pace cars. (He moved just shy of 30 of them in the southeast region. Darrell was instrumental by delivering many of them.) Now he had the space with a big footprint, showroom, multiple service bays and he was in the high traffic area. Somewhere around here he picked up a nice roll back truck. He really went after used Mercedes and eventually Beck New and Used Mercedes was history. Always on top of things, dollar shifted again. He smelled the demand for the new Hummer and hit another home run. He sold a ton of these and did very well servicing them. Now retired, he still finds several cars a year, buys them and flips for positive cash. One thing I can't master that he does well, anything he owns is always for sale, but only if he stands to make a substantial profit and the rarer it is the higher the price. Looking back, Bill always could find those special cars: a '67 427 coupe with aluminum wheels, side pipes, silver, black stinger hood; a '72 steel cities gray LT-1 air coupe (1 of 200 with a/c); and a black over saddle '77 coupe with the new aluminum wheels (the ones none of us could get due to a strike at the Mexican plant where they were made). He pulled in the drive one Saturday in a 308 Ferrari. After pursuing it, he said "you want to take it for a drive" and I did. Lest you think he had no interest in speed, ask the Porsche driver that tried him out on Park Road. Ask any of us that saw him flog the LT-1 around Charlotte Motor Speedway at the Porsche Corvette Challenge. Also, the infamous flight from the State Trooper chase into South Carolina. To date Bill has driven more exotic sports cars than any of us.

Dollar Bill has had and driven almost any brand he wanted but he is happiest at the Corvette Club. As a tribute to all you QCCC folks, he finds you all have so much to offer: all the events and all the different but great cars. With his dealerships he had everything from Ron Fellow's collector edition C6 Z06 to Bentley, Porsche, Lexus and others. He has attended other makers club meetings but says they are just bland. Now, he has the 2019 ZR-1 and the 2023 Z06 and they look good in the garage. Talk about a need for speed. . .that's some 1400 hp and he does not hesitate to use it.

Like so many of QCCC members, Bill is self made. What a great group we have! You can start to see how these four guys' lives have been intertwined for 50 years and what fun we have had. All of us have never been without at least one Corvette.

So now you know a little more about the 3rd Vintage Gang member. Thanks to all of you for making QCCC fun and interesting so that we appeal to a real car guy with a need for speed so he keeps hangin' around.

QCCC had a good foundation!

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
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
