

Despite plans to the contrary, no 1983 Corvettes were ever released. Before the decision was made to skip this model year, 43 were produced. 42 were crashed in crashed tests or crushed. A single 1983 Vette was saved and is on display at the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky. According to some, there were actually 47 1983's produced, and a few more 83's may actually still be in existence, but that debate has never been resolved.

Corvette Racing 2024

Ahead of its first season of worldwide GT3 competition, Corvette Racing has announced an expansion its factory driver roster that will compete in championships and events around the globe with the new Chevrolet Corvette Z06 GT3.R.

Daniel Juncadella, Earl Bamber, Charlie Eastwood and Nico Varrone will be part of the group that will race Corvette Z06 GT3.Rs in either the IMSA WeatherTech Sports Car Championship, FIA World Endurance Championship – or in some cases both.

They join existing Corvette factory drivers Antonio Garcia, Tommy Milner, Nicky Catsburg and Alexander Sims, all of whom will contest the full WeatherTech Championship season.

The eight collectively will compete as factory drivers for Corvette Racing – the brand that encompasses all factory-supported and customer Z06 GT3.R efforts going forward.

Juncadella and Bamber each will be part of Corvette Racing by Pratt Miller Motorsports' two-car effort in the IM-SA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship's GTD Pro class. Both drivers will race with the factory-backed program in the Rolex 24 At Daytona, Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring and Petit Le Mans.

Juncadella will drive with Garcia and Sims while Bamber joins Milner and Catsburg.

In addition, Juncadella, who departs Mercedes-AMG after a lengthy stint with the German manufacturer, will have the distinction of driving the Z06 GT3.R in two championships as he joins TF Sport for its full-season effort in the LMGT3 class.

"I have to say, to see the legacy that Corvette Racing has created in the U.S. and to see the amount of awareness about the brand is very exciting," Juncadella said. "It makes me proud and it feels quite unique to be a Corvette factory driver."

Bamber will contest selected WeatherTech Championship endurance rounds in the Z06 GT3.R. Previously a long-time rival to the Corvette Racing program, Bamber already has tested the Z06 GT3.R, adding to a long list of GT3 cars he has driven throughout his career.

The Kiwi also remains under contract for Cadillac Racing's WEC program in 2024.

"It's really exciting to be joining Corvette Racing by Pratt Miller Motorsports for the long races," Bamber said. "I've been a part of some big rivalries for many years in IMSA racing. But this organization has won so many races and championships... it's really impressive.

"When I did my first test at Road America, you could see why they've been so successful. I've driven the Z06 GT3.R and I think the package is really good. These guys have built fantastic GTLM cars over the years, and I don't see why the Corvette GT3 should be any different."

In WEC, Eastwood joins the Corvette factory lineup alongside Juncadella as TF Sport's two professional drivers. It's a familiar relationship for Eastwood, who has driven for TF Sport in the championship from 2018-20 and the current season.

"This certainly ranks up there for me, joining such a brand like Corvette and an organization like GM," he said. "It's what so many drivers wish for their whole career.

"It seems to be an amazing place to be, and you can see that because so many drivers stay for so long."

Varrone, Corvette Racing's rising star in this year's WEC, will transition to full-time WeatherTech Championship duties in his first year as a factory driver.

He rejoins AWA – a team with which he won this year's Rolex 24 At Daytona in the LMP3 class – and will partner with Anthony Mantella.

"It's a big honor to be a factory driver for Corvette," Varrone said. "It's also nice to be back in IMSA next season with everyone at AWA. These are people that I know from this year and doing the endurance races in LMP3. It was a good year."

Corvette Z06 GT3.R program manager Christie Bagne added: "As we move into GT3 and customer racing, it is important that we add to our roster of drivers that are available to teams.

"We are excited about the wealth of experience in our Corvette factory lineup. Both GM and our teams will benefit from the learnings from each driver."



QCCC HISTORY

With owning an old Corvette and sitting behind it at shows off and on over the last fifty years, you hear a lot of responses from observers. One of the most frequent goes like this: "(I, my dad, my uncle, a friend, someone I knew) had one of those back in the day, sold it because (got married, got divorced, had a baby, needed the money, got a ridiculous offer) and always regretted selling it. Wish I had it back". If you talk to just about any old car enthusiast, not just Corvette owners, you can always get a story about "the one that got away" and wish you had back. If you fall into that category and had one get away, here's a story you'll like.

Old friends John and Jane Freeman rejoined QCCC several years ago and even though I knew he had owned multiple Corvettes, I learned he had recovered his pride and joy, his first Corvette and it had renewed his love of the Corvette hobby. First a little background:

Now back in 1979, 20 year-old John Freeman satisfied his dream of owning a Corvette by purchasing a blue 1969 roadster. A friend had owned the car and it had been vandalized, sprayed black, and John purchased it from the insurance company for only \$1800.00. With a little elbow grease, the black color was removed and the original blue paint was saved. John and wife, Jane joined QCCC later that year and become very active members, participating in all of the events including competition. While enjoying club membership for the next few years, John and Jane's business (Freeman's Car Stereo) had really taken off and with the time requirements and expanding new stores, the decision was made to sell the car (another good reason). A friend of John's named Rik Craig from Morganton, NC bought it from John in1982 for \$5900.00, (it was Rik's first Corvette and he got so involved in the Corvette hobby he started "Rik's Corvette Parts", but that's another story). Anyway, John and Jane's businesses kept them busy for the next 30 years and they owned many Corvettes and collector cars over that period, but John longed for the one that got away, his blue '69.

John tried to locate the car over a period of years, but Rik had sold it many years earlier and it had changed hands so many times the trail had gotten cold. But in 2019, John persisted and Rik finally found the canceled check he had given John to pay for the car and it had the vin number on it. With that information John hired a private detective with a law enforcement background (who will remain nameless) and within a matter of hours he had located the blue '69 in Clovis, New Mexico. It had not been tagged or driven since 1998 and the current owner was "going to restore it someday". He was reluctant to sell, but John, along with many of his friends named "George", finally reached a number that secured the purchase.

After having the car shipped back to North Carolina, John cleaned up the old paint, which, while not perfect, is very presentable and suits John's needs as a driver. Other improvements have been made since 2019, including all new interior, up-graded brakes, steering and suspension, a fresh ZZ4 engine, a 5-speed manual transmission and a 3.73 rear end. John has done most of the work on the car himself and drives it frequently, putting over 11,000 miles on it since its completion.

With having owned many Corvettes, new models, resto-mods, classics, this is still "John's Car" and the one he has always had the most fun with and it's going nowhere again.



More "Adventures" from QCCC of Decades Past



Always Catchin' Up

This month I will complete the Vintages by discussing my own early days and finding my need for speed. I was into hot rods early on and was guilty of putting models of them together so fast that often the wrong parts got glued and most of the wheels would not turn. Painting was also rushed, ending up with multiple runs. Can we all spell high strung? Sadly, this would last well into high school. Somehow, I missed out on early education with the real McCoy. Having no garage space anywhere plus cold Illinois winters and hot Illinois summers, I took the easy way out. Dad would have been happy to help, but had only garden and carpentry tools. I failed to have the drive needed to get my own hot rod. I started working in the drugstore at age 15 and all of that little check went right into savings for college. It wasn't much at 25 cents per hour and it did take a lot of my free time after school and on weekends. Looking back, I could have done as the others, but I spent my free time in athletics. I knew I was a jock for either the NBA or the PGA. Little did I know that I had zero chance of either.

Now, my best friend got him a '50 Chevy for us to hang with the uptown crowd. He replaced the engine and serviced the brakes. It was a 3 speed on the column. I wish I would have learned from him. I was spending 12 hours playing basketball, if we could sneak into the high school gym. The folks always had 2 cars. To get one for a weekend night you had to keep them clean. The '68 Chevy Biscayne was a 2 barrel. Dad had a '58 Olds with all that chrome down the sides.

The seeds were growing. Next came Dad's '62 Olds and Mom got a used '62 Pontiac Catalina. It was black with a white rag top and a great burgundy, white, and silver stripe interior. Wow, now I am hooked. All this time I was thinking about these Corvettes in town. My first race was on a Friday night up on the Square. I had 5 classmates in the '62 Olds and the football team captain had 5 in his Dad's '62 Plymouth Fury. I can't remember how it started, but all of a sudden we both peeled off the Square, down Main Street, out Route 10 for an endurance race out through the farmlands of Illinois. There are not many paved roads in the country as farm equipment was hard on them. We were power sliding the gravel curves, with our passengers egging us on. I was learning about my need for speed. From that night on it was who wants to race.






